With reference to a letter recently received from Mr. Denis Peelo, Rúnaí, Cumann Óglaigh na Cásga, relative to the payment of your Military Service Pension, I am directed by the Minister for Defence to inform you in reply that as the salary paid to you by the Dublin Corporation in each of the financial years 1934/5, 1935/6, 1936/7, amounted to £204. 12s. Od. per annum, your pension, in accordance with the provisions of Section 20(1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, was subject to an abatement of 30% per annum from 1st October, 1934, the date from which your pension is payable.

Consequently, you were paid at the net rate of £17. 13s. Od. per annum and the total amount due to you for the period 1st October, 1934 to 31st March, 1937, was £44. 2s. 6d. You have actually been paid this amount, a pay warrant having issued to you from this Department on 2nd June, 1937.
