Dear Sir,

Your letter of the 9th inst. addressed to Mrs. B. Conway, Knocknagrada, Ennistymon, has been handed to me for attention. I regret to say that the addressee died on the 12th inst. so I had the form overleaf of your letter completed and signed by Timothy Conway who is a son of the Deceased Applicant. We cannot however fill the first part of the form as my client did not keep a copy of the Original Application and if you will please refer to same you will get the information required.

Since the death of Michael Conway (killed in action) Mrs. B. Conway has been solely depending on the present Applicant, Timothy Conway. The latter is now responsible for her funeral and Doctor's expenses and considering that she was an invalid for the last twelve years or so, her Doctor's fees will be considerable. Accordingly I submit that the Allowance or Gratuity which would have been paid to Mrs. B. Conway should now be paid to her son, Timothy, to meet the expenses which he has incurred owing to her death.
