John Faulkner, 90 Capel Street, was a very efficient N.C.O. of "B" Coy., 1st Batt. Dublin Brigade previous to Easter 1916. He was arrested at 19 Phibsboro' Road during that week and sentenced to three years' Penal Servitude, part of which he served in Portland and Lewis Prisons. During his period in Portland he had a bad nervous breakdown, and was over a month in the Hospital of that Prison; he also began to experience a slight deafness, which he attributed to colds contracted in Prison.

All the members of the Coy. noticed a big change in his attitudes on his return from Prison, he being very reserved and at times his powers of reasoning and understanding were badly at fault. This was in marked contrast to his previous condition. He continued, however, to attend Company meetings regularly and, owing to the fact that at times he appeared perfectly normal, no exception was taken to his participation in Company activities. His uncertain condition, however, prevented him from taking part in many "Jobs" during the Black and Tan period.

Not being working in '22, he did guard duty in the Fowler Hall from the time it was taken over till it was attacked. He served through the first week of the Civil War in Fowler Hall, Barry & Hotel and Hammond Hotel. He continued to attend to nompany parades, but as his complaint seemed to be getting worse he got very little active work.

In 1927 he had a bad breakdown and was three months in Richmond Mental Hospital; he was idle for six months after coming out of Hospital. He has been doing light work off and onsince in O'Reilly's, Poolbeg Street. I believe it is only through the goodness of Mr. L. O'Reilly, who was an officer in the Redmondite Volunteers, that he gets this employment.




