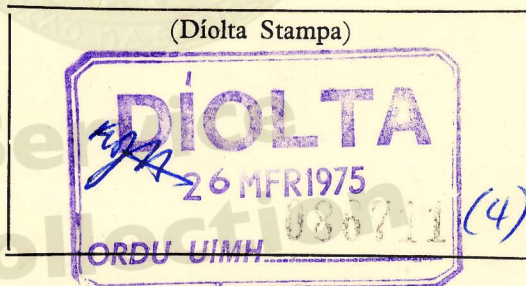

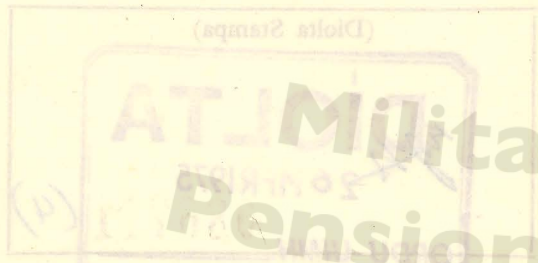

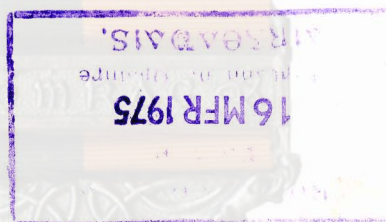

With reference to the pension awarded to you under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, I am directed by the Minister for Defence to state that he is informed that you are also eligible for an award of superannuation under the Superannuation Acts with effect as from the 10th May, 1953, inclusive.

As the same period of time cannot be reckoned for the purpose of both pensions, an adjustment of the amounts of pensions must be made, having regard to the provisions of Section 20(2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

One of two courses is, accordingly, open to you, namely:-

- (a) to retain your military service pension and to receive as from the 10th May, 1953, inclusive, an award of superannuation computed on the appropriate period of civil service, less the overlapping period already reckoned in the computation of the military service pension; in this event your superannuation award would consist of a pension of £522.12.--. (Five hundred and twenty-two pounds and twelve shillings) a year, plus an additional allowance (lump sum) of £1,393.12.--. (One thousand, three hundred and ninety-three pounds and twelve shillings) in addition to your military service pension.
- (b) to surrender your military service pension as from the 10th May, 1953, inclusive, and to receive, from that date, an award of superannuation computed on your appropriate period of civil service but in the calculation of which the overlapping period reckoned for the military service pension is reckoned in the manner specified in the Second Schedule to the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934; in this event your superannuation award would consist of a pension of £536 (Five hundred and thirty-six pounds) a year, plus an additional allowance (lump sum) of £1,608 (One thousand, six hundred and eight pounds) and you would receive no military service pension.

The Minister would be glad if you will indicate in writing your preference as regards the alternatives open to you under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

A copy of Section 20 (2) and (3) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, is enclosed for your guidance.

(3) The expression "period of time" in the immediately preceding sub-section shall, in relation to a person to whom a pension or allowance has been or shall hereafter be granted under Section 5 of the Superannuation and Pensions Act, 1923, as amended by any subsequent enactment include any period whether actual or notional which such person is or shall be entitled to reckon in calculating the amount of such pension or allowance.

I am directed by the Minister for Finance to refer to the minute of 31st May, 1939, from this Department (your reference 34/S.P./22322) which sanctioned the grant of a pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, to Mr. Frank Shouldice, 307 Clontarf Road, Dublin (present address: 4 Hollybrook Park, Clontarf, Dublin).

The pensioner is eligible for an award of superannuation under the Superannuation Acts with effect from the 10th May, 1953, inclusive, in respect of a period of service overlapping the period for which the military service pension was awarded. As the same period of time cannot be reckoned for the purpose of both pensions, an adjustment of the amounts of the pensions must be made having regard to the provisions of Section 20 of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

Two courses are open to Mr. Shouldice, namely:

- (a) to retain his military service pension and to receive as from the 10th May, 1953, inclusive, an award of superannuation computed on the appropriate period of civil service, less the overlapping period already reckoned in the computation of the military service pension; in this event his superannuation award would consist of a pension of £522.12.0 a year, plus an additional allowance (lump sum) of £1,393.12.0, in addition to his military service pension.
- (b) to surrender his military service pension as from the 10th May, 1953, inclusive, and to receive, from that date, an award of superannuation computed on his appropriate period of civil service but in the calculation of which the overlapping period reckoned for the military service pension is reckoned in the manner specified in the Second Schedule to the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934; in this event his superannuation award would consist of a pension of £536.0.0 a year, plus an additional allowance (lump sum) of £1,608.0.0 and he would receive no military service pension.

I am to request that you will be good enough to ask Mr. Shouldice to indicate in writing his preference as respects the alternatives open to him under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

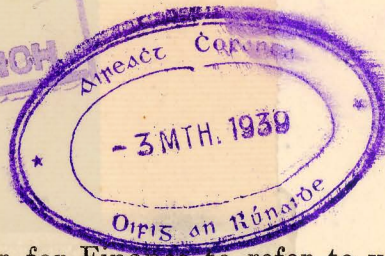

## SECTION 14 OF THE MILITARY SERVICE PENSIONS ACT, 1934.

(1) Where—

(a) a certificate of military service or a service certificate has been issued to any person, and

(b) the Minister is required by the immediately preceding Section to revoke or amend such certificate,

the Minister shall send by registered post, addressed to such person at his last known residence, a notice requiring such person to send such certificate to the Minister within such time after the service of such notice as may be specified in such notice.

(2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.

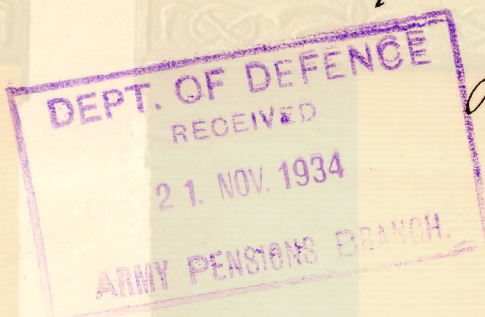
