This pension was, however, subject to an abatement of 50% under Section 20(1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, as your brother was employed by the Department of Local Government and Public Health and accordingly the net amount of pension due for the period 1st October, 1934 to the 30th July, 1938 (date of death) was £21. 7. 2. A Payable Order for this amount was issued to you on the 20th ultimo.

NOTE.—(a) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds), or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment."

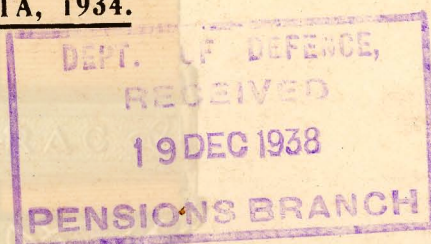
