Report as to dependency of Applicant or of the motherless children upon Deceased at the time of his death.

The Civic Guard Report states that the applicant Mrs. Mahony, lives in a lodge on the farm of Mr. Sweetman of Clonmult, she never enjoyed any private income prior to the death of deceased. Her employment previous to his death consisted of some housework, such as washing clothes, etc., and her income thereby amounted to about 8/- per week. She is now in good health; but not capable of earning much. Her husband is 58 years of age; but is unfit for work owing to an ulcer on the stomach.

The claimant is not in possession of any holding of land. She has three children living. Her eldest girl is 23 years of age but is subject to 'Epileptic Fits'. The two remaining children a girl of 13 years and a boy of 10 years are attending the National School at Clonmult, they contribute in no way to the upkeep of the claimant.

The deceased prior to his death worked as a farm labourer and his earnings ranged from 17/- to 25/- per week, all of which practically he gave to the claimant.

The applicant was totally dependent on the deceased at the time of his death.
