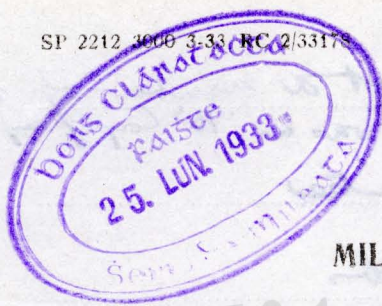


I desire to acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 14th inst., under (Ref.I./RB/1768) in the case of Michael Joseph Phelan, 173, Harold's Cross Road, Dublin.

I regret that I cannot recall to my mind the Volunteer in question, and I am satisfied that during my period as Comdt. of the North Camp Frongoch, there was no period of what might be described as a hunger strike.

Possibly the Volunteer refers to the incident when the R.E. party refused to carry on, when as a consequence, members of that party and myself were subjected to Court Martial by the Camp Comdt., and sentenced to varying terms of confinement on bread and water. With that exception there were no hunger strikes in Frongoch during my term which ended about the end of June when I was transferred to Reading.

There was no period of hunger striking in Knutsford, but during the first fortnight or three weeks, the prisoners generally suffered from hunger owing to the care exercised by the Prison authorities in serving out rations.

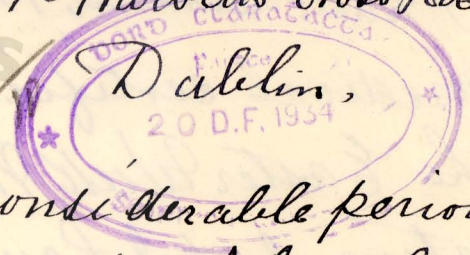

My recollection of the period of such confinement is 72 hours, but in this I may be mistaken.

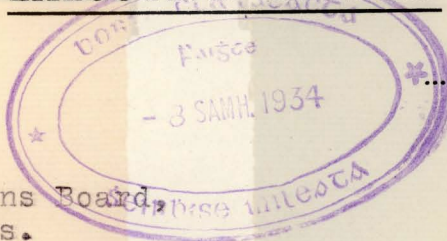


