Dear Sir, In reference to my application for rehearing of my claim, which I made some months ago, I would like to know what further steps has been taken, also since that time I have located a photo, which I am enclosing, taken in the G.P.O. on Easter Week, showing my presence there. After this picture has served its purpose, please return same to Mr. Frank Henderson. I have informed Mr. Henderson that Mr. Dairmuid Lynch also has a copy of this picture in his possession. I am presenting myself to the Irish Consul in New York City for identification. Hope that my case will receive your prompt consideration, I am, very respectfully yours, James Mooney".

I am to enclose herewith the photograph referred to in Mr. Mooney's letter together with a photograph of Mr. Mooney taken in 1934, which has been forwarded for identification purposes.

I am directed by the Minister for Defence to refer to your recent telephonic conversation with an officer of this Department and to your communication of the 17th ultimo (Ref.No.236/191) enclosing a letter from three participants in the 1916 Rising (Séamus McNamara, James Mooney and Samuel P. O'Reilly) applying for 1916/Service Medals. The position in each of their cases is as follows:-

1. Séamus McNamara: being in receipt of a Military Service Pension in respect of service during Easter Week 1916 and the period subsequent thereto, is automatically entitled to both the 1916 and Service Medals which will be issued to him at a later date.

2. Samuel P. O'Reilly: was for the purposes of awarding a 1916 Medal certified by the Referee and Advisory Board set up under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, to have rendered service of a pensionable nature during the Easter Week period 1916. This certification is, however, wholly disassociated from Mr. O'Reilly's application for a Military Service Pension, on which the Referee has not yet reached a decision. Accordingly a 1916 Medal will be issued to Mr. O'Reilly in due course. Should he qualify in his

Military Service Pension claim for a pension in respect of the period subsequent to 1916, a Service Medal will be issued to him when the general distribution of such medals is being made.

3. James Mooney: has applied for a Military Service Pension under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, but as yet the Referee has not issued his report thereon. The question of awarding him a 1916 and/or Service Medal will, therefore, depend on the Referee's report when it is forthcoming. Should the report be favourable a Medal/s will be issued to him for the period/s in respect of which he qualifies.


I am also to point out that it is the practice of this Department to withhold the issue of Medals to holders of Military Service Pensions when the latter are residing overseas unless they or others on their behalf submit a written application to this Department for the Medal/s to which they are automatically entitled. 


