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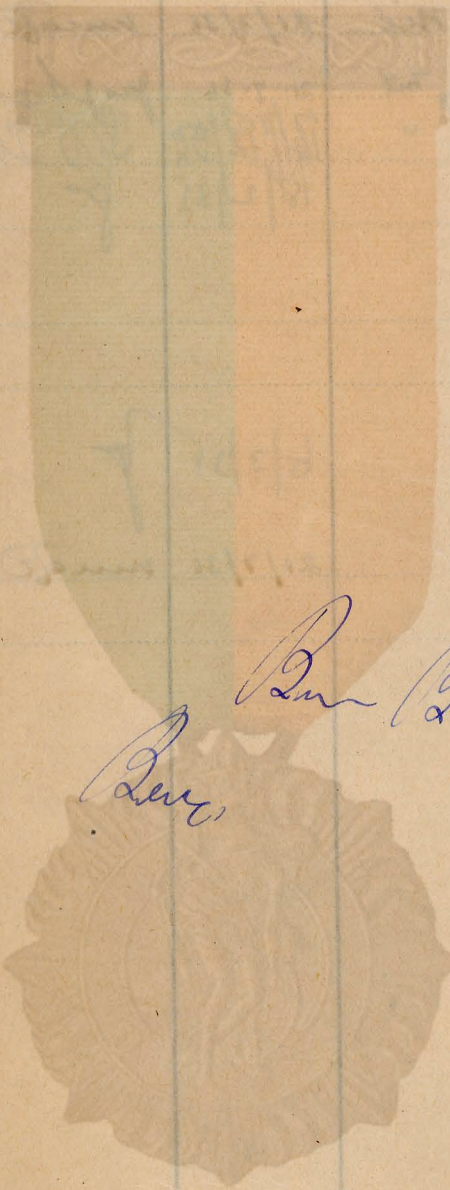

With reference to this Department's letter of the 25th January last, I am directed by the Minister for Defence to state that he is advised that there has been no valid grant of wound pension in your case, because the terms of section 18(2) of the Army Pensions Act, 1932, require that your application for re-consideration of your claim for a wound pension should have been made within 5 years from the date you were awarded the gratuity that is to say before the 27th January, 1948. Your application was not actually received in this Department until the 15th March, 1948, after the time limit had expired. Accordingly, no further payment of wound pension can be made to you and the sum already paid to you from the 19th May, 1948 up to and including the 31st December, 1949 amounting to £50. 15. 10d. must be recovered from your Military Service Pension. Payment of your Military Service Pension must, therefore, be withheld until recovery of the sum of £50. 15. 10 has been effected.

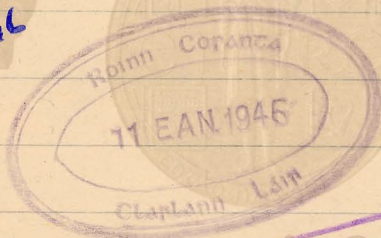



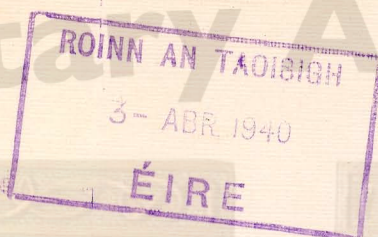
