NOTE.—Before answering the questions below, the applicant is requested to note that :

- (a) This form is divided into three parts. Part I. is to be completed where the applicant had, in addition to the required pre-Truce Service, Service in the Forces in the period commencing the 1st July, 1922. Part II. is to be completed where the applicant's qualifying service in the Forces was pre-Truce only. Only one of those two parts is to be completed by any one applicant. Part III. is of general application and should be completed by all applicants.
- (b) Before completing particulars as to rank the applicant should read carefully the First Schedule to the Act and also the definitions of the expressions "first critical date" and "second critical date" which are appended to this form for the information of applicants. He should then complete his replies to the questions in the terms of Rules 1 and 2 of the First Schedule which are applicable to his case, e.g. :—

- (d) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act, makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds) or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment." (Sec. 19 (1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

- (e) "If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction." (Sec. 19 (2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

1.—(1) Any person who at any date was either Chief of Staff, Deputy Chief of Staff, Adjutant General, a Divisional Officer Commanding, or Quartermaster General shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank A.

(2) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
- (b) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

(3) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
- (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
- (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
- (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
- (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
- (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
- (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

(4) A person who at any date—

- (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
- (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
- (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
- (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
- (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
- (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
- (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or

- (j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or
- (k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or
- (m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

(5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely :—

- (a) was at any date an officer, and
- (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

(6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

(7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglagh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say :—

(a) any person who at any date :—

- (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
- (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
- (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say :—

- (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
- (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.

3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say :—

- (a) the appointment held by such person,
- (b) the services performed by such person,
- (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.

4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

- (a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and
- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.

2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—

- (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or
- (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and

the expression "the second critical date" shall be construed as meaning the earliest date in the period between the first critical date in respect of such person, and the 12th day of July, 1921, on which such person held his highest rank in such last-mentioned period in the Forces.

SWORN STATEMENT BY FREDERICK JOHN BROOKS (NO.8836)

MADE BEFORE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE 1st NOV., 1935.

Q. Are all the statements on your form correct?

A. Yes.

1st Period:

Q. Were you mobilised on the Sunday of Easter Week?

A. I was.

Q. You were standing to?

A. I mobilised for the Sunday it was declared off.

Q. You were called for the Monday?

A. I was mobilised at 5 minutes to 10 by Peadar Clancy.

Q. Where did you go to?

A. I called for a companion and we were to go to the Colmcille Hall and we fell in with Sean Hueston at the top of Temple Street, went with him to Liberty Hall and from that to the Mendicity.

Q. You were stationed in the Mendicity Institute?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you there a whole week?

A. We had to surrender on the Wednesday.

Q. You were a prisoner from Wednesday?

A. A prisoner from that until General Amnesty.

Q. Where did they take you then?

A. Over to Arbour Hill.

Q. When did they release you?

A. We were brought from there to Richmond Barracks for trial and from that to Kilmainham Gaol, sentenced in Kilmainham Gaol and and brought from that to Mountjoy and then shifted to Portland Prison.

Q. What sentence did you get?

A. I was sentenced to death and the sentence was commuted to 3 years

Q. When were you released?

A. At the General Amnesty in June 1917.

2nd Period:

Q. What were you doing for three weeks before Easter Week?

A. We had first aid classes.

Q. You were training in first aid?

A. Yes.

Q. How long?

A. From its inception, I passed examination in 1915.

Q. How long were you training before the Rising?

A. About 6 or 8 months.

Q. Were you training in this class right up to the Rising?

A. Yes.

Q. How many time a week was the class held?

A. I think it was twice a week, Sean Doyle was instructor.

Q. You were released in June 1917?

A. Yes.

Q. What date in June were you released?

A. 17th or 18th June, we were released on Saturday and arrived here on Monday from Pentonville. We were sent on to Pentonville and released from there.

4th Period:

Q. You attended all parades etc?

A. Yes.

Q. Had you any rank at this time?

A. I was a volunteer.

5th Period:

Q. You were guard at grave of Capt. Richard Coleman on day of funeral. On police duty at Croke Park during Football and Hurling matches, &c?

A. Yes.

6th Period:

Q. You were taking part in all actions ordered by your superior Officers. Selling Dail bonds. &c?

A. Yes.

7th Period:

Q. Were you training a first aid class?

A. I was helping the Officer in command.

Q. You helped the Officer that was training the class?

A. Yes.

8th Period:

Q. Guarding Fowler Memorial Hall, Masonic Hall, Molesworth St &c. Were you a regular garrison man in any of these halls or were you only attending occasionally?

A. I attended whenever I was called by my Officer in command.

Q. How much of your time was taken up by the Fowler Hall?

A. I think I was four nights in the Fowler Memorial Hall and in the Masonic Hall Molesworth Street, three nights there in succession. I was there from 7.30 to 10.

Q. Were you there for about a week altogether before you went into Hughes?

A. I was not there all the time, I was sent there at night.

9th Period:

Q. When did you go into Hughes?

A. I went in on Tuesday.

Q. The day before the attack on the Four Courts?

A. The same day the 28th.

Q. How long were you there?

A. I was there until actually bombed out of it, the following Sunday 22nd July, and I went with Holmes and another lad named Thorpe that was wounded first to the Gresham Hotel, and were told we could not be taken in there. We then went to the Mater Hospital.

I was appointed to work on Prisoners Dependants Fund after leaving Hughes.

Q. You dropped out of the fighting then?

A. No fighting then I looked after the prisoners in No.1. area. I was Director of No.1. Prisoners Dependants.

Q. You were engaged on work getting funds for prisoners dependants?

A. Yes.

Q. You had no rank on either critical dates?

A. No I was only a volunteer all the time.

Q. Was Frank Fahy stationed in the Mendicity?

A. No he was in the Four Courts.

Q. You were in his company?

A. I was attached to 'C' Company, 1st Battalion.

Q. He knows you were in the company?

A. Yes he does.

Commandant Hueston was in charge and Balfe was captain.

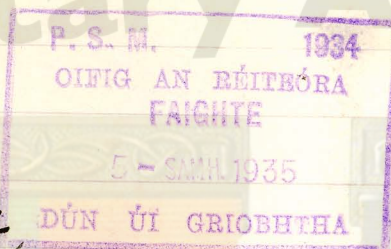

I am not responsible for any such interference, any alteration in my letter, (if such has been done in this way and by him) has been done without my consent, and for the purpose of putting forward a

totally different case than that which he
presented to the Toy Council Committee some
time ago,

My anxiety in the matter is increased
by reason of this possibility

as I am concerned with facts
of which I have personal knowledge, I would
naturally conclude that, where interference
was proved to have been deliberately caused
in this way and referred to above, the purpose
in view was to distort facts in a particular
case, such as this lends itself to be if my
information is correct.

I trust, however, that I am
misinformed.

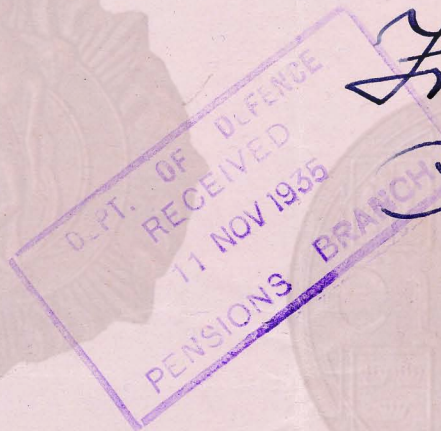

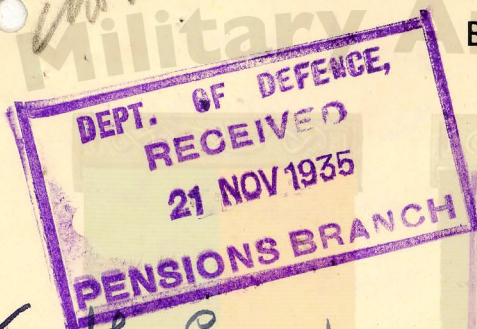

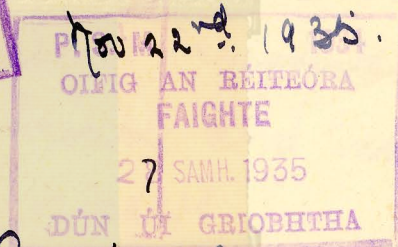
