# Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

## APPLICATION TO THE MINISTER FOR DEFENCE FOR A SERVICE CERTIFICATE.

This form must be filled in by every person who seeks a Service Certificate, and must be signed by him, and signature witnessed, on or before the 31st day of December, 1935. In the event of an applicant being unable to write he should affix his mark, such act being witnessed.

NOTE.—Before answering the questions below, the applicant is requested to note that:

(a) This form is divided into three parts. Part I. is to be completed where the applicant had, in addition to the required pre-Truce Service, Service in the Forces in the period commencing the 1st July, 1922. Part II. is to be completed where the applicant's qualifying service in the Forces was pre-Truce only. Only one of those two parts is to be completed by any one applicant. Part III. is of general application and should be completed by all applicants.

(b) Before completing particulars as to rank the applicant should read carefully the First Schedule to the Act and also the definitions of the expressions "first critical date" and "second critical date" which are appended to this form for the information of applicants. He should then complete his replies to the questions in the terms of Rules 1 and 2 of the First Schedule which are applicable to his case, e.g. :—

was "a Battalion Quartermaster whose Battalion was (at the critical date) not less than one hundred in strength," or

was "an officer of Fianna Eireann commanding one hundred members or more."

(c) All statements made in this application will be carefully investigated, and satisfactory evidence must be forthcoming on request to substantiate each and every statement made.

(d) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act, makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds) or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment." (Sec. 19 (1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).



- (e) "If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction." (Sec. 19 (2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

## RULES FOR DETERMINING NOTIONAL GRADES OF RANK IN THE FORCES HELD BY PERSONS SERVING IN THE FORCES.

1.—(1) Any person who at any date was either Chief of Staff, Deputy Chief of Staff, Adjutant General, a Divisional Officer Commanding, or Quartermaster General shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank A.

(2) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
- (b) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

(3) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
- (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
- (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
- (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
- (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
- (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
- (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

(4) A person who at any date—

- (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
- (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
- (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
- (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
- (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
- (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
- (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or



- (j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or
- (k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or
- (m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

(5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely :—

- (a) was at any date an officer, and
- (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

(6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

(7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglagh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say :—

(a) any person who at any date :—

- (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
- (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
- (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say :—

- (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
- (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.

3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say :—

- (a) the appointment held by such person,
- (b) the services performed by such person,
- (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.

4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

#### DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,



The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

- (a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and
- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.

2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—

- (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or
- (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and

the expression "the second critical date" shall be construed as meaning the earliest date in the period between the first critical date in respect of such person, and the 12th day of July, 1921, on which such person held his highest rank in such last-mentioned period in the Forces.

SWORN STATEMENT made by MR. PADDY HOLOHAN on behalf of

ROBERT OMAN (16645) on 10th FEBRUARY, 1936.

1st Period: Q. He participated in general street fighting and the burning of Linen Hall Barracks, and he was arrested under arms on 30th April, 1916?

A. Yes.

Q. He was mobilised on Easter Sunday?

A. Yes. I cannot say anything about his service previous to 1916, but I can about 1916. He was out, and with me, the full period of 1916.

2nd Period: Q. He was arrested 30th April, 1916, and interned till July, 1916?

A. Yes. At that period, they were releasing them every day.

Q. Did he do anything particular in the three weeks before Easter Week?

A. I was enquiring; he was shifting arms from somewhere in Usher's Quay to Blackhall Place in preparation for the Rising.

Q. He would not be doing that more than once?

A. Perhaps not.

3rd Period: Q. He did guard at Tom Ashe's funeral, and protection of arms used by the Firing Party: what was that?

A. He was protecting the Firing Party. We were forbidden at the time to carry arms. The Firing Party was at that funeral, and "G" Company was told off to guard us. There was a squad of men with small arms to march in close proximity in case there would be a burst up, and at Glasnevin we handed over our arms, and these men were responsible for getting them away.

Q. When did he get rank first?

A. He was a Lieutenant under Clancy. Peadar Healy became Captain of "G" Company after 1916, after Laffan, and Bob might have been 2nd Lieutenant. Then on Healy becoming prominent, and getting deported to Oxford, Oman became 1st Lieutenant, and Clancy, as far as I remember, became Captain; Clancy was shifted to G.H.Q., and Oman became Captain then.

Q. That would be 1920?

A. Yes.

4th Period: Q. He did guard at the General Election, and took part in the escape of Robert Barton on the 16.3.1919?

A. He probably was with Clancy at the corner of Nelson Street and Berkeley Road. He would be on the actual job of it.

Q. He was on the General escape at Mountjoy on 29th March, '19?

A. His Company was holding outpost for that around Cross Guns Bridge a fortnight after the escape of Barton.

5th Period: Q. He did armed guard for McGarry at Wolfe Tone Concert, and armed guard on 11.11.1919 at the Mansion House:

A. That would be the Dail Eireann Meeting.



Q. He had raid on mail vans in Dominick Street:

A. That was the time they were collecting the mails. I think he carried out two or three of these jobs.

Q. He did armed guard at the Volunteer Convention in February, 1920, and had raid on "Independent" in December, 1919:

A. That was the big raid, the breaking up of the "Independent" newspaper.

Q. Did he go inside?

A. He probably went inside and helped to smash it up. That was after the fight on Lord French, the time they called Martin Savage a murderer.

Q. He had a raid on the B. & I. in February, 1920: he must have been one of the most active from early on?

A. Yes, he was one of the most active fellows of the lot.

Q. He had a raid on the North Circular Road?

A. Yes. He got four or five rifles there, and some parcels of ammunition at that period.

6th Period: Q. He had a second raid on mails in Dominick Street, purchase of arms, and general street ambushing at North King Street:

A. Yes. He was in one ambush in that area, in his own Company.

Q. What was the date of that ambush in North King Street? Was it January or February, 1921? And Bolton St. ambush:

A. His own Company ambush would be in or about January or February, 1921, in North King Street, and Bolton Street would be in that same period, early 1921.

Q. He had a raid on Kings Inns: was that not in the 5th Period? What date was it? Was it ~~January~~ June, 1920?

A. Oman was a Captain at that period, in June, 1920, because Clancy was gone to Headquarters, when he (Clancy) ~~me~~ carried out that job at Kings Inns.

Q. Oman was Captain before June, 1920?

A. Yes.

Q. Had he a big company? Did he spend much time with his Company?

A. He spent nearly all his time. He had a job in the Gas Company, and Laffan was his boss. Laffan was able to make it easy for him in giving him a list of jobs to go out to repair. He was a gas fitter, and got four or five houses on his list to inspect, and if he did not inspect them, Laffan would not report him.

Q. Was he out on "Bloody" Sunday?

A. No. It is a pitiful case. I am sure he would be able to establish his case for full service. He could not come. He is mentally deranged.

7th Period: Q. He was in the attack on the Custom House in May, 1921?

A. Yes. He was one of Clancy's right-handed men. There would be plenty of things that Oman could have filled in had he been able to.

Q. He would have constant armed patrols from the start?

A. Yes. He would be out with his Company.



Q. Was he with the Company all the time - not with the A.S.U.?

A. No, with his Company.

Q. He had a big Company?

A. I am sure they had over one hundred.

Q. What did he do in the Custom House?

A. He was at the corner of Store Street and Beresford Place. He was right down at it. There were four Companies of my Battalion at the Custom House job, though not actually in the Custom House - as outposts for the safeguarding of the men in the Custom House. The Tans were banging all around them.

8th Period:

Q. He states that from information received from the Company I.O. about the "gang" who held up Mr. McNally, Builder, on Howth Road, that he followed up inquiries, and arrested eight of this crowd who were operating around Dublin, viz. George Collins, Webberley, Denis Merry, Spears, Claude Gunner, Charles Rennie a Scotland Yard man, Kenny, Jimmie Merry, and also the Caretaker of the Soldiers' Home, College Street who was the connecting link for them:

A. Yes. McNally, the Builder, was doing a big job in Fairview, and Simon Donnelly sent out word, and Oman got them all through his intelligence.

Q. He had armed patrols?

A. They would be police patrols.

Q. He had a raid on Harcourt Street Station: was that the burning of Stores?

A. No, this was Harcourt Street Station. I know, for I suspended him for a week. He would not confine himself to his own Area. He was getting me into trouble by going out-side the Battalion Area. If an arms raid was to be done, he would go off, and do it, without permission. I suspended him for a week for that sort of activity - getting me into trouble, ~~and there was a danger of running into another squad, and firing on one another.~~ and there was a danger of running into another squad, and firing on one another.

Q. He raided Fetherston's Hotel in Harcourt Street, a house in Spring Garden Street, and the Soldiers' Home, College St.

A. That was in connection with the round-up of those fellows mentioned in his statement who held up McNally.

Q. Did he do police work?

A. Yes, general police work.

Q. He states he did guard on 46, Parnell Square in Jany.1922: Did his Company take over 46, Parnell Square?

A. During the week's scrapping, we held four or five of the houses.

Q. This is January, 1922?

A. It might be a mistake. They were using No.44, not No.46.

Q. How much of his time would be spent on his job - how much of his time would he be working during the Truce period?

A. He would still be in his job.



Q. Any time off his job, he would be as busy as anything?

A. Yes.

9th Period: Q. He had armed patrols in his Company Area; street fighting in Blackhall Street, Parnell Square, and Capel Street, and he was arrested in September, 1922: was he full-time up to his capture?

A. I cannot really say. He was full-time up to the time I went to gaol, in August, 1922.

Q. He still stayed in his job but would come out to do a job?

A. Up to the time I was arrested he did not resume work in the Gas Company. That meant he was out practically whole-time. It was too dangerous for him to be in his job; they would know where to get him.

Q. Was he planning things, and organising things just the same as of old?

A. He was.

Q. In the Truce period, was he in Camps?

A. Yes, he was in Mulhuddert.

Q. How long was he there?

A. At least, he spent every week-end while the camp lasted. Then he went to an Officers' Camp at Mount Seskin. He would be a full week there whole-time, at Mount Seskin.

Q. He was Company Captain on both dates?

A. Yes.

Q. His Company would be strong?

A. It would be anything between ninety and one hundred. It might go over the one hundred mark. During the Truce period, I am sure it did go well over one hundred.

Q. To whom should his pension be payable?

A. He is in a Mental Hospital since 1923. His eldest child is seventeen or eighteen. There are six children. His wife died a month after he came out of gaol, as a result of starvation. His sister looks after the children. I will make enquiries, and write in before the end of the week with regard to whom ~~money~~ money would be payable.
