The Unit Committee desire to point out that the geographical position of the area, (a peninsula adjacent to R.I.C. H.Q. at Union Quay) and the type of people who mainly inhabit it made military activities extremely difficult.

The area was inhabited mainly by wealthy merchants of dork City who were, generally speaking, hostile, and there is abundant evidence in the accompanying list of activities to show that there was constant communication with British Forces.



The following members of the Coy. have been connected with the Mational Movement since before 1916 first with Na Fianna Mireann and later with the I.V. and I.R.A. and have taken part in many activities outside their Coy. activities, cutting the Iron Bars and rescuing prisoners from Cork CourtHouse (Michael Barry and T. O'Shea, Cobh) attack on British Troops.

ated at about 70) surprised a number of members on the 61d Blackrock Road at 7 P.M. The Tans called on the party to halt. Two men, Denis Healy and John Sisk complied with the order and were taken to custody. M. Walsh., J. O'Donovan, P. Hegarty, Richard Barrett, Joseph O'Mahony, J.J. Walsh, succeeded in escaping. When the Tans observed the party escaping they immediately opened fire, wounding J. O'Donovan in the leg. The party were pursued by the Tans from Old Blackrock Rd. to Church Rd., Blackrock xx a distance of 1½ miles. The Black and Tans pursued the escaping party on foot as the route taken could not be traversed by the lorries. At Church Rd. the whole party got clear away with the above mentioned casualty.





Information was received from Batt. I.O. that the presence of Coy. Officers and men on the Old Blackrock Rd. was Conveyed to R.I.C. Headquarters by residents in the district Hills and Youngs and instructions were received that the homes of those people were to be destroyed. The destruction of Hills was first proceeded with but before being completed R.I.C. and Tans arrived causing an abandonment of the attempt. Efforts were renewed the following day and the house competely after the occupants had been removed. The destruction Toungs was next proceeded with, the house being completely destroyed after the occupants were removed.



Raids for and Capture of Arms and Ammunition. Numerous

These operations consisted of a large number of armed raids spread out over 10 days and resulted in the capture of 2 Lee-Enfield Rifles, 8 shot guns and 4 revolvers and a large amount of ammunition. Details 1 Short Webley Revolver and 1 doublebarrelled shot gun secured at Major Daly's, Cleve Hill, Old Blackrock Rd., 1s double barrelled shot gun secured at N. H. Telson's, Ballintemple, 2 Lee Enfield Riffes secured at Major Langtree's R.M., Ballintemple, one Bull-dog Revolver secured at Capt. Marshall's, Ballintemple., one automatic revolver and 200 rounds of ammunition secured at Dobbins, Old Blackrock Rd., one .32 automatic revolver secured at Brown's, Ballinlough Rd., one double barrelled shot gun and 50 cartridges secured at Hobson's, Blackrock., one double barrelled shot gun secured at Major AbBot's, Passage, one double barrelled shot gun secured at Healy's, Temple Hill, Ballintemple, one double barreled shot gun secured at Tiyy's, blackrock., one double barrelled shot gun secured at Stoffer's, Blackrock, and one double barrelled shot gun secured at fraif Gerymn's, Blackrock. Raid on Steamer conveying Military Stores on River Lee.

Information was received that a Steamer was being loaded at Cork City with Military Equipment. It was decided to hold up same, Blackrock Castle being agreed as the most suitable spot for bringing the goods ashore.

Fourteen Lorries and Vans were commandeered and a number of fishing boats were held in readiness. As the velsel approached the fishing boats rowed out to intercept her. She was held up and the work of transferring the goods ashore proceeded with. The work was carried out smoothly, goods being carried ashore in fishing boats, loaded on the waiting lorries and taken to a selected spot for distribution. This operation lasted from 11AM. until 5 P.M. being carried out in full view from a wide distance.

The material captured included Military Boots, Shirts, underwear, medical supplies and equipment. As the last of the lorries was about to leave, scouts were able to report that Military were approaching from the City. The lorries immediately left and had just rounded Blackrock Castle when the Military arrived. The Military raided Morrough's House, occupied by some of our men and opened fire on one man who was escaping. The delay caused enabled the lorries to get away. On the following night the captured material was distributed to various units of the I.R.A.
