

The Civic Guard Report states that the applicant is not known to have enjoyed any private income prior to the death of the deceased other than that derived from his farm.

The applicant had been incapacitated through old age for 4 or 5

years prior to the death of deceased.

The applicant is father of the deceased is 65 years of age and unable to work any longer.

The applicant is in possession of one holding of 20 acres of poor land, the Poor Law Valuation of which is £30 and from which he derives all his income.

The only surviving children of applicant are one boy aged 17 and two girls aged 16 and 14 respectively. The boy helps on the farm; but is not yet strong enough to take complete charge, necessitating hiring of paid labour by the applicant. The elde of the girls acts as housekeeper, the younger girl is still attending school. None of the children are otherwise employed, The eldest do not contribute towards upkeep of applicant, excepting the help outlined above.

Before joining National Army deceased worked permanently on the applicant's farm, and supplemented the family income for six months of the year by 30/- per week out of his earnings with horse and cart on Co. Council work, which were 48/- per week. Deceased was the main breadwinner of the family and his death has been a big

loss to the applicant (who is a widower).
