



Section 2(3) of the Military Service Pensions Acts 1924 and 1925

The Minister may in his absolute discretion refuse to issue a certificate of military service to any applicant who shall have, prior to the making of the report by the Board of Assessors, been sentenced by a court of competent jurisdiction in Saorstát Éireann to suffer imprisonment with or without hard labour for any term exceeding three months or any term of penal servitude.

The Board of Assessors have reported in favour of the grant of certificates to the persons mentioned overleaf. With a view to the application of the section quoted above to ^{his} ~~their~~ cases I am to request that you will be so good as to furnish overleaf particulars of any sentences to imprisonment with or without hard labour in excess of three months or to penal servitude for any term passed by any court since the 6th December 1921.







NOTE.—(a) " If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds), or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment."

(b) " If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction."
