In answer to your letter to day, regarding my application re-
Army Pensions Act 1932. I wish to state in answer to
Question No. 1, I was imprisoned at Ballydooley 1916, &
afterwards interned at Frongoch till general amnesty, &
during this period, was sent to Wandsworth to be tried,
Question No. 2. After I came home, I began to feel great
discomfort in my head & pains in my back, for which I
was obliged to attend various City Dispensaries.
This state of health did not improve, and I lastly had
to attend at the Dispensary at Peter St. Dublin, and all
my certificates from here, are in possession of the
Irish Amalgamated Insurance Society, Harcourt St. Dublin.

I was 50 years of age, on the Easter Week, 1916,
when I took up arms, & fought in the College of
Dungannon, Daphne's Green & left my home work and
since that time I have been drifting about
penniless & unable to work, so that, if the
Ministry would give my case kind consideration
I would be very grateful, indeed, as I am one
of those, who really is in need of some little
remuneration. I have clearly filled up my
Pensions Form, & sent it in, last November, and
will have never at any time got one penny from
any source.

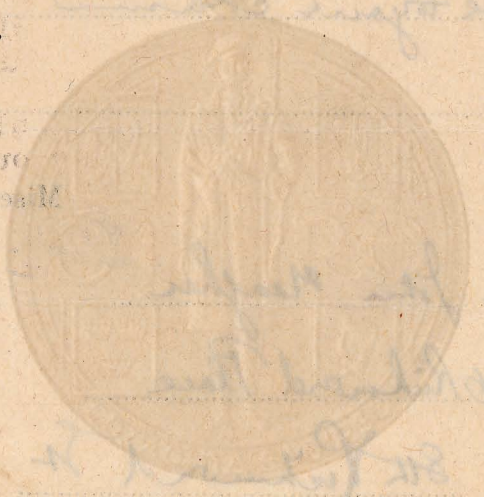
