ALLOWANCES FOR WIDOWS OR MILITARY SERVICE PENSIONERS AND CONNAUGHT
RANGERS SERVICE PENSIONERS.

In accordance with the Budget 1971 Statement of the Minister for Finance
the widow of a person who was granted

- (a) a pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924,
 - (b) a pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, or
 - (c) a service pension under the Connaught Rangers (Pensions) Act, 1936,
- is eligible for an allowance, provided that she has not remarried.

The Scheme does not apply to the widows of persons who were granted a special allowance under the Army Pensions Acts.

Amount of allowance payable:

The allowance payable to a widow will be a yearly sum equal to whichever of the following amounts is the greater -

- (i) £52.20 or
- (ii) One-half of the service pension payable to her husband on the 1st October, 1971, or which would be payable to him if he were alive on that date.

Commencing date for Allowance:

A widow's allowance will be payable from the 1st October, 1971, or the day following the death of her husband, whichever is the later.

Termination of Allowance on re-marriage:

If a widow who is in receipt of an allowance remarries, the allowance shall be terminated as from the date of her remarriage.

Exclusion of Allowance from calculation of means under the Social Welfare Acts.

The allowance payable to a widow will be disregarded in the calculation of means for purposes of old age pensions and widows pensions under the Social Welfare Acts.

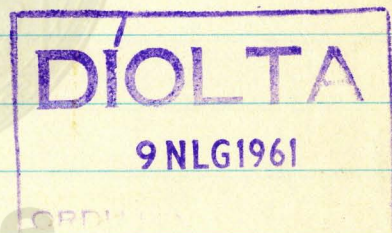

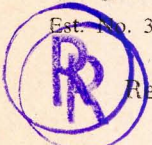

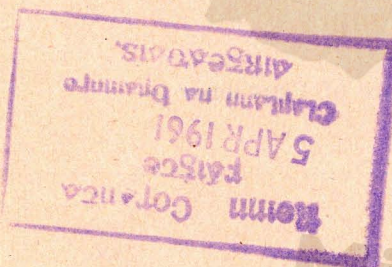
