A Chara,

With reference to your representations on behalf of Mr. Stephen Jordan, Athenry, I am desired by An tAire Cosanta to say that the Army Pensions Acts provide that a special allowance granted to a qualified person shall be an annual sum of such amount as would, when added to the yearly means of that person, not equal or exceed the appropriate annual sum (which varies from £78 to £130 per annum with an addition of £10.8.0d. per annum in respect of each child of that person).

I am to add that no such restriction is applied in the case of wound and disability pensions under the Army Pensions Acts. The statutory time limit for the receipt of an application for a pension in respect of wounds or disability sustained in the period 1916 to 1923 has, however, long since expired and An tAire has no discretionary authority to consider an application made after the expiry of that time limit.
