ARMY PENSIONS ACT, 1937.

 - (ii) by being accidentally shot by a member of one of the said organisations who was staying in the house of such person and was evading arrest.
- 5. (a) Part II. of the Army Pensions Act, 1932, provided for awards to persons disabled as a result of a wound or disease (provided that, in the case of disease, the disability is not less than 80%) attributable to military service in any of the following organisations:-
 - (i) Oglaigh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army). (iv) Fianna Eireann.

(ii) The Irish Volunteers.

(v) The Hibernian Rifles.

(iii) The Irish Citizen Army.

- (vi) Cumann na mBan.
- (b) The following dependants are eligible to apply in respect of deceased members of the organisations mentioned above, where the death of such members was attributable to military service:-

Widows and children, and (in the absence of widows and/or children) mother, father (over 60 years of age or incapacitated by ill-health), permanently invalided brother or permanently invalided unmarried sister, grandparents, brother under the age of 18, and unmarried sister under the age of 21.

With reference to your Department's minute of the 3rd instant (D.P./9821) regarding Mr. H. C. Mellows, 87 Dún Ceannt, Mount Brown, Dublin, I am directed by the Revenue Commissioners to forward herewith a statement showing the sick leave record of Mr. Mellows while serving in this Office.

Mr. Mellows was informed on the 5th May, 1938, that he had been found incapable, from infirmity of body, of discharging his duties, that his infirmity was likely to be permanent, and that he could not be retained in the Service after 31st May, 1938. Mr. Mellows tendered his resignation on health grounds, which was accepted with effect from the 1st June 1938. He was awarded a superannuation allowance under the Superannuation Act, 1909.

A copy of the final medical certificate submitted by Mr. Mellows is annexed, together with a copy of the Chief Medical Officer's report dated 10th March, 1938.



Dr. J. Comer, Rathdowney, certifies that he treated applicant in Hare Park Camp in 1924 for general weakness and albumineria. Dr. J. Keena, Mountmellick, certifies that he treated applicant on several occasions since 1927 for Nephritis, Dyspepsia and nervous trouble.
