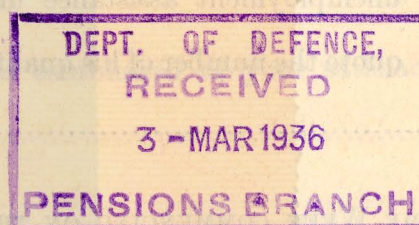

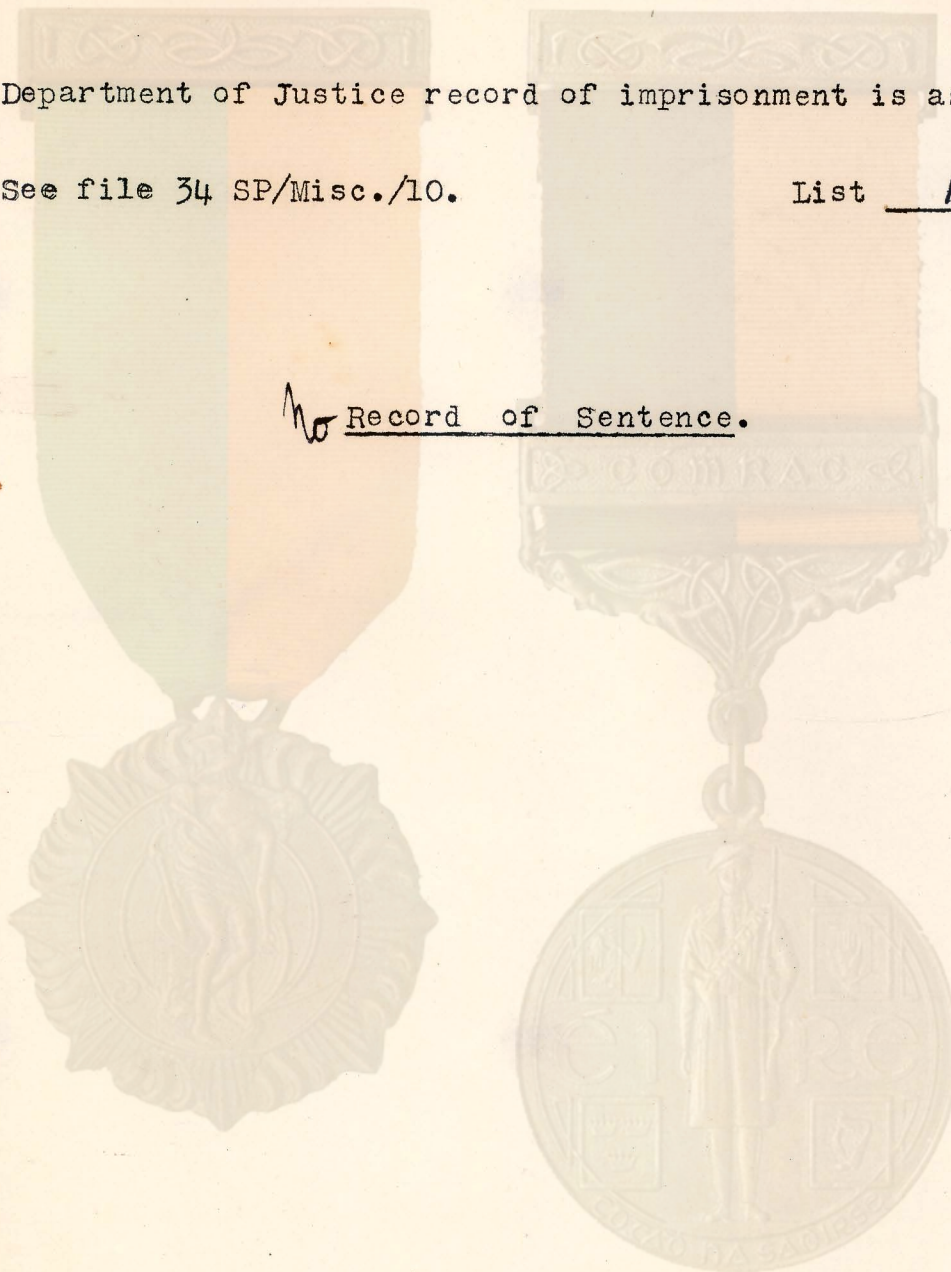

SECTION 14 OF THE MILITARY SERVICE PENSIONS ACT, 1934.

- (b) the Minister is required by the immediately preceding Section to revoke or amend such certificate,

the Minister shall send by registered post, addressed to such person at his last known residence, a notice requiring such person to send such certificate to the Minister within such time after the service of such notice as may be specified in such notice.

- (2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.

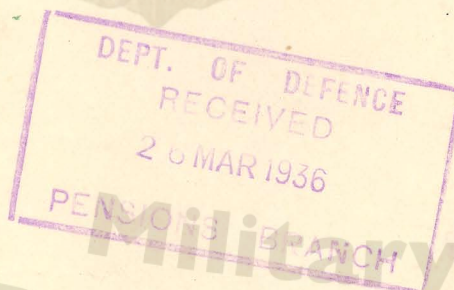

Section 20 (1) of the Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, defines Public Moneys as—“ Any remuneration, pension, or allowance payable out of public moneys, whether provided by the Oireachtas or out of the Central Fund or by means of the poor rate or any other rate imposed by a local authority.”

Extract from Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, Section 19 (1) & (2)—“ If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment.

If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction.”

N.B.—This Certificate is no security whatever for debt. It should be carefully preserved, as it will be of the greatest assistance to you when completing the Pension Warrants, which will be sent to you.

* In the event of the death of the person to whom this Form is addressed, the person who notifies the death to the local Registrar of Deaths should deliver this Form and any other Pension papers held by deceased, to him, and will receive from him the sum of one shilling for so doing.

With reference to your letter of the 25th inst. Ref DP/VR relative to the late James Walsh, I am directed by the Minister for Defence to state that, assuming the date of death to be the 12th February 1957, the balance of pension which is due under the Military Service Pension Act 1934/53 to the estate of the deceased amounts to £2-4-6. This balance will be paid, subject to any deductions which may be necessary in respect of income tax, ~~etc.~~, to the legal personal representative of the deceased on production at this office of Probate of Will or Letters of Administration.

If, however, the deceased died intestate and the value of his ~~estate~~ estate does not exceed £500, Letters of Administration will not be required. The enclosed form of Statutory Declaration should, therefore, be properly completed and returned to this office together with (1) a Registrar's Certificate of Death and (11) the receipted bills for the funeral expenses.

The funeral expenses are a first charge on the estate of a deceased person and receipted bills showing that they have been paid must be forwarded for inspection before payment of the balance can be made.

In the absence of Probate of Will or Letters of Administration the balance is payable to the person who discharges the funeral expenses, and consequently, the receipted funeral bills must bear the full name and address of the person by whom these expenses were paid.

The warrant No. 34/E/1027 dated February 1957, issued to Mr Walsh, should be returned, uncashed, direct to this Department for cancellation.


