- With reference to the question of your man who is here in town, it seems that you have entirely misunderstood me altogether. The question I put to you was not one of providing him with monetary assistance but a request to you as to whether you could do anything to reay the Dublin Brigade the amount the Brigade Q.M. paid him viz: 212. That is the real question. As I remarked in previous correspondence on this matter, the boys here are out of thunds to that extent and they can ill afford it. Will you please see what you can do in the matter?
- Re Officers. Your first report gives the following return viz: No. on roll ... 64. No. of officers ... 17. Now, according to the scheme of Military Organisation a full company (79 boys) is allowed 3 OFFICERS (1 Capt. and 2 Lieuts.) and 4 senior N.C.Os. (Section Leaders) and 8 Corporals. That is, a company has 64 boys and 15 N.C.Os. and Officers. You in your reading of mine of 13.4. we're evidently under the impression that the term "Officers" includes N.C.Os. and well as Officers. They are two different grades. This apparent from the fact that the Batt. Council can ratify the ppointment of N.C.Os. (Section leaders and corporals) whereas all appointment to Commissioned rank (Lieut. and Capt., Comdt. and Vice Comdt.) must be ratified by General Headquarters. Kindly note this.
- It is the duty of both the Fianna and the Re operations. I.V. to acquaint each other of the intention of either parties to carry out operations. Fiannaidhthe must not carry out operations without consulting the I.V. Comdt. in the area. Your Liaison Officer must see that in all cases that this is done. If he has not been approached by the I.V. it is his duty to approach them. Of course, there are certain operations, the nature of which MUST be kept quiet, but a hint can be given by one party to the other to the effect that "such-and-such a place or district is a closed one for such-and-such a time" I think that this will obviate any such danger as that you have mentioned.
- I am glad to learn that you intend spreading the movement and wish you every success.
- Unfortunately we were obliged to discontinue the publication of the official journal.

Fianna then assisted in maintaining the Republican movement in Dundalk by assisting in providing for prisoners and dependants. The Fianna always held itself together and attempted to recruit and reorganize.

Re. Enemy Camps.etc.

No.1. Omeath.

This Camp is the Headquarters of the Irregular Forces 4th. Northern Divi ion. They occupy the Coastghard Station, the Strand Hotel and Mr. John Quinn's private Residence. All those houses lie between the railway line and the sea-shore. As you pass along the Newry road to Omeath going towards the Six-Counties there is a fine private house belonging to a man named Mr. Carroll. It is in this house that the Intelligence Officers and Propaganda agents work, there is also a score of privates billited here. The total strength of the Irregular forces in Omeath and district I would estimate at 200 men as they have been reinforced from the Six-Counties within the last week. fighting strength I would say is 80 privates armed with rifles and about 20 Officers. In adittion to the rifles they have about three Thompsons and one Lewis Gun. For some time past all the men are standing to from about MIDNIGHT and patrolling the roads with the exception of a few Officers. They have outposts of four armed at each on the Carlingford road, the Newry road, and the back road which runs thro' the mountains and overlooks the villxage. There is a danger of mines benn laid on the leading roads to the village as there is a large quantity of explosives in "Dumps" around the village .

No.2. Tipping's Wood or Bellurgan.

This is at present headquarters of the Dundalk Brigade and is only used as an outpost as the Officers of this are mostly in Omeath. The men here are responsible for the blocking of the roads, holding up trains, and breadvans, Etc., This Brigade has a Thompson Gun, about 80 rifles, some revolvers and ammunition, but all the men connected with this Brigade are not in this area.

No.3. Ravensdale & Dungooley.

These outposts are at the moment, I beliave, vacated. The men in these Camps have been formed into Flying Columns and are lying about in the vicinity of these camps and some of them have gone too meath

Alfred Heaney had been in charge of Dundalk Battn. Fianna during Truce. He attended Fianna Convention in Dublin at the end of April 1922. On 17th May 1922 he appointed Nick Hearty to take charge of Battn. as he (Heaney) was going into Bridge St. Barracks. Heaney states he went into the Barracks for the purpose of training and that he had got instructions from his G.H.Q. to organise Fianna throughout Bde. Area. I see by Coy. Register that Heaney is returned as being attached to "C" Coy. Dundalk on 2nd critical date although he states he never was transferred to I.R.A., neither did he resign from Fianna. The actual position regarding Fianna so far as I can find out was at that time, that Mick Hearty was appointed by Heaney to take charge of Battn. on 17th May 1922. Hearty continued in charge until he was arrested on 16th July 1922. He later escaped through hole in gool wall on 27th July 1922 and afterwards carried on with a column.
