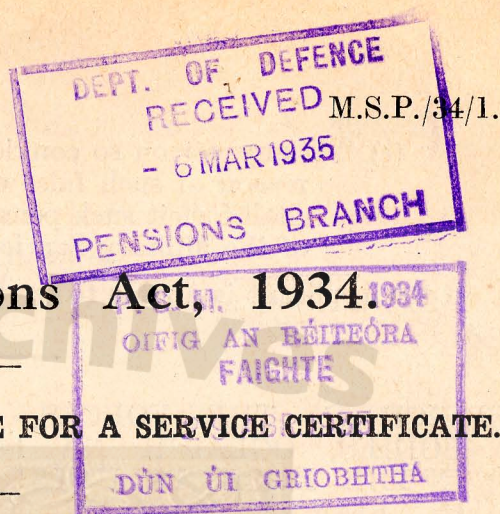

APPLICATION TO THE MINISTER FOR DEFENCE FOR A SERVICE CERTIFICATE.

This form must be filled in by every person who seeks a Service Certificate, and must be signed by him, and signature witnessed, on or before the 31st day of December, 1935. In the event of an applicant being unable to write he should affix his mark, such act being witnessed.

- (a) This form is divided into three parts. Part I. is to be completed where the applicant had, in addition to the required pre-Truce Service, Service in the Forces in the period commencing the 1st July, 1922. Part II. is to be completed where the applicant's qualifying service in the Forces was pre-Truce only. Only one of those two parts is to be completed by any one applicant. Part III. is of general application and should be completed by all applicants.
- (b) Before completing particulars as to rank the applicant should read carefully the First Schedule to the Act and also the definitions of the expressions "first critical date" and "second critical date" which are appended to this form for the information of applicants. He should then complete his replies to the questions in the terms of Rules 1 and 2 of the First Schedule which are applicable to his case, e.g. :—
- was "a Divisional Adjutant" or
 - was "a Battalion Quartermaster whose Battalion was (at the critical date) not less than one hundred in strength," or
 - was "an officer of Fianna Eireann commanding one hundred members or more."

If applicant's case falls within either Rule 3 or Rule 4 of the First Schedule full particulars of the claim as required by those Rules should be given, if necessary, in a separate statement.

- (c) All statements made in this application will be carefully investigated, and satisfactory evidence must be forthcoming on request to substantiate each and every statement made.
- (d) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act, makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds) or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment." (Sec. 19 (1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

- (e) "If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction." (Sec. 19 (2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

If the applicant is unable to read, the above note should be read to him by the witness.

APPENDIX.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

RULES FOR DETERMINING NOTIONAL GRADES OF RANK IN THE FORCES HELD BY PERSONS SERVING IN THE FORCES.

1.—(1) Any person who at any date was either Chief of Staff, Deputy Chief of Staff, Adjutant General, a Divisional Officer Commanding, or Quartermaster General shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank A.

(2) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
- (b) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

(3) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
- (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
- (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
- (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
- (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
- (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
- (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

(4) A person who at any date—

- (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
- (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
- (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
- (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
- (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
- (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
- (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or

- (j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or
- (k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or
- (m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

(5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely :—

- (a) was at any date an officer, and
- (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

(6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

(7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglagh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say :—

(a) any person who at any date :—

- (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
- (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
- (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say :—

- (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
- (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.

3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say :—

- (a) the appointment held by such person,
- (b) the services performed by such person,
- (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.

4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

- (a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and
- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.

2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—

- (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or
- (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and

the expression "the second critical date" shall be construed as meaning the earliest date in the period between the first critical date in respect of such person, and the 12th day of July, 1921, on which such person held his highest rank in such last-mentioned period in the Forces.

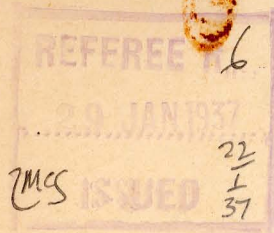

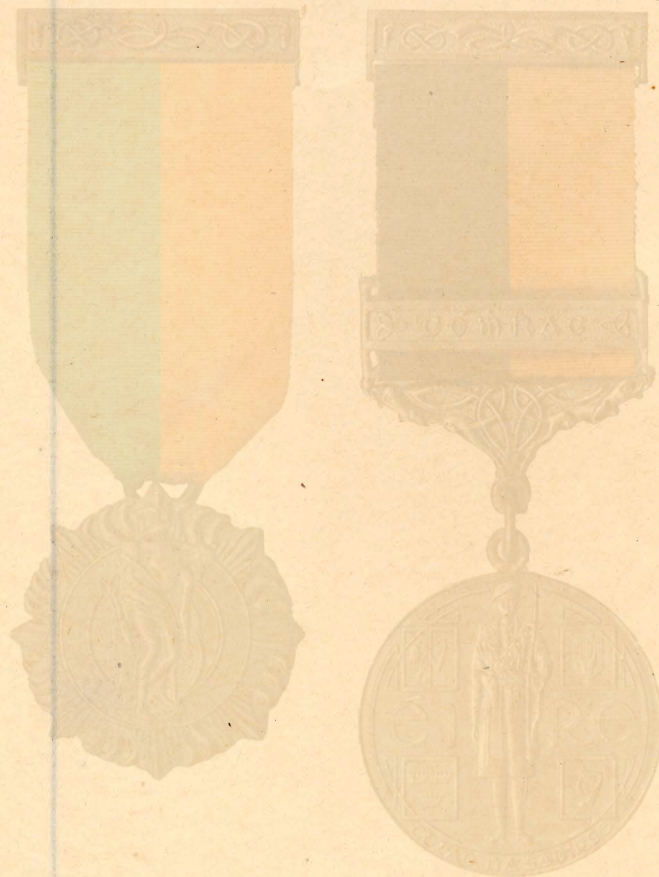

SWORN STATEMENT MADE BEFORE ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY JOSEPH DUNNE ON THE

29. 1. 1937 - NO. 3942.

1st Period

Q. When did you join the Vols.?

A. After the Howth gun running.

Q. Have you any references?

A. Yes.

Q. You were a Vol.?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you mobilised in Easter Week?

A. Yes, on the Saturday I got orders to stand to on the Sunday and I went to Enniscorthy on the Sunday morning with a despatch from Pearse.

Q. Why were you sent there?

A. I was sent to Enniscorthy to James Rafter.

Q. What were you working at?

A. I was a taxi driver.

Q. Did you go by car?

A. I drove the car. I used to do all the transport for the Vols. regarding rifles and that class of thing.

Q. Was it your own car?

A. No, Thompsons Motor Coy. in Pearse Street.

Q. Did you get back to Dublin?

A. Yes.

Q. When?

A. In the early hours of Monday morning.

Q. Were you mobilised again? What happened?

A. On the Monday morning I went over to the garage to await orders.

Q. Was that the arrangement?

A. I had not seen anybody when I came home. I did not get back till 4 o'clock on Monday morning.

Q. And then you went to the Garage?

A. I went to the garage. I did not get any orders there - there was nobody to mobilise me. I was sent on a job up to the Shelbourne Hotel; it was a Mr. Coyle and I went to the Races with him.

Q. Did you go to the Races?

A. Yes, Fairy House.

Q. You were working in Thompson's?

A. Yes. I was working at the time and I was sent there in the course of my work.

Q. What happened then?

A. I returned then. I left my car in Lucan. I heard the British military were commandeering all cars. I left my car in Lucan and came on to Dublin.

Q. You put it into a garage?

A. I put it into the house of the man I was driving. I reported for duty when I came back to Dublin, to Hqrs. in the G.P.O.

Q. Did you go into the G.P.O. then?

A. Yes. I got my uniform and rifle.

Q. From the house?

A. Yes, from my own house.

Q. What time was this on Monday?

A. I could not exactly say.

Q. Had the Lancers come along?

A. The fellows were in the Post Office when I went into it.

Q. Had the Lancers come down towards the Post Office?

A. I was not there at that time; that was in the day time. I was at the Races ~~xxxx~~ and came back.

Q. This was in the evening?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you get into the Post Office then?

A. Yes. I met Mick Collins and he let me into the Post Office and I reported to Tom Clarke.

Q. Were you there all the week?

A. Yes, until the surrender. I surrendered in Moore St.

Q. What happened then? Were you deported?

A. Yes. I went to Stafford and Frongoch. I was there until Christmas in Frongoch.

Q. You were released at Christmas?

A. We were released on Christmas Eve. A lot went home the day before; I waited for the last batch.

Q. Did you sign the garrison roll?

A. I did.

2nd Period

Q. Before Easter Week were you drilling with the Coy. You were in B/Coy.?

A. Yes.

Q. Were you drilling with the Coy. before Easter Week?

A. Yes.

Q. For long?

A. I joined in '14.

Q. And you were drilling all the time with the Coy.?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you have a gun?

A. I had a gun and a revolver. I bought a Lee Enfield rifle and a revolver.

Q. And you were preparing for the Rising?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you attend rifle practice or anything of that kind?

A. Yes. We used to have rifle practice in Father Matthew Park.

Q. After the Rising you came back before Christmas. Was there any organisation when you came back?

A. There was no organisation. We started the O'Daly Club to re-organise the Vols.

Q. Were you using the car for transporting ammunition

before the Rising?

A. Yes. I used to carry all the ammunition and go on raids
I had to do with all the transport of arms and ammunition.

Q. From where?

A. From various places. I started before the Rebellion;
I took it from Hqrs. and Countess Markievicz's place
and brought it to Liberty Hall.

Q. From Hqrs. where?

A. Dawson Street. We had been on raids for arms and ammn.

Q. Did you go on some raids?

A. I did.

Q. Where?

A. The London and North Western Rly. is one I could mention
there were rifles sent to John Redmond at the time and
we went down and took them on a Saturday night from the
London and North Western Rly.

Q. Your taxi was used to bring them away?

A. Yes. We brought them to Seamus Hughes' place in Botanic
Avenue and my own place.

Q. Were some kept in your place?

A. Yes, in my father's stable. We made dumps up in my own
house, in my father's house and my aunt's house.

Q. The Company was re-organised sometime afterwards?

A. Yes.

Q. When? Early in '17?

A. It was early in '17. Daly and I and a few of the boys
kept together; we held meetings in Maurice Collins's
place.

Q. In Parnell St.?

A. Yes. We organised the O'Daly Club; it went under that
heading.

Q. And drilling started after a while?

A. Yes. We managed to get the Tara Hall for drilling.

Q. Did you attend the drilling from that?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you help to re-organise the company?

A. Yes. I helped to re-organise it with the rest of the
boys that were in the Coy. before. We got some new
members into it afterwards of course.

3rd Period

Q. Were you active right through the year '17 with the
Coy.?

A. Yes. I was drilling and helped to collect arms and
that class of thing - whenever we could manage to get
them.

Q. Did you go collecting arms yourself?

A. With others.

Q. Where did you collect arms?

A. There was a man in Fownes St. and he used to get them in.

Q. Lawlor?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you use the taxi?

A. Yes. I used the taxi for all these jobs.

Q. When Lawlor would get in some guns you would go to Lawlor's with the taxi?

A. I would get the order from Willie Cullen.

Q. The transport man?

A. Yes.

Q. Did this happen often?

A. I would not say often.

Q. Two or three times?

A. It would happen 2 or 3 times. Then we would get them through the military too. If they got to hear any of the military had ammunition for sale I would be sent on that job too. I was sent down to the Curragh but unfortunately it did not turn up.

Q. Was it Cullen sent you to the Curragh?

A. It was got through a chap named Lawless or something - I forget the name of the lad I had down at the Curragh. We were sent to a man on the Curragh - to a farmhouse - and he told us he had the ammunition hidden in Maryboro. We went off there and he could not find the stuff. Anyhow we did not get it and we had to come back without it.

Q. Were there any other expeditions of that nature that you remember in that year?

A. I can't say.

Q. You got stuff from Lawlor in Fownes Street and then you went to the Curragh?

A. Yes. It was mostly drilling we were at and re-organising the Company.

Q. You took part in the ^{firing party} ~~parade~~ at Thomas Ashe's funeral?

A. I did.

Q. What kind of a weapon did you have?

A. Not at Thomas Ashe's funeral but at O'Donovan Rossa's funeral. That must be a mistake. I was at Tom Ashe's funeral - our company took part.

Q. You were in the Rossa funeral and Tom Ashe's funeral?

A. Yes.

Q. There is nothing else you want to mention. You dropped out then?

A. After the conscription - about '18. I got a different job. I drove a gentleman then and that took me more or less away from the whole lot. Officially I dropped out. Unofficially I tried to do my best.

Q. You went down the country?

A. Yes, from place to place.

Q. What time in '18?

A. It was about the end of '18.

Q. Were you connected with the company up to then?

A. Yes, all during conscription time.

Q. You left Dublin?

A. Yes. I was in Enniskillen and different places. That was the nature of my work.

Q. You had no connection with the Vols. after that?

A. Officially, no.

Q. Did you have unofficially?

A. I did but nothing to report upon. I just helped them financially and did my best otherwise. I sheltered some lads. I was not an active member after 1918.

Q. How were you able to manage these runs with the motor car when working in Thompsons?

A. At that time taxis were hired from the garage and I used to receive my orders from the I.R.B.

Q. Who would you receive your petrol from?

A. It would be filled up with petrol. I would do it as a job in the ordinary course of events. I always put down fictitious names. If I wanted to do a job I would put down Mr. so and so.

Q. And the bill would be sent to Mr. so and so?

A. No. I would be paid.

Q. Was that how you were sent to Rafter on Easter Sunday?

A. The order I got on Easter Sunday was to go into work as usual and await my orders. On that Sunday morning I was asked to go to Cork or Enniscorthy. I had been in Enniscorthy before and I knew the country better and I knew the men down there so I was sent down with a despatch to James Rafter.

A. I am working in the British and Irish Steam Packet Coy.

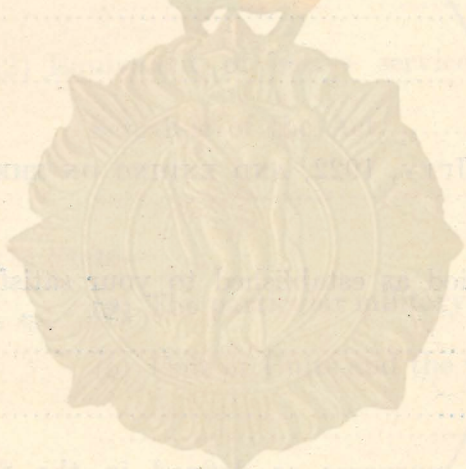
