"The Applicant is a small farmer residing with his wife and family at Coolealackagh. The extent of the farm is four acres, and the valuation is £4.15.0. The family consists of a daughter and two sons, of which Thomas, the second son, was killed during the late Anglo-Irish War.

Bernard McEneaney and his wife are both over 70 years of age and have the Old Age Pension for some considerable time, probably five or six years.

Thomas, prior to his death assisted the elder brother with the work on the farm.

The Applicant was partially dependent on the Deceased."

In his statement of claim the Applicant says his deceased son worked for him half time (3 days per week) the remainder of the week he worked outside, receiving 10/- p.w. and maintenance. The Rev. James Nolan C.C. states Claimant has been in the habit of taking one acre, and, apparently, deceased helped in this.
