- (2) Any person who at any date was either—
 - (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
 - (b) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

- (3) Any person who at any date was either—
 - (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
 - (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
 - (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
 - (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
 - (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
 - (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
 - (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
 - (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
 - (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
 - (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
 - (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

- (4) A person who at any date—
 - (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
 - (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
 - (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
 - (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
 - (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
 - (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
 - (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
 - (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
 - (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or

(j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or

- (k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or
- (m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

- (5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely:-
 - (a) was at any date an officer, and
 - (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

- (6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- (7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglaigh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say:—
 - (a) any person who at any date:
 - (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
 - (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
 - (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- 2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say:—
 - (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
 - (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.
- 3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say:—
 - (a) the appointment held by such person,
 - (b) the services performed by such person,
 - (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.
- 4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

- (a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and
- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.
- 2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—
 - (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or
 - (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and

the expression "the second critical date" shall be construed as meaning the earliest date in the period between the first critical date in respect of such person, and the 12th day of July, 1921, on which such person held his highest rank in such last-mentioned period in the Forces.

1st Period.

Mobilised and stood to. Cut communications. No fight.

2nd Period.

Made buckshot and filled cartridges. Imprisoned for 2 weeks in July for singing Sinn Fein songs.

3rd Period.

15 to 20 raids for arms.

4th Period.

In preparation for the Conscription Crisis made buckshot and filled cartridges in the evenings for 3 or 4 months. Also made pikes and bayonets in the day, and sometimes at night for a period of 3 or 4 months.

5th Period.

After Knocklong Train raid states that he was in touch with the men connected with the raid while in his district. States they were there for 3 or 4 weeks and that as he was always available he was carrying dispatches to and from them. Took part in 25 to 30 raids for arms.

Made buckshot and filled cartridges off and on. States that he was always available he was constantly used for carrying local dispatches.

6th Period.

26th April, Ballylanders Bks. attack armed with a revolver was placed in his house with 6 other Volunteers about 15 or 20 yds. from the Bks. The attack lasted 3 or 4 hours. He fired about 5 or 6 shots. Claims that he knew where the ammunition etc. was kept in the Bks. as he had been intimate with members of the R.I.C., and had access to the Bks. prior to the attack. helped in the removal of the stuff. Was on the run from this.

Carried some dispatches to Kilmallock prior to the attack and on the night of the attack was guarding a man who had been wounded in Kilmallock.

6th July, his father's house was burned.

9th July, armed with a Winchester Rifle, one of a party that attacked 4 R.I.C., who were delivering pensions to ex-R.I.C., men at Elton. He was 2 or 3 yards from the police when they were attacked, fired 10 to 15 shots. The police took cover and returned the fire. 4 of them were captured and disarmed. Emly Ambush; one of a party that attacked a mixed patrol of police and soldiers, was 3 or 4 yards from them. States the fight lasted about 3 hours. 8 of the enemy were captured. 2 escaped. D.O'Hannigan was in charge.

Tthx Rerivar 16th July while with ether armed members of the I.R.A. he was resting in Ballylanders Village, it was reported that the R.I.C., were coming. They got out in the village and exchanged some shots. When they realised that they were surrounded they dumped their arms. He was arrested the same

night, tried and sentenced to 3 years.

Took part in a hunger strike for 96 days.

7th Period.

In jail.

8th Period.

Released in January 1922, from Cork Prison.
Returned to his own district and after some 3 or 4 weeks re-joined the Company and had the usual activities to the end of the Period.

9th Period.

Was in his own area when the Civil War broke out. Carried dispatches and took part in the destruction of Galbally Bks.

Took part in the attack on Bruff-Rockbarton, was armed with a rifle. Prior to this he had been arrested and detained for a week, but released on grounds of ill health.

After the attack et Bruff he was instructed to leave the colass he was in ill health.

Was evading arrested to the end of February.

> Q. When did you join the Vols.? A. 1913.

1st period.

- Q. Were you mobilised in Easter Week? A. Yes.
 - Q. Stood to? A. Yes.

 - Q. No fighting?
 - A. No.
 - Q. You cut communications in preparation for attack?

 - Q. Carried some despatches?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. After 1916 making ammunition?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Is that buckshot?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. That would be done in the night time?

 - Q. Imprisoned for about two weeks in July, 1916?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. What was that for?
 - A. In connection with the activities of Easter Week and for singing seditious songs.

3rd period.

- Q. Raids for arms. Would you have raided many houses for arms in 1917 or the beginning of 1918?

 A. I think about 15 or 20.
- Q. No shooting?
- A. No.
- Q. Have you any references with you?
- Q. What happened at Galbally in 1917?

 A. Three or four chaps locally arrested there for the activities of Easter Week. After the trial, they were being tried in Galbally, they were being escorted from the Courthouse to the prison and there was stuff thrown at the police and there was a baton charge.

4th period.

Q. Making ammunition? A. Yes, buckshot and filling cartridges.

Q. When was that done? A. At night time.

Q. How long was that going on for?

A. Three or four months.

- Q. Pikes, would you have made pikes this period too? A. Yes pikes and bayonets.
- Q. When did you make those?
- A. Partly in the day time and at night.
- Q. Where would the pikes be made?
- A. At the local blacksmiths.
- Q. Would you be available for that work in the day time?
- Q. Three or four months going on?
- A. Three or four days or partly nights of one week and maybe a couple of days and nights another week for three or four months.
- Q. That was the main type of activity in 1918 in addition to your ordinary parades and drills? A. Yes.

5th period.

- Q. Associated with the Knocklong train raid. What had you to do in connection with that?
- The activities in that would be the carrying of despatches.
- Q. To whom would you carry the despatches?
 A. To the officer in charge of the Batt. area where the men were taken after the raid. - men on the run.
- Q. How long were they in your district?
- A. About three or four weeks maybe a little more.
- Q. During that three or four weeks would you have carried many despatches?
- A. I might have taken eight or ten.
- Q. What would be the greatest distance you would carry them? A. From three or four miles.
- d. That would be in connection with moving them from place to place there?
- A. Yes and sending information to their people as regards their whereabouts.
- Q. Did you collect many shotguns in this period?
- A. On an average about 25 or 30.
- Were you carrying despatches other than these despatches where the men were in your area?
- A. Yes, in connection with the general activities of the area.
- Q. Was your brother in charge of the district at that period? A. He would be. Of course the commanding officer round that period would be D. Hannigan.

Q. Were you in touch with Hannigan

- Q. Were you constantly available for despatches?
- A. Yes, at all times.
- Q. You were not working?

- Q. Did you carry them often during 1919?
 A. At that particular time I think the despatches were getting quite a general thing from one area to another.
- Q. Did you carry them once a week?
- A. I often carried them three or four times in the day and other days in the week maybe I would not take any.
- Q. Were you making buckshot and filling cartridges in 1919?
- Q. In the evenings again?
- Q. Now and again you would be doing it in this period?
- Q. It would not be as systematical as in 1918?
- A. No, on and off.

6th period.

- Q. Attack on Ballylanders bks. 26th April. That was your town, was it?
- Yes.
- Q. Were you in this attack?
- Q. What were you armed with?
- A. Revolver.
- Q. How far were you from the bks.?
- A. About 15 or 20 yds.
- Q. How many were in your position?
- A. There were six of us occupying that particular house.
- Q. Whose house was that?
- A. Crowley's our own house.
- Q. Did you fire that night?
- Q. How many shots did you fire roughly?
- A. On an average of about five or six.
- Q. How long did the attack last?
- A. Something round from three or four hrs.
- Q. Did you capture the bks.?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Did you go into the bks. when it was captured? A. Yes.

Q. Helped to remove the stuff?
A. Yes, and located it in the bks.

Q. What do you mean by helping to locate it?
A. I had a general outline of the interior of the buildings and knew where most of the stuff was kept.

Q. How did you know that?

- A. In the early period of the trouble I was more or less intimate with members of the Force and I had accession to the bks. occasionally.
- Q. Kilmallock bks. What were you doing in connection with that?
- A. Principally carrying despatches.
- Q. Was it before or during it?
- A. Before and during it.

- Were you there the night of the attack?

 A. No. I was engaged on the Co. Infirmerary in Limerick minding a man who had been wounded in Ballylanders attackrelieving two more important men for the attack.
- Q. Your father's house was bombed on the 6th July? A. Yes, 6th July 1920.
- Q. Were you able to stay round Kilmallock after that?
 A. No. I was in Limerick for about a week after the attack.

Q. Were you on the run?

- A. Yes after the bombing. I might say I was practically on the run after the attack on the police bks.
- Q. 9th July Ballinahinch ambush, were you in this ambush? A. Yes.
- Q. What were you armed with?
- A. Winchester rifle.
- Q. What did youattack?
- A. A patrol of four police on foot.
- Q. Were they a patrol moving in the district? They were a patrol of police who were carrying pensions to ex-members of the Force to a place adjacent to Ballinahinch.

- Q. How far were you from them when you attacked them? A. Just inside the fence of the road about 2 or 3 yards.

- Q. July 16th, 1920; what happened at Ballylanders on the day of your arrest?
- A. That would be in 1920.

Q. When you were arrested?

A. The place was surrounded by Military and Police and that particular might we had an armed guard on the village, while the remainder were billeted in houses in the village, so sometime after midnight the armed guard gave the alarm that there were police approaching the village.

Q. Did you attack the police? A. Yes.

Q. After that what happened?

- A. After an exchange of shots for a considerable time, we eventually discovered that we were outnumbered and that the making of escape, to fight would have been hopeless thing, so we got back into the houses and dumped arms.
- Q. You were arrested then were you?

A. We were arrested.

Q. Were you tried and sentenced?

A. Yes.

Q. What were you sentenced to?

A. 3 years imprisonment.

7th Period. In jail.

8th Period.

Q. When were you released?

A. The General Amnesty, it would be January 1922.

Q. Where were you released from?

A. Cork Prison.

Q. After returning to your own district then you had the usual drills and parades?

A. Yes, drills and parades.

Q. Until the Civil War broke out is that right?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you able to take part in your Coy's., operations, as soon as you returned?

A. For a short while, I may have been absent say 4 or 5 weeks.

Q. How long were you on hunger strike?

A. 96 days.

Q. Were you able to pull up in 6 weeks?

- A. We had pulled up considerably before we were released at all. We were in the hospital part of the prison for quite a number of months after the hunger strike
- Q. When did the hunger strike end; about November? A. Yes.

Q. After Terence McSwiney?

A. Yes.

Q. You were in hospital and you were really recovered before you came out; there was not very much hindrance to your resuming?

A. No.

9th Period.

Q. You were in your own area when the Civil War broke out is that right?

A. Yes.

Q. After Kilmallock and the destruction of Galbally what happened?

A. There were a couple of further engagements after the attack on Kilmall ock, I was in the attack on Bruff and Rockbarton.

Q. When would these be?

- A. It would be 2 or 3 days following the attack on Kilmallock.
- Q. What were you armed with in those days? A. A rifle.
- Q. Bruff and Rockbarton are they the same place? A. Yes, one and the same place, there were two Bks.
- Q. The attack took place on the same day did it? A. Yes.
- Q. How long did the fight last at Bruff?
 A. Up to the time I was there, it would have been on about 3 hours.
- Q. Had you any other fight after that?
 A. No, I think, that about finished my activities. I was sent back from the col. after 3 or 4 hours fighting in Bruff on account of ill health.
- Q. You had no further activity after that? A. No further activity.
- Q. Is there anything else you would like to tell us about your service?

A. There is no more, I think. That is about all.

- Q. You were never captured by the Free State were you? A. Yes, I was arrested on one occasion it would be around 19th August 1922, I think. Of course, I was only detained for a short time. I was taken to the Courthouse in Mitchelstown, they kept me about a week. I was released unconditionally.
- Q. Whey did they let you out? A. On account of health reasons.
- Q. Was it after that that the attack took place? A. Yes, after that.
- Q. Up to the attack on Bruff; were you full time Vol col. man? A. Yes.
- Q. You were not on the run after you came back from the col. were you avoiding arrest?
 A. I was principally on the move all the time.

Q. How long did that persist?

A. It would be up to about the end of February 1923. I am sure.
