Dear Sir/

I have been directed by Mr Denis J Murphy Ballydaly Co.Cork and his wife Mrs Kate Murphy of same address to write you on the following matter. Thier son Cors Murphy was arrested by the British Authorities at Ballydaly Co.Cork on 4th Jany 1921 on a charge of having a revolver in his possession, and was taken to the then Victoria Barracks at Cork. On 1st Feby 1921 he was executed at Victoria Barracks Cork, apparently having been tried by Court-Martial on said charge, and sentenced.

His father and mother were dependent on him, and he contributed about £30 a year out of his earnings towards their support and maintenance. They are informed that they are entitled to pensions in respect of his death, and were advised to put their claims before you for consideration.

Kindly let me know if they are entitled to pensions, and if so to what extent, and what course they have to adopt to get same.

Sec. 23.—Every Superintendent Registrar and Registrar respectively shall be entitled to the fees specified in the Second Schedule to this Act, and every such fee shall be paid to him by the persons and on the occasions pointed out in such Schedule, and may be recovered as a debt due to him, and, subject to the prescribed rules, he may refuse to comply with any application voluntarily made to him until the fee is paid.

Sec. 25. ***—Subject to such regulations as shall be made from time to time by the Registrar-General, with the approval of the Lord Lieutenant, every person shall be entitled at all reasonable times to search the said indexes, and also the register books, and to have a certified copy of any entry or entries in any register book, under the hand of the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar, as the case may be, who shall have the custody of the same for the time being, on payment in each case of the appointed fee in addition to the stamp duty of one penny imposed by the Act of the Session held in the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter ninety-seven.*

N.B.—This Form is only to be used in giving a Certified Copy of an Entry in the Register Book, under the provisions of the 43 and 44 Vic., Cap. 13, Sec. 25.

* This Duty was re-imposed by the 54 and 55 Vic., Cap. 39 (Stamp Act, 1891).

Sec. 32.—In the principal Act and this Act—
The term “general search” shall mean a search during any number of successive hours not exceeding six, without stating the object of the search; and
The term “particular search” shall mean a search over any period not exceeding five years for any given entry.

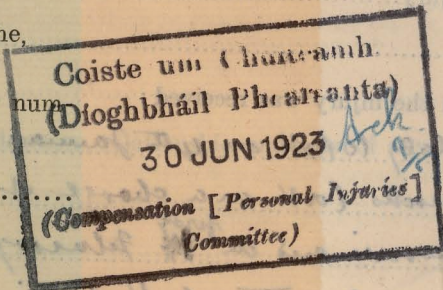
