The conditions prevailing in Wexford Town, from August to October, the latter month being the time of my own arrest, was one of extreme danger, chiefly from espionage. Under those circumstances men could not meet in a body, and instructions could only be given to one or two, who could communicate more freely with the rest.

Under those circumstances Joe Whitty, P.I.P. could have been enrolled in the I.R.A. by his brother John, who was adjutant of the A.S.V. without my knowledge. Certain it was that he was arrested as the result of his military activities because, upon the night of his arrest, the N.C.O. who was subordinate on the patrol, definitely stated that it was Joe with whom he was concerned. I also heard one of the U.S. Army intelligence officers, tell the deceased that he had been seen with a rifle, you see both of us were in the same room in Wexford Barracks. Now the deceased's mother bears out that accusation because when I asked her to do so.

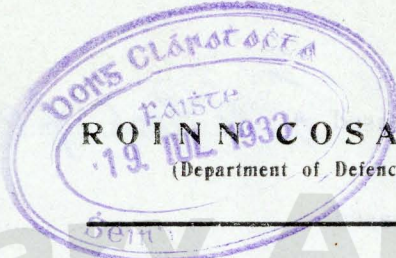
he ever had a rifle during any operations, he said he had, so you see that his arrest was due to a military operation which was carried out, about 13th Oct. 1923. Joe was arrested the night of the 15th (May be a day or so astray,) and myself went under the 21st. From the time of my acquaintance with him in prison, to the time of his departure from Newbridge, to the Curragh Hospital, his conduct was quite in keeping with the high standard of our camp, and as a layman I would say that his disease was contracted as the result of his imprisonment, that imprisonment could never have taken place only for the assistance which he gave our men, and we had not many friends at that time. I would ask you to note particularly, that the Army people were concerned with Joe not John, and, he was arrested because he had been seen with a rifle, upon the night which a military operation occurred, here in which his area of the A.S.W. was engaged.

Also, that a man could have been enrolled without my knowledge, on account of the difficulty of keeping proper records. I am satisfied that he would never have been arrested, only for the circumstances which prevailed that night, and a rifle at that time was not for ornamental purposes.

His family have met a lot of trouble, as a direct result of the activities of the male members with the I.R.A. One brother Pat has been practically unemployed since his release from Newbridge in 1923. The father is an old man now, and in a couple of years time will be almost beyond his labour. The risks those people took during the civil war, for our sakes, could not be too highly commended, for it was only through the use of their place, that we were able to hold communication with that area. And now their circumstances are not of the best and I don't think that a more genuine case exist to-day than

the one under consideration. my only hope is that
 your board will satisfy the pension, for it
 is badly wanted. With regard to my rank in
 the army, Mr. Tom Hewlett, Campile, Co. Wexford,
 will give you any information required.
 Personal character can be had from Mr. E. O'Ryan
 Tomesole Co. Wexford. and conduct in prison
 from ^{Mr.} James Daly Courtnacuddy Co. Wexford.
 The latter Officer can also answer for me,
 whilst in prison, as he was with him up
 to the time of his removal. I might also add
 that I requested the Army Doctor at Newbridge
 to have me removed from the hut to the
 Camp hospital. Well I've tried to give you
 a faithful account of a tragic incident
 which I do not like to recall, but if it
 help to gain anything for one of our best friends,
 then the poignant memory will be less bitter.
 And I hope that none of the boys will ever
 face destitution

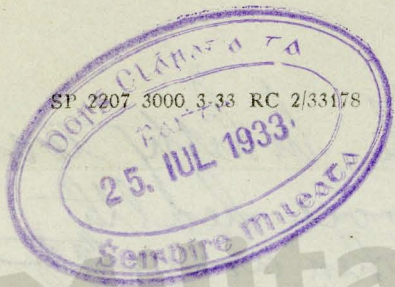
