Sean McLoughlin under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, I am directed by the Minister for Defence to state that the application for the award of Medals was made by Miss Christina McLoughlin who represented that Mr. Sean McLoughlin's death was presumed and accordingly, the application was treated as an application for the posthumous award of medals in respect of your brother's service.

The Military Service Pension Act, 1934 provides for the acceptance of applications made on the prescribed form within the prescribed time and as your brother did not apply in accordance with the Statute and the regulations made thereunder, no further action can be taken in the matter at this stage.
