SECTION 14 OF THE MILITARY SERVICE PENSIONS ACT, 1934.

the Minister shall send by registered post, addressed to such person at his last known residence, a notice requiring such person to send such certificate to the Minister within such time after the service of such notice as may be specified in such notice.

- (2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.





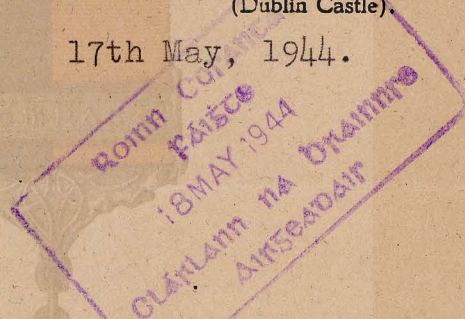

I am directed by the Minister for Finance to refer to your minute (34SP/1084) of the 5th April, 1939, relative to the grant of a pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, to Mr. Joseph Begley, and to state that the pensioner is eligible for an award of superannuation under the Superannuation Acts with effect as from the 3rd November, 1947, inclusive. As the same period of time cannot be reckoned for the purpose of both pensions, an adjustment of the amounts of the pensions must be made having regard to the provisions of Section 20(2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

One of two courses is accordingly open to Mr. Begley, namely:—

- (a) to retain his Military Service pension payable as from the 1st October, 1934, and to receive as from the 3rd November, 1947, an award of superannuation computed on the appropriate period of Civil Service, less the overlapping period of time which has also been reckoned in the computation of his Military Service pension, or
- (b) to surrender his Military Service pension as from the 3rd November, 1947, and to receive, from that date, an award of superannuation computed on his appropriate period of Civil Service but in the calculation of which the overlapping period of time which was reckoned for the purpose of his Military Service pension has been reckoned in the manner specified in the Second Schedule to the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

The amounts of the pensions payable under the alternative courses are shown in the enclosed statement.

Mr. Begley should be asked to indicate in writing his preference as respects the alternatives open to him under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934. The Minister will be glad if you will cause the necessary action to be taken accordingly in your Department and notify him in due course as to what election the pensioner may make.
