7. Were there any special circumstances connected with this case which the Board consider should be taken into consideration by the Minister?

The Board, having considered this case, are of opinion that the applicant was partially dependent on the deceased at the time of his death, and having regard to the special circumstances in the case, recommend that the gratuity of £10 (ten pounds) already awarded be increased to £60 (sixty pounds).
