

Some after the Truce in the process of reorganisation in Ballysax, Kilmore, and Kilcullen Companies were transferred to the North Kilmore area.

Immediately after the Truce there was a Brigade Inspection which was carried out by T. O'Connell, and S. Kane, and these figures were compiled from records supplied by the various Company Officers.

These records were kept until the Split, and were from time to time brought up to date on records supplied by the Company Officers, but all records were stolen from Kane's desk at Carlow Military the week after the first banned Convention.

The post-Truce strength of the Brigade reached over 2,500. Several new Companies sprung up in all the Batt. areas, and all the old companies were almost doubled. The Carlow-Brigade Co. - formed to make the Carlow Co. the more easily worked was 110 strong! Carlow Co. was about 100 at this time also.

A Chara,

I am directed by the Referee to refer to your letter of 28th November last enclosing particulars of the Brigade and Battalion Staffs of the Carlow Brigade, I.R.A., and I am to state that in addition to these records particulars of the staffs of the various companies of the Brigade and copies of ~~the~~ Company Rolls for both the 11th July 1921 and the 1st July 1922 are required.

In this connection I am to state that applicants are not summoned until the organisation records of the particular Brigade to which they were attached have been completed to the satisfaction of the Referee.

With a view to having the necessary particulars supplied without delay, it is suggested that a Brigade Council or Committee be established to co-ordinate the work of the other units of the Brigade in the compilation of the necessary records. This Committee should consist, as far as possible, of the former Brigade Staff or Council. Where this is not practicable it is suggested that a meeting be held to which all the available members of the former Brigade Staff and Battalion Commanding (or next senior) officers would be invited to appoint a Committee which would act on behalf of the Brigade and to which communications from this office on matters concerning the Brigade generally might be addressed.

As soon as the Brigade Committee has been established the Secretary should submit at the earliest possible date a detailed report of the meeting held for this purpose indicating the names, addresses and former ranks of -

- (a) those invited to the meeting;
- (b) those who attended;
- (c) the members of the Committee.

On receipt of this report the Secretary will be informed as to the position of the organisation records of the Brigade and of the further assistance his Committee can give.

Apologies regretting inability to attend were received from Sean Hayden, Liam Duffy & Laurence O'Neill.

Brigade Officers were checked up on as to Rank periods of Service Etc from 1917 to Sept 1923, and the Runai was instructed to communicate the following resolution to each Battalion Area.

(2)

" That those who at any time between the date the Brigade was formed and September 1925 and who acted as Battalion Officers in any capacity and now available be called together in each of the Battalion Areas so as to form a Battalion Committee similar to the Brigade Committee already formed.

(1) To elect from amongst themselves two members to act on, and co-operate with the Brigade Committee, and

(2). that they instruct each Coy to hold a meeting for the purpose of compiling rolls of membership of the Companies at the 11th July 1921 and 1st July 1922.

That these instructions be carried out at once in each Battalion Area so as to enable a joint meeting of the Brigade Committee and the two representatives from each Battalion Area to take place not later than 1st August 1936."

The Runai submitted a Map of the Brigade to the meeting showing the Battalion and Company Areas .

A Chara,

I am directed by the Referee to refer to your letter of 16th instant enclosing particulars of a Committee established to assist the Referee in matters concerning the Carlow Brigade (I.R.A.) and I am to enclose herewith for the information of your Committee a summarised statement of the particulars required to complete the organisation records of the Brigade. I am to request that arrangements will be made for the compilation and transmission of these records at the earliest possible date. In this connection I am to state that it would help to avoid subsequent delay in having lists verified if the Brigade Committee can so arrange that the Company Rolls (separate copies of which are required for each of the two dates - 11th July 1921, and 1st July 1922) will be submitted to the respective Battalion Councils for certification as to accuracy and transmission to the Brigade Committee which would, in turn, if satisfied that the lists are correct, certify to that effect and forward them to the above address. A similar procedure might be adopted in the case of lists of Battalion Staffs.

With a view to early consideration of applications from the Brigade I am to request that when submitting these records your Committee will also submit a list of the best cases from the Brigade, i.e., cases in which the Committee are generally satisfied that the applicants in question have had the necessary qualifying service, namely, active service at any time during Easter Week 1916, or continuous active service during either of the following periods - 1st April 1920 to 31st March 1921, or 1st April 1921 to 11th July 1921.

If and when the Referee is satisfied as regards the position of the organisation records of the Brigade, the applicants whose names are so submitted, and whose application forms show a prima facie case for qualifying, will be summoned for examination before the Referee and Advisory Committee at the earliest possible date.
