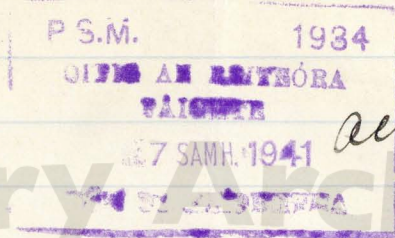

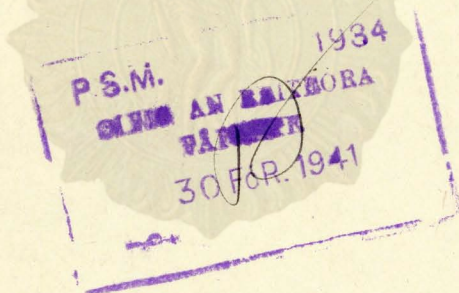

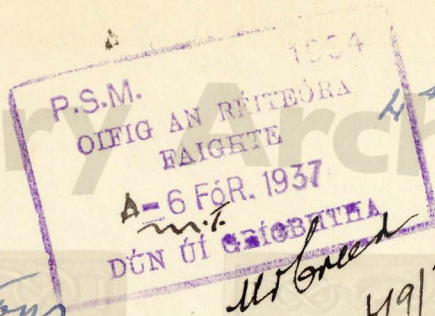

At midnight Sept. 8th 1920, Micheal O Droigneain was to arrive by train from Dublin with a consignment of arms, Grenades, etc., for the attack on the R.I.C. Barracks at Spiddal Co. Galway. Some of the Galway City Coy., were told to be at the station in case of necessity. As there had been a general raid for arms earlier on that night, other volunteers also went to the Railway Station. Redington was in Galway to give advice on the proposed attack on the Barracks. Courtney was to take charge of the arms, etc., on arrival.

After the arrival of the train Krumm the tan was leaving the Station closely followed by a group of volunteers including :- Sean Mulvoy, Tom Redington, Frank O'Dowd, John Turke, Thos. Fahy, - Burke, and Michael Tierney. (Krumm had a revolver in his hand). Members of the group tried to disarm him by grappling with him. The Tan started firing and Mulvoy fell mortally wounded. Then ~~Mixxy~~ O'Dowd stepped in and shot the Tan. Lally, who had *first* arrived at the Station, lifted Mulvoy and carried him to a house in Forster St., assisted by Patrick Mahon. King, who had arrived about this time, went for a Priest, and Lally went for a Doctor. Courtney took the arms etc., and conveyed them later to Connemara.

About six shots were fired.

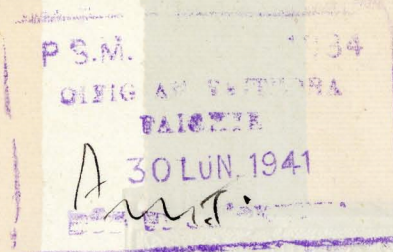
