1.—(1) Any person who at any date was either Chief of Staff, Deputy Chief of Staff, Adjutant General, a Divisional Officer Commanding, or Quartermaster General shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank A.

(2) Any person who at any date was either-

0

- (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
- (b) a Brigade, Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

- (3) Any person who at any date was either-
  - (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
  - (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
  - (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
  - (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
  - (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
  - (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
  - (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

- (4) A person who at any date-
  - (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
  - (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
  - (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
  - (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
  - (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
  - (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
  - (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
  - (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
  - (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength or

(j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or

(k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or

(l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or

(m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

- (5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely:
  - (a) was at any date an officer, and
  - (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

- (6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- (7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglaigh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say:-
  - (a) any person who at any date:
    - (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
    - (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
    - (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- 2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say:—
  - (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
  - (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his
- 3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say:—
  - (a) the appointment held by such person,
  - (b) the services performed by such person,
  - (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.
- 4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on

## DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

(a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and

- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.
- 2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—
  - (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916,

SWORN STATEMENT MADE BEFORE THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY SEAN O'HANLON - File No. 974 - 5th DECEMBER, 1935. 1st Period. Were you mobilised on Sunday of Easter Week? I was mobilised before it, I was standing to on Sunday all night. Q. What did you do on Monday? We took the transport from 144 Pearse Street. We went into Bolands and we were there the whole week up to the surrender. 2nd Period. What were you doing for the three weeks before Easter Week? I was doing guard in No. 2 Dawson Street. Were you interned after the surrender? Q. Yes. Q. When were you released? I was the last to be released before the general release. I think it was about the end of August or September. Could you find out the date? Q. The chap who had the voucher for us was from Howth. Murphy the Ex T.D. will not give us any information alteget although I did not approach him. 3rd Period. Transporting arms from Island Bridge Barracks - what arms did Q. you get? I brought two rifles under my coat. They were from Plunkett A. Malt Stores, they came from the Barracks. Q. The rest was ordinary routine work? You took part under arms at Tom Ashes funeral? Q. Yes. 4th Period. Armed patrols and defending No. 6 Harcourt Street? Q. I was not in Harcourt Street, I was in the rear of it. What armed patrols had you? Q. The Dail was meeting. We were doing Stephens Green, A. Molesworth Street and around that area. Was that after the defence of No. 6? I could not tell you that. You were mobilised only in connection with Dail meetings? Q. Yes, but we were armed. The orders were if we heard fighting A. to get there at once. How many times were you on that duty? Q. I do not know, I was active all the time. A.

Bob shot the soldier and we had all to make a quick get away. I got billets around the neighbourhood then.

Q. What happaned in Hammond Lane? The Free State had their cookhouse there. It was a case of sniping continuously. We also threw in a couple of Mills bombs.

I am going to vouch for a man who had years more experience than I. I can only speak of him from 1917 and I can safely A. say that he was one of the best trusted men in our Company. He was one of the founders of the Volunteer movement, he was a member of the old I.R.B. Q. What did xxxxxx he do in the way of fighting? He took part in everything that happened in our Company. He was out all during 1916. What were his activities from 1920 onwards? Q. At the latter part of 1920 he was arrested and interned in Ballykinlar. Between 1919 and 1920 he was on armed raids. He was on the Junior Army and Navy Stores raid and on armed raids on houses in Merrion Square for arms and ammunition. Q. Did he got anything? Yes, ammunition and shot guns. He says he was mobilised for Bloody Sunday but he did not Q. take part in it? He was mobilised more as a scout, being a fairly elderly man. A. Q. He was interned and released on the 8th November? A. Yes. 9th Period. Q. What did he do during the Civil War? During the Civil War he took his place as an Intelligence Officer. He was the man who linked up this Government with the members of the other Government who were in power then. He put them in touch with some of the men who were sympathetic with this Government. Q. What help was he to the I.R.A.? His home was open for the column to go in. The arms were in his place and he kept men on the run. Q. What intelligence did he do? He was very useful, he linked up the Brigade with Cross Channel during that period. Was he working on the boats? No, he was guard on Queens Square. A. He stood to for the attack on the North Wall the time the Q. column came down when the troops were going to Cork? A. Yes. Q. He was in the fight on the Railway? A. Q. He was on the Hammond Lane Foundry? Yes. I was not there, I was arrested at that time, but I know for a fact that he was there.

## SWORN STATEMENT MADE BEFORE THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY MICHAEL McCARTHY, 157 MOUNTPLEASANT BUILDINGS, DUBLIN, on behalf of SEAN O'HANLON - No. 974 - 5th DECEMBER, 1935.

- Q. You wish to say something on behalf of Sean O'Hanlon? A. I can vouch for Sean O'Hanlon from 1913.
- Q. He was in Bolands Mill from Monday of Easter Week up to the surrender and he was interned and released sometime in August?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Do you know the date of his release?
- A. It was very late in August, he was in the last or second last batch released from Frongoch. The best guide to the releases is the alphabet, as we were released alphabetically.
- Q. Do you know of his services from 1916?

  A. He came back to the Company, but the Company did not really get started until 1917. He got two kexxx rifles (Howth rifles) in a lane in Queens Square.
- Q. Was that the Island Bridge Malt House?
- Q. He says he got some arms from Island Bridge?

  A. That was late in 1918. The late Chief of Staff in the National Army was a clerk there and we got a lot of stuff out of that place. O'Hanlon and two others went for the stuff.
