Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

- (a) This form is divided into three parts. Part I. is to be completed where the applicant had, in addition to the required pre-Truce Service, Service in the Forces in the period commencing the 1st July, 1922. Part II. is to be completed where the applicant's qualifying service in the Forces was pre-Truce only. Only one of those two parts is to be completed by any one applicant. Part III. is of general application and should be completed by all applicants.
- (b) Before completing particulars as to rank the applicant should read carefully the First Schedule to the Act and also the definitions of the expressions "first critical date" and "second critical date" which are appended to this form for the information of applicants. He should then complete his replies to the questions in the terms of Rules 1 and 2 of the First Schedule which are applicable to his case, e.g. :—

- (c) All statements made in this application will be carefully investigated, and satisfactory evidence must be forthcoming on request to substantiate each and every statement made.
- (d) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act, makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds) or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment." (Sec. 19 (1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

- (e) "If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction." (Sec. 19 (2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

APPENDIX.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

RULES FOR DETERMINING NOTIONAL GRADES OF RANK IN THE FORCES HELD BY PERSONS SERVING IN THE FORCES.

1.—(1) Any person who at any date was either Chief of Staff, Deputy Chief of Staff, Adjutant General, a Divisional Officer Commanding, or Quartermaster General shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank A.

(2) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
- (b) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

(3) Any person who at any date was either—

- (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
- (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
- (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
- (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
- (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
- (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
- (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

(4) A person who at any date—

- (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
- (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
- (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
- (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
- (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
- (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
- (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or

- (j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or
- (k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or
- (m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

(5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely :—

- (a) was at any date an officer, and
- (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

(6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

(7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglagh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say :—

(a) any person who at any date :—

- (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
- (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
- (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.

2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say :—

- (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
- (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.

3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say :—

- (a) the appointment held by such person,
- (b) the services performed by such person,
- (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.

4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means :—

- (a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and
- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.

2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either :—


- (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or
- (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and

the expression "the second critical date" shall be construed as meaning the earliest date in the period between the first critical date in respect of such person, and the 12th day of July, 1921, on which such person held his highest rank in such last-mentioned period in the Forces.





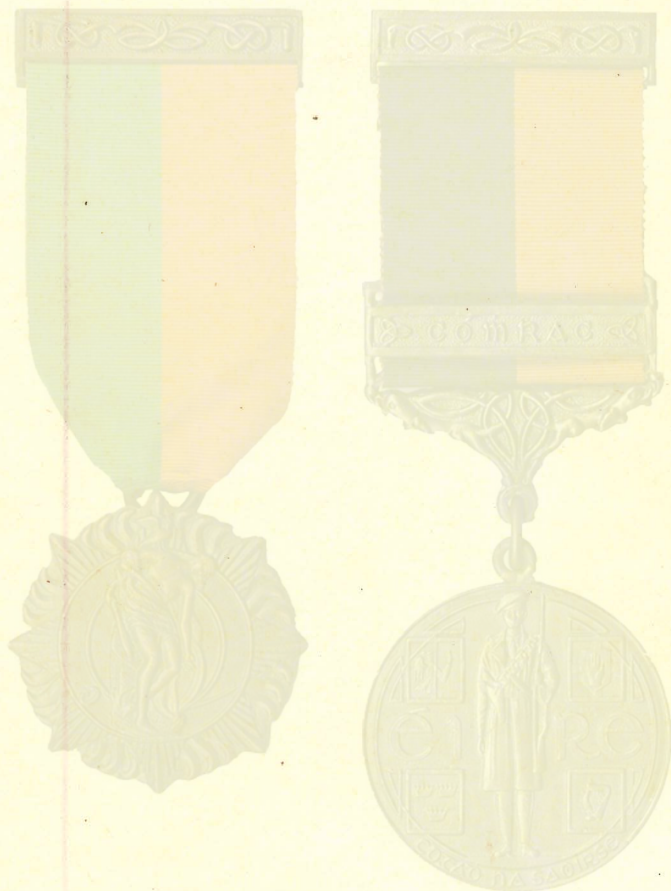

SWORN STATEMENT made before THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE on
29.1.1937, by HENRY MANNING. File No. 9996.

Q. When did you join the Volunteers?

A. At the inception, at the Rotunda. I continued up to 1922. I was a Volunteer all the time.

Q. Were you mobilised in Easter Week?

A. Yes. I was mobilised on Friday, 21st instant, by John Tobin, at Hardwick Street, and I was sent by him to Mr. Martin Conlon's house, in Cabra Park, as armed guard over Mr. Bulmer Hobson, who was detained there. I remained from three on Friday evening till 2 p.m. on Saturday. I was relieved then, and I went home, and had a sleep, so I got no mobilisation from the Company. I went on duty at the Railway and reported that my sister had met with an accident. I have written to Tobin since, and he has not replied.

Q. You went into work when?

A. On Sunday morning, at the Broadstone. I was a Checker on the Railway. Then I was there on duty on the railway on Monday. I stood to most of the time on Sunday evening awaiting orders - I never left the house. I went on duty on Monday morning and as the last special left for Fairyhouse I heard the shots, and I left, and came home. John Lynch and I found that Captain Weafer was loading ammunition in his house in the North Circular Road, and our instructions were to join up with the nearest crowd if we could not get in touch with our own. He lived near the Richmond Street Schools. We joined with him, and proceeded to the Post Office, where we were ordered by him to take up positions in Reeces, the Jewellers.

Q. This was on Monday?

A. Yes. We remained there till we had to evacuate.

Q. When did you evacuate Reeces?

A. On the Wednesday, I think, or on the Tuesday evening. Weafer had been killed before we evacuated it. We got instructions from the Post Office to evacuate the building, and take up positions in Clery's. We remained in Clery's till it took fire on the Wednesday night, and Captain Brennan Whitmore was in charge there. I have not been able to get in touch with him. We had to clear out then at the fire, between Wednesday night and Thursday morning, to the best of my knowledge. I, with two others, had to take five girls and put them into the Parochial house in Marlborough Street.

Q. Who were the girls?

A. Two were servants who were locked up in the Hotel, and could not get away. Then we made a dash across to Waterford Street, in the pitch dark. There were machine-guns pelting down from the top. When we were close to O'Connell Street, the Military opened fire, and I was ~~xxx~~ bowled over.

Q. You were wounded?

A. Yes, in the foot. Noel Lemass was with me this time. He was wounded there too. We were dragged in then to one of the houses.

Q. Were you armed this time?

A. Yes, fully armed, with a rifle and automatic, and all. Next morning the British Military came round, and smashed in the doors and took us down to the Custom House, and I remained there in the yard till the Saturday, and I became practically unconscious. Later my bandage was torn off, and that put me out altogether. I was taken to Mercer's Hospital. I think it was the Monday I was taken out of that, and put in the Castle Hospital. I developed pneumonia as well. I think it was July that I was moved out of that to Kilmainham, and then to Frongoch. I was taken to London before the Medical Board, and back to Frongoch, and was released some time in July, I think.

Q. Harry Colley says you were released in August?

A. It was the latter end of July or some time in August, 1916.

Q. Did you sign the G.P.O. Garrison Roll?

A. Yes.

2nd Period:

Q. Were you drilling and training with the Company?

A. Yes.

Q. You had arms?

A. Yes; I had two rifles and an automatic. I had them stored in the house. Whenever I would get a chance on the Railway I took them from the British Military and would hand them over.

Q. Were you having rifle practice also?

A. Yes, in Fairview Park, and various other places.

Q. Were you in the Howth gun-running?

A. Yes. I was in the unloading of the guns. Sean Bermingham was with me.

Q. After your release there was no activity?

A. I was crippled for two years. I had to ~~keep~~^{get} my foot stretched, in the Mater. I was wounded in the instep; ~~xxxxxxxxxxxx~~ I had to wear a steel boot.

Q. What happened then?

A. I was then appointed, by Captain Sean Flood, deceased, as Caretaker of the Sean McDermott Club. The boys used come there and train.

Q. When was that?

A. Some time at the latter end of 1917, or early in 1918.

Q. This place was a cover?

A. Yes.

Q. It was used for drilling, and meetings, and so on?

A. Yes. It was at Margaret Place, N.C.R.

Q. You were incapacitated as a result of your wounds: what would be the nature of your activities from that on?

A. I attended various mobilisations, but I was generally left out of any big job. I was on election work, doing impersonation agent, etc.

3rd Period:

Q. You were sent to South Armagh?

A. Yes, I was doing police duty up there, in Newtown-hamilton, fully armed. Harry Boland was in charge.

4th Period:

Q. You were doing Election work in Dublin?

A. Yes, at the General Election. I was Personation Agent for Mulcahy, and did armed guard at Green Street, on the ballot boxes.

5th Period:

Q. Were you attending all the parades of the Company during that time?

A. Yes.

6th Period:

Q. You had a special armed parade in Parnell Square?

A. That was the Kevin Barry thing.

Q. You were mobilised for the Kevin Barry thing?

A. Yes.

Q. It did not come off?

A. That was the first time I was handed a job to tackle. I was given hand-grenades, for the Kevin Barry release.

Q. You did not take part in Police patrols?

A. I did police duty, and observation work mostly.

Q. You did not take part in armed ~~patrols~~ street patrols?

A. No; it was observation work mostly, and police duty. I did police duty at Croke Park.

Q. Did your wound affect you?

A. Yes. Even now I could not run. The fore part of the foot will not bend properly.

Q. Did you ever claim Disability Pension?

A. Yes, in 1924. I got £150. It is on my papers.

Q. You did not ever come in contact with the British again?

A. No; I had no actual fighting.

Q. You collected for the arms fund?

A. Yes, and I was organising Concerts, with others, in the Rotunda, towards the Armistice.

Q. You paraded with the company?

A. Yes.

Q. You helped with the Dependants' Fund?

A. Yes.

Q. As regards collection of the Dependants' Fund, you did what any Volunteer would do?

A. Yes.

Q. And you were organising functions?
A. Yes.

8th Period:

Q. You say you had two concerts in aid of Arms Fund?
A. Yes.

Q. You were armed guard at the Fish Market, and the Fowler Hall?
A. Yes.

Q. Did you go into garrison at the Fowler Hall?
A. Yes; I was there Saturday night and all Sunday, night and day.

Q. Were you in camp?
A. No.

Q. Were you there when the Free State forces came along?
A. No; I was there at the taking over of the Hall. I was in the front hall of the building

Q. What happened at the Fish Market?
A. I do not know, something about cars. I was patrolling up and down.

Q. Was there a post there?
A. There was something about cars.

Q. Commandeering cars?
A. That is what I understood.

Q. ~~There were cars there~~ You were under arms there?
A. Yes.

Q. Was this during the Truce?
A. I cannot rightly remember.

Q. Did you fill in your Form yourself?
A. Yes. I only consulted Captain Prendergast.

Q. You took no part in the Fighting in the Civil War?
A. No.

Q. Is there anything else you want to mention?
A. On the Friday and Saturday before Easter Week, I had difficulty in getting in touch with Martin Conlon, re the guarding of Bulmer Hobson. He cannot verify the exact time, but will get a certificate from Tobin.
