With reference to your minute of the 29th ultimo up to now the position in this case has been that Commandant Stapleton has been in receipt of a Garda Pension of £438.7s.8d. per annum and a Scheme Pension of £166.5s.8d. per annum, total £604.13.4., the ceiling for both Scheme and Garda Pensions being £604.13.4. (2/3 of £904)

2. The position now is that there are two "ceilings" which operate to limit the sum of the pensions to the lower viz.

Even though Commandant Stapleton's scheme pension has, technically, been overpaid since 1st August, 1956, as a result of the increase in his Garda pension with effect from that date the increase payable under the 1957 Scheme will more than offset the overpayment and accordingly it is thought that no change should be effected on the Scheme pension as a result of the increase in Garda Pension.

A Chara,

I am directed by the Minister for Defence to refer to the pension of £144 per annum awarded to you under Article 19 of the Defence Forces (Pensions) Scheme, 1937, with effect from the 14th May, 1951, the date of your retirement from the Gárda Síochana, and to state that you were notified on the 31st August, 1953, that this pension had been increased by 30% to £187 4s. 0d. per annum, with effect from the 1st January, 1953, under the Defence Forces (Pensions) (Amendment) Scheme, 1953.

In this connection, I am to explain that the Sixth Schedule to the 1937 Scheme stipulates that, in the case of a retired member of the Gárda Síochana, the pension payable under Article 19 of the Scheme together with the Garda pension, shall not exceed two-thirds of the Garda pensionable salary. At the time of the above-mentioned increase, it was understood that your Garda pensionable salary was £907 per annum and that your Garda pension was £395 8s. 4d. per annum. This position would have permitted the full 30% increase in your Scheme pension, as the aggregate of the increased Scheme pension (£187 4s. 0d.) and your Garda pension (£395 8s. 4d.) - £582 12s. 4d. - would have been less than two-thirds of your Garda pensionable salary viz. £604 13s. 4d. (£907 x $\frac{2}{3}$). It has recently come to light, however, that you were granted a revised Garda pension of £438 7s. 8d. per annum with effect from the 29th December, 1951, and, as a consequence, the aggregate of the increased Scheme pension (£187 4s. 0d.) and the revised Garda pension (£438 7s. 8d.) has exceeded the ceiling of £604 13s. 4d. mentioned above by £20 18s. 4d. per annum, as from the 1st January, 1953. Your correct Scheme pension was, therefore, £166 5s. 8d. per annum, with effect from the 1st January, 1953, and not £187 4s. 0d. per annum which was actually paid from that date.

Your Scheme pension has, accordingly, been overpaid to the extent of £84 13s. 4d. over the period 1st January, 1953 to 31st January, 1957, (£83 13s. 4d. - £20 18s. 4d. x 4 - over period 1st January, 1953 to 31st December, 1956 and £1 for January, 1957). It is regretted that it will be necessary to reduce your Scheme pension to the correct amount viz. £166 5s. 8d. per annum and to recover therefrom the overpayment of £84 13s. 4d. It is proposed to effect the recovery at the rate of £10 per month, commencing at the end of the present month.

* In increasing the Scheme pension under the 1953 Scheme to this amount, the amount of the actual civil pension was taken to be £395 8s. 4d. and not £438 7s. 8d. as notified by the Department of Finance. This latter notification was placed on the M.S.P. file (SP.11145, 24SP/6225) to which the Department of Finance minute specifically referred and was not adverted to when the increase in the Scheme pension was assessed on the Scheme pension file.

1. I attach a submission to the Department of Finance (1/1) concerning the pension payable to ex-Commandant Stapleton under Article 19 of the Scheme. As well I attach a note setting out in tabular form the various rates of pension payable to him since his retirement from the Garda Síochána.
2. Before any action was taken in regard to the 1953 increase in the Scheme pension, the Department of Finance should have been consulted as to the proposed increase so that the rate of Garda pension could have been confirmed - or adjusted if necessary - in the light of the proposed increase in the Scheme pension. Department of Finance were not, however, consulted or notified of the increased pension. This omission will be brought to the attention of those concerned on the issue of this minute to Department of Finance.
3. I have been in touch with the Department of Finance (Mr. Fogarty) and Department of Justice (Mr. Griffin) about this case. I gather from the latter that this particular case is the subject of a separate submission about to be made to the Department of Finance. He has asked to be furnished with a copy of ~~the~~ submission to the Department of Finance and a copy is attached for issue also.

1. I am directed by the Minister for Defence to refer to the case of Mr. Daniel Stapleton, Hillcrest, Skerries, Co. Dublin, who is in receipt of a pension under the Military Service Pensions Acts, 1924-1953 (Your ref. P.20/1/37), together with a pension under Article 19 of the Defence Forces (Pensions) Scheme, 1937-1956 (your ref. P.12/7/51) and a pension under the Garda Síochána Pensions Orders (your ref. P.3/46/51) and to state that this Department has under consideration the revision of Mr. Stapleton's Scheme pension arising from your Department's minutes (P.18/6/56) dated 27th June, 1956, and 2nd July, 1956, regarding increases in certain pensions and allowances administered by this Department.

2. It is understood that the pension payable to Mr. Stapleton under the Garda Síochána Pensions Orders was subject to the condition that such pension together with any other State pensions could not exceed in the aggregate two-thirds of his pensionable salary, i.e. £907 a year, the revised pensionable salary mentioned in your Department's minute P.3/46/51 dated 27th September, 1951. It is noted from your Department's minute of even reference dated 18th February, 1952, that Mr. Stapleton had been granted a revised Garda pension of £438.7.8d. a year with effect from 29th December, 1951, and that it was not necessary as from that date to take account of his military service pension in calculating his Garda pension. It would appear that in calculating the Garda pension the Scheme pension continued to be reckonable. The latter pension, however, was increased from £144 a year to £187.4s. a year with effect from 1st January, 1953, under Article 26 of the Defence Forces (Pensions) (Amendment) Scheme, 1953. As a consequence the aggregate of the revised Garda pension and the increased Scheme pension has exceeded by £20.18.4d. a year as from 1st January, 1953, the ceiling of two-thirds of the revised pensionable salary, viz., £604.13.4d. a year. In the circumstances an adjustment in the pensions payable to Mr. Stapleton arising out of the foregoing position is necessary apart from any adjustment which may become necessary arising from the recent pension increases authorised as from 1st August, 1956.

3. In accordance with the scale of increases laid down in your Department's minute (P.18/6/56) dated 27th June, 1956, Mr. Stapleton's Scheme pension would be increased from £187.4s. a year to £205.4s. a year with effect from 1st August, 1956, were it not for the restrictive ceiling of the "hypothetical maximum (civil) pension" referred to in the Sixth Schedule of the Defence Forces Pensions Scheme, 1937, as amended by Article 39 of the 1947 Scheme which as it stands at present precludes, in effect, the grant of any increase in the aggregate of the Garda and Scheme pensions payable to Mr. Stapleton. In these circumstances perhaps you would be good enough to advise this Department as to the position in relation to the Garda pension and as to whether the recovery of the overpayment referred to in paragraph 2 should be effected from the Scheme or Garda pension. Furthermore, it would appear necessary - in order to allow of an increase of 6% in the aggregate amount of Mr. Stapleton's Scheme and Garda pensions - to amend the definition of "hypothetical maximum (civil) pension" in the Sixth Schedule of the Scheme. Perhaps you would be good enough to say whether the Minister for Finance agrees that such an amendment should be made.



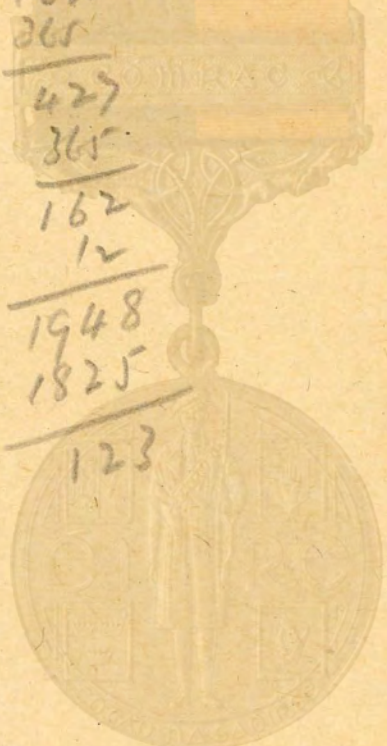

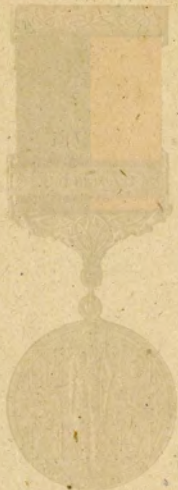
