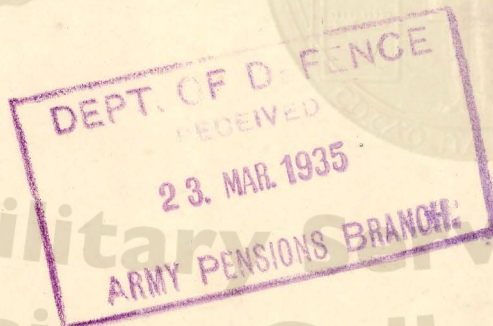

Section 20 (1) of the Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, defines Public Moneys as—“ Any remuneration, pension, or allowance payable out of public moneys, whether provided by the Oireachtas or out of the Central Fund or by means of the poor rate or any other rate imposed by a local authority.”

Extract from Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, Section 19 (1) & (2)—“ If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment.

If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction.”

N.B.—This Certificate is no security whatever for debt. It should be carefully preserved, as it will be of the greatest assistance to you when completing the Pension Warrants, which will be sent to you.

* In the event of the death of the person to whom this Form is addressed, the person who notifies the death to the local Registrar of Deaths should deliver this Form and any other Pension papers held by deceased, to him, and will receive from him the sum of one shilling for so doing.

the Minister shall send by registered post, addressed to such person at his last known residence, a notice requiring such person to send such certificate to the Minister within such time after the service of such notice as may be specified in such notice.

- (2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.

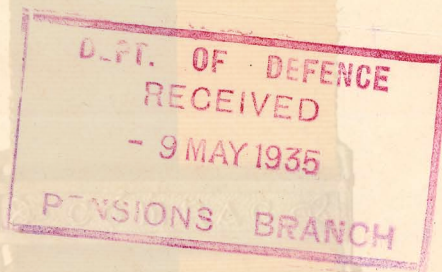

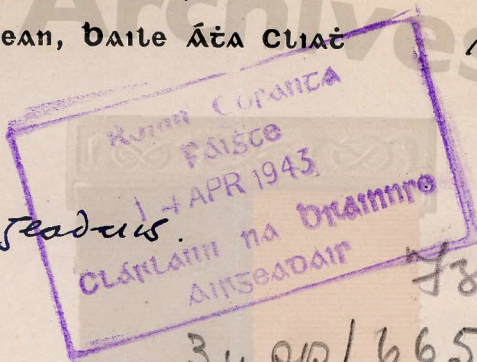

I have to acknowledge receipt of yours of 10th inst. with reference to abatement of my Military Service pension.

Although I have no desire to prolong the correspondence unduly I still hold that the amounts already deducted and the further amount which you now state is to be recovered are excessive. The deduction of £10.18.8 from my pension because I received £28.4.0 out of public funds in the period 30 July 1942 / 29 January 1943 appears to me to have been calculated at more than double the rate named in the Act, or at any rate by a method that produced an equivalent result.

With regard to the portion of your letter which states that I was employed for 19 days to 31/3/1943 I have the following observations to make for your consideration. My employment

was on an hourly basis except when the number of hours on any one occasion exceeded five. Periods of less than one hour were calculated by quarter hours when payment orders were being issued. Actually I was employed for 48 hours (@ 10/- per hour) and for $6\frac{1}{4}$ hours (for $\pounds 4/4$ -). The 48 hours was the total for 18 different occasions of employment varying from $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours, $1\frac{3}{4}$ hours, 2 hours &c. to $3\frac{3}{4}$ hours, all of which were on different dates. I could not have remained longer at my employment on those occasions than the business for which I was summoned lasted. If I had been employed by the day or for a day I would have received $\pounds 4/4$ - on each of those 18 occasions. I do not think you would even be justified in claiming that I was employed for one day on the 19th occasion, which was of $6\frac{1}{4}$ hours duration, although I received $\pounds 4/4$ - then. After $6\frac{1}{4}$ hours on that occasion the business was concluded and I had no right to remain any longer at the place of employment. On the contrary I had to leave and was free to engage in any other employment.

Accordingly I hold that the abatement should be at the rate of 100% for 48 hours plus 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ hours i.e. for 54 $\frac{1}{4}$ hours or at the rate of 5% for 6 months.

Please note that I have resigned from the appointment which is the subject of this correspondence and that I am not now in receipt of any moneys out of public funds. This should obviate the necessity for making an abatement on future payments of my pension. A further and final payment was made to me since I last notified you and I assume that the usual arrangements will be made for giving you particulars on the next payment of the pension at end of present month.


