The Military Service Pension papers in respect of the application of JOHN McARDLE, 45, Eccles St., Dublin, were, I am informed, sent to you on the 1st. of July.

I think there is a difficulty in the case of ascertaining the last date on which McArdle can be stated to have rendered service.

I know McArdle fairly well - he being connected with the Company in Dublin to which I was originally attached. I understand he was mobilised on the night of the 27th-28th. of June, 1922, by Comdt. Tom Byrne, now Captain of the Guard at Leinster House. He proceeded to Wellington Barracks and after the fighting was over in Dublin he acted as Recruiting Officer along with Ross Mahon - another ex-member of the 1st. Battalion - at Henrietta St Station. He later worked under the supervision of Major-General Jos. McGrath, ex- T.D. . I am unable to say the date on which he severed his connection with the Army but Comdt. Byrne or Major-General McGrath should be in a position to assist. He had been previously employed at the Transport Workers' Union at Liberty Hall and, of course, the books of that Union would



I am writing you to-day regarding the Military Service Pension of JOHN McARDLE, 45, Eccles St., Dublin.

He also made application for a Disability Pension which was refused under your 2/P/97 of the 29th. of June.

I am unable to throw any light on the immediate circumstances under which McARDLE was injured and I do not personally know of anybody who could. McARDLE, however, was an active member of the 1st. Battalion pre-truce, and on occasions did confidential work for the Headquarters Staff at the time. I have a vague recollection that Lt.-General Gearoid O'Sullivan, now Secretary of the Military Service Pensions Dept., Portobello Barracks, would have some information regarding the circumstances under which McARDLE was injured; and whether or not the Volunteer Organisation at the time made arrangements for his medical treatment. My personal recollection of the incident, as reported to me at the time is that he was proceeding from one of our meeting places when he was set upon by a number of soldiers and antagonistic civilians, who knew his Volunteer record, and injured - but I cannot say this from personal knowledge. Comdt. Tom Byrne, now Captain of the Guard at Leinster House may know more about the case, as he was Battalion Comdt. at the time. McARDLE's Company Captain was never in the Army and is not presently available.
