A Chara,

I am directed by the Minister for Defence to refer to your application for a service certificate under the provisions of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, and to forward herewith the certificate granted as a result of that application.

In connection therewith, I have to inform you that the Referee has reported that the grade of rank held by you on the Second Critical date was grade 'B', and that it was higher than that held on the First Critical date. He has also reported that you were a member of the Irish Volunteer Executive prior to the 11th July, 1921, but as no grade of rank is allotted to membership of the Volunteer Executive in the First Schedule to the Act, the grade of rank appearing on the certificate must necessarily be the grade held by you on the Second Critical date viz. grade 'B'.

For your information, I would like to point out, however, that the rate of pension payable in the case of a person who was a member of the Volunteer Executive is governed by the terms of Paragraph 3 (a) of the Second Schedule of the Act which reads as follows:-

"The amount of a pension payable to a person in respect of whom a service certificate has been issued shall be as follows:-

(a) in case such person was a member of the Irish Volunteer Executive at any time prior to the 11th day of July, 1921, an amount calculated at the rate of twenty-five pounds per annum in respect of every year or part of a year of his pensionable service".

You are requested to acknowledge the receipt of the service certificate on the enclosed form and return the form as soon as possible. An addressed envelope, which need not be stamped, is enclosed for the purpose.

This certificate should be carefully preserved, and in this connection your attention is directed to the terms of Section 14 of the Act, a copy of which is enclosed.

A communication will be sent to you at an early date regarding the granting of a Military Service Pension.

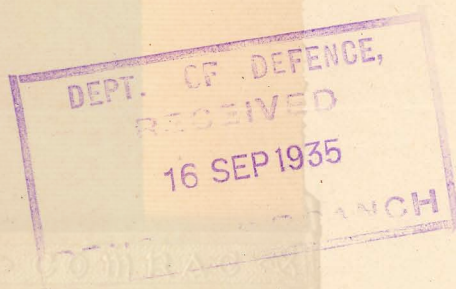

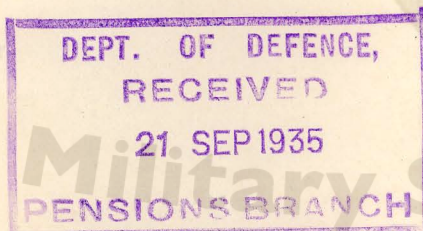

Section 20 (1) of the Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, defines Public Moneys as—“ Any remuneration, pension, or allowance payable out of public moneys, whether provided by the Oireachtas or out of the Central Fund or by means of the poor rate or any other rate imposed by a local authority.”

Extract from Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, Section 19 (1) & (2)—“ If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment.

If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction.”

N.B.—This Certificate is no security whatever for debt. It should be carefully preserved, as it will be of the greatest assistance to you when completing the Pension Warrants, which will be sent to you.

* In the event of the death of the person to whom this Form is addressed, the person who notifies the death to the local Registrar of Deaths should deliver this Form and any other Pension papers held by deceased, to him, and will receive from him the sum of one shilling for so doing.

As your brother died subsequent to that date your claim does not come within the scope of the said Part II, and it is regretted in the circumstances that no action is possible in the matter.
