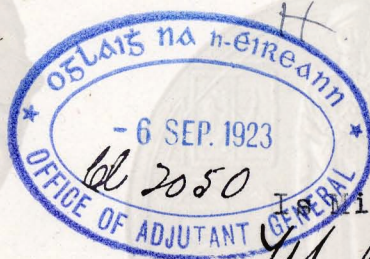

I have been informed by Mrs Annie Ryan, of 8 Royal Canal Terrace mother of the late Vol Bernard Ryan, Active Service Unit, I. R. A, who was executed on the 14th day of March 1921, at Mountjoy Prison, for complicity in the Drumcondra Ambush, that she has been notified by Senator Mrs Wyse Power, that her allowance will be stopped after this week, and that henceforward she would come ~~under~~ within the scope of the Act providing Pensions for relatives of soldiers killed in action.

Kindly let me know the procedure, if any, adopted in such cases, and what provisions will be made for my client and others similarly circumstanced, in the meantime.

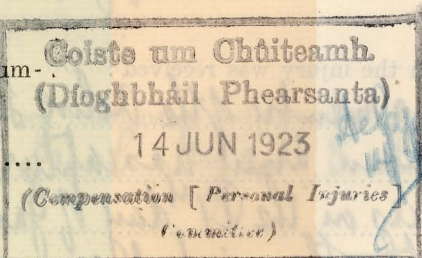
