Dear Mrs MacDowell,

I am very sorry to learn that you are not feeling well and that things are in such a bad way with you.

Of course I perfectly remember meeting you in Paris in 1926 and helping you to get Mr MacDowell into an hotel and with your travelling arrangements and certainly at the time I understood that he was suffering from severe illness contracted while in prison from which the doctors held out no hope of his recovery. I think you knew at the time yourself that your effort to get him to the South of France was rather a desperate last chance from which there was little hope. I had great admiration for the courage with which you were both bearing the situation and I have no doubt that your husband's early death was due to his services in the National movement.



This is to certify that I was a Prisoner of War at Frongoch Camp (North Wales) with the Late Cecil MacEntee where the Irish Republican Army members were interned.

I understood at the time that he had taken part in the fighting at Boland's Mills with the 3rd Batt.

Irish Volunteers - This can be certified by them.
1921-23. Early in 1921 he was linked up with
the South Co. Dublin Unit Irish Citizens Army, and
the late Capt. Bob de Coeur of the I. C. A. Dublin
in touch with me. He took part in the various
activities of the period. During the Civil War time
he was allotted special duty, and engaged in
the entire period - he was well-known to all
the old Republican Army of importance.

Any further particulars that I can give
 will be submitted - his widow (Mrs. D.)
 is well known among the old Irish-

 of them gave their life-time to the cause

Caral mac Dubgall joined the Citizen Army, South County Dublin Section early in 1920; Serving under Commandant Sean O'Neill, Brighton Gardens, and Captain Paddy O'Brien Alexander Tee, Texmore.

While Caral was a member of the Section, he took part in a raid for arms at Stillorgan, and was on armed duty during the burning of the Custom House in May 1920.

He was one of the Section ordered to report duty, carrying small arms, in O'Connell St; and remained on duty in O'Connell St, Abbey St. and Marlboro St., Area.

He told me, he was asked to

procure maps of Dublin Castle; the inference being its Capture or destruction. He was also asked to supply maps of the Dublin Corporation Sewerage System, to be used as a get-away in case of emergency. I believe his position as Engineer in the Corporation gave him access to all maps of the city. He also took part in the Belfast Trade Boycott during the Black & Tan period. He was available for duty at all and every time.



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
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
