With reference to your letter regarding a widow's pension, I am directed by An tAire Cosanta to state that the new widow's allowance under the Army Pensions Act, 1971, is payable only to the widow of a person who was awarded a military service pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, or the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934. This allowance is not payable to the widow of a person who was awarded any other type of pension or allowance such as a special allowance, Defence Forces pension, etc.

As your husband was not in receipt of a military service pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, or the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, it is regretted that you are not eligible for an allowance under the Army Pensions Act, 1971.

An examination of all the medal files of persons in receipt of special allowances in the Dublin area disclosed that only two of these were awarded medals in respect of membership of the Citizen Army. The files (MD/22409 and 34/5P/1387) are attached, please. Both persons claimed service from 1917 to 1923.

I would not be prepared at this late stage to hold or recommend that members of the I.C.A. shall not be eligible for medals in respect of the period 1/4/21 - 11/7/21. It would seem that the organisation remained in existence, and I think we would only be stirring up a hornet's nest if, on such limited information as we have, we lowered the medals on grounds of inactivity.

The two Poles cannot, of course, be accepted as resigning officers for the period, but as Mr. Cogan is on the Roll and is verified by two listed officers (Messrs. Stannett and McMahon). I have signed the award. No 257-1/60.

A medal was issued in April 1950 to Mr. John Colgan, 2 Meath Market, South Earl Street, Dublin, on the basis of membership of the Irish Citizen Army during the period of three months which ended on the 11th July, 1921. The verification was that of -

1. John Hanratty, 34C/52, Q.M.
2. Richard McCormick, 34D/149, Captain,
3. Christopher Poole, 34D/675, Captain.

An examination of the pension files of these pensioners has disclosed that (1) Christopher Poole resigned from the Citizen Army in 1919, (2) Richard McCormick was not awarded any service in respect of the period from 1/4/1921-11/7/1921, (3) John Hanratty was awarded service for the period from 1/4/1921 to 11/7/1921. Following an application for a special allowance, a verification form was issued to Vincent Poole, 34E/213, member, and he verified also. Mr. Vincent Poole's pension file, however, shows that he was a member of No. 2 Company, 5th (Engineers) Battalion, Dublin Brigade, I.R.A. during the critical period; he had been a member of the Citizen Army in 1916. There are two rolls for the Citizen Army, showing one unit only as being in existence from 1917 to 1922, and a number of pensions were awarded in respect of partial service in the period 1/4/1921-11/7/1921, the service allowed was generally 1/12th of the period, i.e., one month. The basis of the claim for service in the period from 1/4/1921-11/7/1921 which was allowed seems to have been that a number of members of the Citizen Army who happened to be around Liberty Hall on the 25th May, 1921, armed themselves and took part in the burning of the Custom House. *This is, of course, an ad-hoc party of Eibhinn.*

An tAire Dlí agus Cirt, who was Brigade O.C., Dublin Brigade, had no contact with the Citizen Army, and none of the members served with the Dublin Brigade as far as he is aware. The only incident he recalls is that Mr. Jas O'Neill, O.C., Citizen Army, sold arms to the I.R.A. Mr. Traynor has no objection to being quoted in this connection.

In my opinion, the Citizen Army was inactive during the period from 1/4/1921-11/7/1921, and earlier for that matter, and I feel the Service (1917-1921) Medal should not be awarded to any person claiming that he is entitled to it by reason of membership of it. While the criterion for the award of the Service (1917-1921) Medal without Bar is membership rather than service, it has, of course, always been accepted that membership means, at the least, membership of an active unit of an active organisation, viz., I.R.A., Cumann na mBan, Fianna Éireann. I recommend, therefore, that the medal issued to Mr. Colgan in 1950 be held to be not duly awarded.

Neither Christopher nor Vincent Poole were connected with the Irish Citizen Army for the critical period; the former, in his evidence before the Referee, stated that he resigned in 1919, while the latter's service from 1.4.1921 would appear to have been with No. 2 Coy, Batt V (Engineers), Dublin Brigade.

The Referee's report on Hanrahan and McCormick would suggest that he regarded them both as members of the Citizen Army for the critical period - even though McCormick was not credited with active service for this period.

The Citizen Army Roll (IOA) contains a note concerning one Pádraig Ó Boinn who transferred to the Citizen Army in 1920 from A Coy 4th Batt. This man was awarded a pension; his service for the period 1.4.1920 to 31.3.1921 is divided between <sup>Égligh, na Léinn</sup> ~~the Volunteers~~ and the Citizen Army while his service for the 7th period,  $\frac{1}{3}$  of which he received for pension purposes was with the Citizen Army. The James O'Neill shown on page 102 as O'N. was also awarded a pension (34C117) and his service in the 7th period also ~~was with~~ <sup>was with</sup> the Citizen Army.

In the Referee's records - the Red Book - there are quite a number of Citizen Army pensioners

listed with service in the 7th period and some more  
with service (active) in the 6th and 8th periods but where  
there is evidence, did not have any fight in the 7th. A  
number of the <sup>relevant</sup> before files are attached.

According to the pension (Refuse) files Christopher Poole resigned from the Citizen Army in 1919 and Richards the Comrade rendered no service during the period 1/4/1921 - 11/7/1921. It seems rather silly on our part to regard these men as verifying officers. It would not be out of place to examine the file of Vincent Poole to see how he fared as to service. John Hanratty was awarded full service for the period 1/4/1921 - 11/7/1921 although in his own evidence he states that he did nothing during the period. Let us see the "contrary roll" with Vincent Poole's file.


