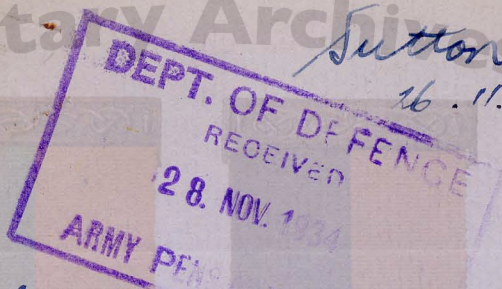

I know it's hard to get through such numbers, seeking same, but as our case is deserving and urgent. I thought you would use your influence, or if not advise us what

to do. I myself am a T. B patient at the ~~present~~ present time, with both lungs affected, this has resulted solely from the time of the trouble, when my husband was on the run and our business was looted and raided every week. At the present time. I am under treatment just trying to live, and prolong my life. My Doctor has ordered me special treatment, which we are not able to afford from my husbands salary. Therefore you can understand how deserving and urgent our case is of immediate consideration, when its a matter of life or death to me.

Doctor Jessop of Sutton will give any proof that

take any interest or advise us,
how to have his case con-
sidered. I will be ever
grateful. I may mention my
husband is Patrick Blinich
of Ballymackree Dundalk

Mountjoy hunger strike
of that year, and went
through the Black & Tan



- (2) If any person upon whom a notice under this Section has been served fails to comply with such notice, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this Section, and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and a further fine not exceeding one pound for every day during which such offence is continued.

Section 20 (1) of the Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, defines Public Moneys as—" Any remuneration, pension, or allowance payable out of public moneys, whether provided by the Oireachtas or out of the Central Fund or by means of the poor rate or any other rate imposed by a local authority."

Extract from Mil. Ser. Pensions Act, 1934, Section 19 (1) & (2)—" If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section, and shall be liable, on summary conviction thereof, to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment.

If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction."

N.B.—This Certificate is no security whatever for debt. It should be carefully preserved, as it will be of the greatest assistance to you when completing the Pension Warrants, which will be sent to you.
