I am instructed by Mrs Fouvargue of 20 Dunville Avenue, Rathmines, Dublin, to apply to you for £2000 compensation in respect of her son [Vincent Fouvargue, 20 Dunville Av. Rathmines, Dublin] who was found shot dead in London prior to the Truce of 1921. The Deceased held the position of Intelligence Officer in "A" Company, 4th Dublin Brigade I.R.A., and his mysterious death followed his escape from the hands of the British Forces. He was the sole support of his widowed mother and her young children, and she claims compensation by reason of the fact that he lost his life on account of his work on behalf of his country.]

I will accordingly be glad to hear from you on the matter at an early date.
