





UNSWORN STATEMENT made before the ADVISORY COMMITTEE by

JOHN O'NEILL, on 29th MARCH, 1935.

Our case in general is this:-

As an army we existed previous to 1916. In 1916, the Forces were thrown together - the I.R.A., and the Citizen Army. There was a question of organising again as the Citizen Army, and establishing Headquarters staff as it existed previous to 1916. We functioned definitely as an independent army working in conjunction with the I.R.A.

Q. Was the Citizen Army always working in conjunction with the I.R.A.?

A. Yes.

Q. What machinery had you to secure the co-operation with the I.R.A.?

A. We met the I.R.A. Headquarters people once a week.

Q. Who used meet them?

A. I ~~would~~ met them.

Q. Were you an officer?

A. I had rank of Commandant.

Q. Was it a regular feature that you met once a week?

A. It was a binding arrangement. After 1916, I met Cathal Brugha. We discussed the thing, as to how it could be reconciled to the Volunteers, or vice-versa. We found it was not possible. We were not prepared to fuse. Then, it was decided, the two people should exist as independent units, and work in close co-operation with each other. We wanted particularly to cover this point. There might be cases where the Citizen Army might take action other than what would be approved by the Volunteers, and it was from that point of view we had to keep in touch with each other.

Q. The arrangement was to act together as much as possible, and meet every week?

A. After meeting each other, if the other people did not approve of it, we were not bound by them.

Q. Were you the chief officer?

A. Yes - I was called the Commandant.

Q. This was after 1916?

A. Yes.

Q. At the beginning of 1916, who was Commandant?

A. Connolly.

Q. How many men had he under him at the start of Easter Week?

A. Between 200 and 230.

- Q. Were these all armed men?
A. Yes.
- Q. Did 230 take part in 1916?
A. Over 200 men took part, all armed.
- Q. After 1916, you were Commandant?
A. Yes.
- Q. What officers had you under you?
A. As Commandant, I had a Quartermaster, a Director of Munitions, four (4) Staff Captains, and a Surgeon General.
- Q. Was the Surgeon General in private practice also?
A. Yes - Dr. Kathleen Lynn.
- We had two captains who did not act on the staff.
We had four (4) Lieutenants.
- Q. That was the extent of your officers?
A. We had junior officers who existed up to 1918 - a Boy Section, a kind of Fianna.
- Q. Had you no particular organisation for the balance, as far as Companies were concerned?
A. No.
- Q. Your organisation existed as a Unit?
A. Yes - one unit.
- Q. Were there no women members?
A. There were women members. They took their places in the ranks. From 1913, when the Citizen Army first formed, men and women dropped in together.
- Q. Were there any women officers?
A. Yes - the Countess. She held the rank of a Major.
- Q. Was she the first and only major?
A. Yes. Although she was a major, she was Second-in-Command in the Green.
- Q. Kind of Vice Commandant?
A. Yes.
- Q. What would be the difference in duties of a captain and a staff captain?
A. As far as active service was concerned, no difference, but a staff captain was concerned with matters of military nature, policy, etc. The whole staff was called together to decide these matters.
- Q. Had you ever a written constitution?
A. Yes.

- Q. Would the captains be engaged on training that staff captains would not have to do?
A. No. Staff captains would have to do that in their turns.
- Q. Which of your officers did duties of adjutant?
A. This was a peculiar situation. The duties of adjutant evolved down to a private. We had the Council Meetings completely for the organising of army members elected each year. Privates were entitled to be represented on that Council. Every year, a private happened to act as adjutant. An adjutant need not necessarily hold rank.
- Q. Had you an engineering branch?
A. Not as a distinct branch, but the Director of Munitions took charge of our engineers, to a great extent.
- Q. As far as the medical side was concerned, Dr. Lynn did everything?
A. Yes, each woman helped, but she was in complete control.
- Q. Would your staff captains have any special duties other than going to meetings with regard to army policy?
A. No, not other than ordinary captain's duties, manoeuvres, etc. They were absolutely active men. Practically all those held their rank in 1916 as captains. They were Army Council in fact.
- Q. Did you do any training following the releases after 1916?
A. Yes.
- Q. Who was your trainor?
A. We did two nights a week, when the men turned up to the Drill Hall, at Liberty Hall. The Citizen Army had a room, with a few small Committee Rooms at the back of Liberty Hall. The main body drilled in that room.
- Q. What did your drill comprise of?
A. Musketry instruction, rifle practice, etc. We had expert trainors there who were Musketry Instructors in the British Army. They had all their scientific method of training. Every week-end we went to the country for field practice.
- Q. Your training would be rifle and revolver training?
A. Yes.
- Q. Had you any bombs?
A. We had grenades, etc.
- Q. Where did you get them?
A. We made them in Liberty Hall, both before and after 1916.

Q. Were your men on armed patrols in the "Tan" war?

A. Only in a very few cases. It was a question of overlapping again, - a question of which job it would be advisable for us to do.

Q. Did you decide in conjunction with the Volunteers?

A. We decided if something came our way, of major importance, that we would handle it.

Q. Give us one or two instances?

A. There was a job at Sidney Lodge. The "Tans" used come there occasionally. We got the information, and transferred it to the Volunteers, and they told us to hold on. That went on from time to time. Then further information came our way. We told Collins of it, and were told to go ahead - but we did not do it actually.

Q. Were the G.A., on "Bloody" Sunday?

A. We were very nearly taking action. We had got the information about the people in Pembroke Street. I happened to see Dick McKee, and he said not to do it - that it might spoil things for a bigger job.

Q. Any other instances?

A. There again was the danger of overlapping. On another occasion we raided Kingsbridge, and we ran into the Volunteers coming out.

Q. Did your organisation take part in the Civil War?

A. Yes.

Q. Was it a distinct Unit in the Civil War?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you Commandant then?

A. Henratty was Commandant then. He would explain that position.

Q. Bob de Coeur was taking here about intelligence work in connection with "Bloody" Sunday. Had you intelligence organisation in the Citizen Army?

A. Our intelligence was that each man did his part as best he could. The Chief line of intelligence came through Christy and Bob de Coeur. Jobs of importance came through them. They were not definitely appointed as an intelligence staff, but acted in that capacity.

Q. They were acting in conjunction with the Volunteers?

A. Yes.

Q. You looked on yourself as Commandant, as being in charge of organisation as far as your force is concerned?

A. Yes.

- Q. Did you recruit after 1916?
A. Yes.
- Q. When the fusion took place - the co-operation between yourselves and the Volunteers - were you recruiting?
A. Yes, right through. Those who wanted to go to the Volunteers we exchanged.
- Q. Had you members in both organisations at the same time?
A. No. A man got a definite transfer from us to the Volunteers, or from the Volunteers to us. There was very close co-operation.
- Q. Was the Citizen Army exclusively military in its object?
A. Yes.
- Q. In the Constitution you were tied to men who were members of a trade Union?
A. Yes.
- Q. Was there a branch of the Citizen Army in Cork?
A. Yes.
- Q. Were they simply autonomous in Cork?
A. Yes.
- Q. Supposing the Cork people claim they are the Citizen Army?
A. I think, if the Cork men try to claim that, they may be sorry for what they say.
- Q. You believe the Cork Citizen Army was an off-shoot from Headquarters?
A. Yes. I am quite sure, there was always authority from us when a new branch was being formed.
- Q. During the period of activities, the Citizen Army worked in close co-operation with the Volunteers?
A. Yes. A case occurred in Longford - we let them start anything they wished, as long as they fought in the one common cause. Our instruction in these cases to such people who wanted to organise sections in the country was for them to act in close co-operation with the Volunteers.

(Your Army, and the Branches, and different groups of officers, did not fit in with the organisation on schedule.)
- Q. Your rank of Commandant does not fit in with Commandant of a Brigade in the Volunteers?
A. No.
- Q. Your captaincy is a captain in the Organisation, and not under the Act?
A. Yes.
- Q. How many of your members who fought in 1916 would be making claims?
A. 239 would be claiming in respect of 1916, and 1923, including women.
- Q. What did the women do?
A. Red Cross work, intelligence, carrying guns, and sometimes risky work.

- Q. Used the women march with the men?
A. Yes - before 1916, mid-night marches, etc.
- Q. After about 1919 or 1920, drilling in Liberty Hall became an impossibility?
A. It became pretty hot. The labour people became nervous. However, we did hold possession on to the Civil War. As soon as the Civil War took place, our end got barred up. On some occasions it was raided, during the "Tan" war. On one occasion they got some rifles, and on another, they tore up the floor, etc. We had great difficulty in trying to get back. We had to take it forcibly, really.
- Q. Will you be the only Commandant claiming up to 1922?
A. I ceased to be Commandant from March, 1922. John Henratty took my place. He was Commandant on the second critical date. I was arrested the beginning of the Civil War - after the 1st of July.

1920. November. Black and Tan Rifles collected in Rathgar Area. General Drills (Indoor and outdoor). Rifle and Revolver practice. Watching suspected persons and houses. Outpost duty. Patrol duty (armed and unarmed). Collecting arms and equipment. Helping deserters from British Army. Serving notice re Belfast Boycott goods on firms.

Detective duty: Watching movements of British Military and Police. Guarding houses where meetings of the Republican Forces were being held in the following area: Terenure, Rathgar, Harolds Cross and city of Dublin, etc. Carrying and removing arms backwards and forwards. Note: (Each member will recollect own duty).

Arms and Equipment were collected in the following areas:- Stillorgan, Donnybrook, Bray, Rathgar, Terenure, Harolds Cross, Kimmage, Dublin City (notably Mercer's Street and Dominick Street).

Red Cross Lectures carried on at Moira Cottage, Rathgar Ave. (under instruction of M. O. J. Doolan and J. Kearney).

Notes: January, 1921. General arrests of I.R.A. in South Co. Dublin. Intensive I.C.A. and I. Volunteer activity started to obstruct Enemy Forces. Sections I.C.A. on night duty at regular times:- Malahide, Sutton, Tallaght and other areas.

January-July, 1921. First Aid Equipment commandeered from Grafton Street for use of unit. Land-Mine got out of Gormanstown Aerodrome Ambush planned by the Late Comdt. Sean O'Neill in Tallaght area. Harbouring men and women on the run.

Police Duty: (armed and unarmed): 2nd Lieut. P. Kearney in charge of Police section. Houses in South Co. Dublin guarded by I.C.A. men when asked for protection. Property recovered by I.C.A. men, and handed back to owners.

Circulating section: An t-Oglach newspaper circulated. I.C.A. members of Printing trade assisted.

Munitions: The casting of slugs, and refilling shot-gun cartridges, carried out by members of I.C.A., assisted in collecting war material, etc.

Helped to commandeer rifles from Wynnfield Post Office, Rathmines. Harbouring and assisting men and women of the Republican Forces. Collecting food, clothes, etc. for families of Prisoners of War.

Column Officer No.1. Padg. O Broin, Terenure.

1921-1922. Terenure, Rathgar, Rathmines, Crumlin and adjoining areas.

Column Officer No.2. Patrick Walsh, Piperstown, Tallaght.

1921-1922. Dublin Mountains area.

Column Officer No.3. Philip Kearney, late Dartry. 91 Bulfin Road, Kilmainham.

1921-1923 Dundrum, Stillorgan, Blackrock, Dartry and adjoining areas.


