ACTIVITIES IN CO. MONAGHAN 1920 21.

14th Feb. 1920 - Ballytrain Bks. attacked, explosives used.
Bks. rushed and captured. Lasted 4 hrs. Led by
0. O'Duffy.

9th Aug. 1920 - R.I.C. disarmed near Clones.

lst Jan. 1921 - Police patrol fired on in Ballybay, 1 killed, 3 Wounded, 1 Volunteer killed. A relief party of police turned back being warned of an ambush.

20th Jan. 1921 - Attack on police at Stranooden, 2 killed, 1 wounded. Reprisals.

11th Feb. 1921 - Patrol fired on at Carrickmacross. Two Wounded.

13th Apl. 1921 - Police fired on at Laragh.

28th Apl. 1921 - Ballybay R.I.C. barracks attacked. No casualties.

30th Apl. 1921 - Attacks on Carrickmacross and Castleblaney Bks.
Attempt was made to blow up Carrickmacross with
gelignite put in the fire place next door.

25th May, 1921 - Constable wounded at Annyalla.

31st May, 1921 - Police patrol ambushed at Tullyvarragh between Carrickmacross and Castleblaney. 1 killed.

16th June 1921 - Constable wounded at Ballybay.

1.	Burning of Enemy Barracks and Courthouse at Clontibret, Smithboro, and Middletown. April 1920.
2.	Ambush British Military at Bragan, Co. Monaghan. April 1920.
3.	General Raid for arms in Battalien area on enemy population August 1920. Note: - One I.R.A. man killed and at least three others wounded. Considerable amount of arms captured.
4.	Seizure from Monaghan Courthouse of rate Books under enemy fire. September 1920.
5.	Two raids on trains at Smithboro for enemy mails and enemy employees of the G.N.R. in September 1920 and November 1920.
6.	Two raids on trains at Glaslough In August 1920 and November 1920 for enemy mails and 6.N.R. employees.
7.	Attack on R.I.C. at Monaghan. January 1921. (one wounded)
8.	Ambush of Black and Tans at Strangoden, 22nd Jany 1921(3.killed)
9.	Attack on Police patrol and barracks at Castleblayney. Jany 1921.
10.	Raid for Arms on Ulster Specials &t Annyart, Castleblayney, Feby-21
11.	Disarming of British Forces at Tyholland in February 1921.
12.	Raid of G.N.R. train at Glaslough for enemy employees. March 1921.
13.	Reprisals on enemy population for burning and looting of Catholic property at Rosslea, co. Fermanagh. Armed struggles took place with the enemy population defending their property. March 1921.

which a large consignment was captured. March 1921.

- 4. Capture of hostile workers of train at Newbliss Rly. Station. (August).
- 5. Raid on Mail train at Glaslough Rly. Station. (August)
- 6. General raid for arms; fight at Millars and Crawfords (man killed); fight at Hawthornes. (Hawthorne wounded and two of our men wounded); fight at Fleming's (man killed); fight at Moffett's and Lester's (man wounded). (August and September).
- 7. Attempted ambush in Ballybay (called off by Brigadier when men in position). (November)
- 8. Raid for petrol at Ballybay Railway Station, within a few yards of R.I.C. Barrack. (November.)

- 10. Raid for ammunition at Drumgrole. (December.)
- 11. Ambush in Ballybay (2 enemy killed and others wounded also one of our men wounded). (January.)
- 12. Ambush in Castleblayney. (January)
- 13. Ambush in at Sporthall. (January)
- 14. Fight with Tans and Military at A.S.U. Camp at Garrybawn. (Jany.)
- 15. Raid on Mail train at Doohamlet (march)
