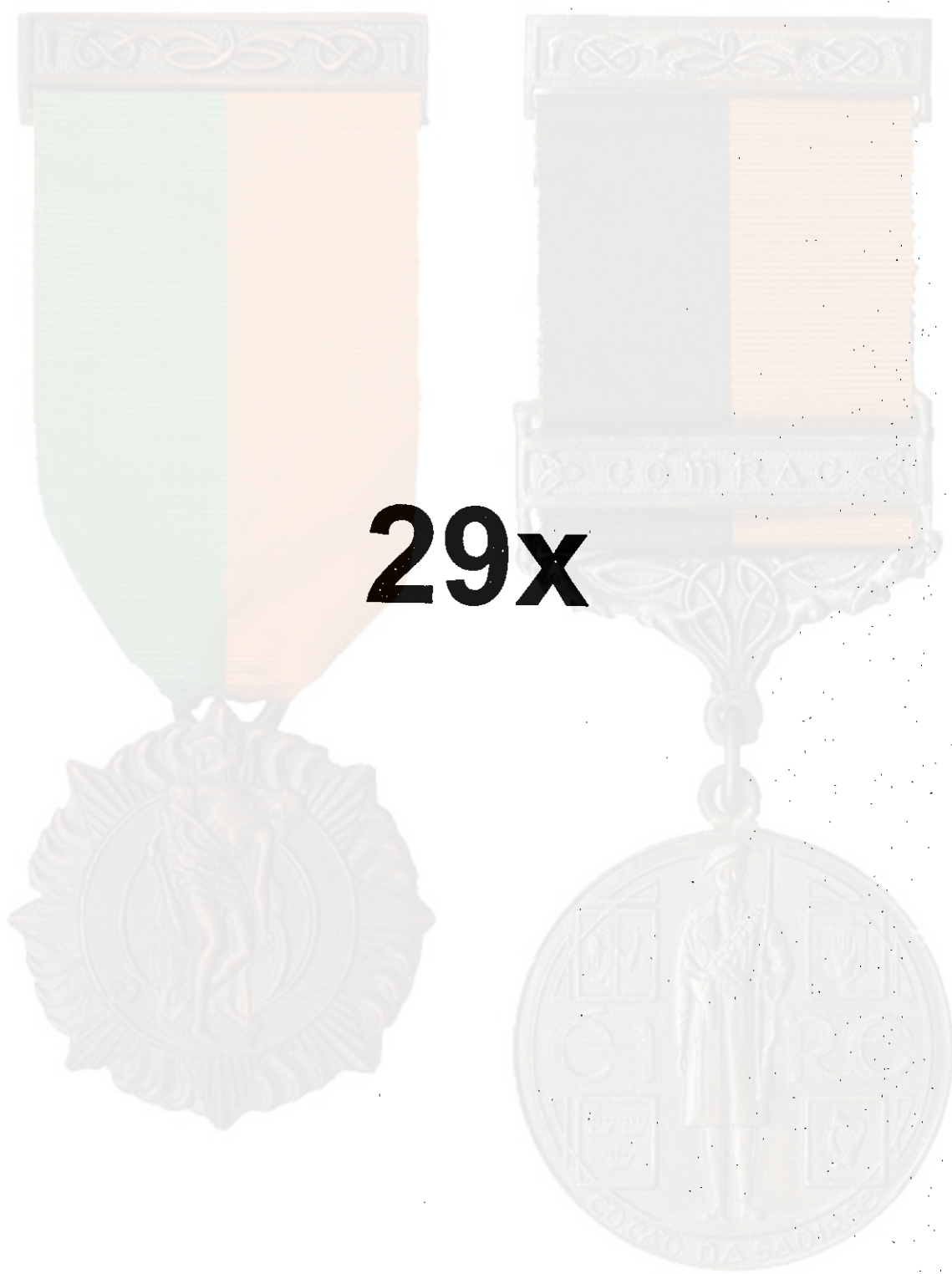

Certain information which has reached me convinces me that it is desirable that I should communicate with you and send you a true, accurate list of the men who took part in the 1916 Fight belonging to Rathfarnham Company, otherwise, E. Coy., Battr IV., Dublin Bgde., Irish Volunteers.

I myself founded that Company early in 1914, and organised, drilled, armed and equipped them in every way. At the first election of officers we managed to have P. H. Pearse, appointed Captain. To strengthen our hold we had a local man (Michael Boland) elected as Lieut, because having been in the British Militia he was looked upon locally as one who knew Company drill. I myself was appointed 2nd Lieut, but, as it will easily be understood, P. H.'s Captaincy was nominal - it could not be otherwise.

I, in fact, commanded the Company from its inception up to Easter Week 1916. At the first Company meeting afterwards, of course, I was unanimously made Captain. I remained Captain of E. Coy Dattu IV. until, I think, early 1917 when I had to take on the post of Comdt of that (IVth) Dattu.

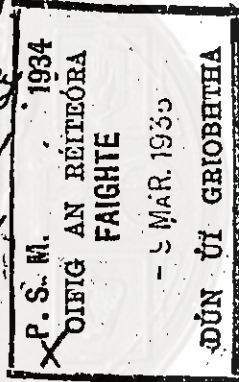
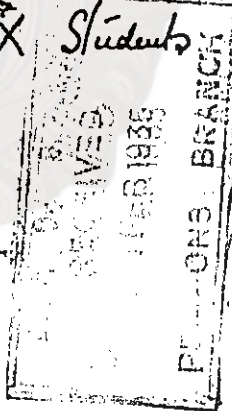
By chance it happened that when the Civil War started in 1922 I was appointed to the same area, and can therefore speak regarding the participation of any of the old Rathfriland Coy in that fight. The Company as such did not take part, and my Command there was the South Dublin Brigade, which I took over after the Blessington fiasco, owing to the arrest or capture of the former Brigadier.

I have made this lengthy statement in order that you may understand what authority lies behind the enclosed list, and I trust my sending same will aid you in the task you have of testing the credentials of those who appear before your Board.

P.S. I should be glad to receive 10 more or less 3 or 4 copies of the form to supply them to any who either have none, or have destroyed them with errors etc. L.C. (John Clarke)

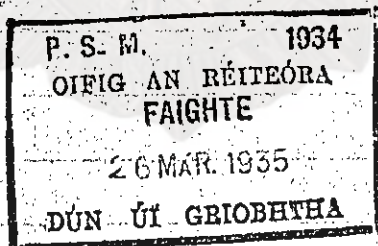

In reply to yours received this morning I now enclose herewith a list of the men of the Rathfriland Coy (E. IV) who did not participate in the Easter week fighting. I have drawn a distinction between those who were really active members and those who were on the roll but irregular & unreliable. Indeed I should have included the two Macdonnys under the latter heads only for their being cognisant of the Company's movements & orders that Easter, unlike many of the others who contended they did not receive the mobilisation order. In other words the first list of 10. comprises those members who intentionally & knowingly dodged the fight.

To complete things perhaps I should here state that of those who fought in 1916 I know of few only who joined the Free State Army and but three who defended the Republic in 1922, and I include the names herewith also.

The Board has evidently confused this case with another - Phil McElroy, who was 1st Lieut. of Co. "C" Battn. 4, on the second critical date. I was not to make any statement about it, but the Board were to refer to the lists already supplied by me to ascertain whether the numbers in his Coy. on the 2nd critical date entitled McElroy to Grade "D". I do not know whether they have done so.

With regard to McCarthy his rank was never in question. He was Captain of "C" Coy. Battn. 4, for years before Easter Week and although it would be difficult to estimate the strength of the Coy. after so many years I can definitely say that it was the strongest Coy. in the 4th Battalion and one of the strongest if not the strongest in the Dublin Brigade. If therefore any other Coy. Capt. has been granted Grade "D" on that date McCarthy is obviously entitled to it. The half company in Roes Distillery numbered 30/40 men; the other half Coy. was in the South Dublin Union & some were in Marrowbone Lane Distillery.

I may mention that I was to have been supplied with a list of those applicants concerning whom I was to make a statement to the Board. I have not yet recd. this list.
