

In the wenter of 1900 and Sporing of 1921, owing to the heavy losses of officer through arrest and casualties, the perch Gleadquesters gave orders that no officers were to take unnecessary risks. and as a result the full brunt of the dangerous work. fell to lot of the section commander. So hard pressed

was I at times with work, that I had to rely on my young brother who was then a school hay and my pisters to help me in many of my requear volunteer I have no desire to quiter into any argument as to how active service should be interpeted, but I do say that as far as my ease was concerned, the year 19 april 1920 to Warsh 1921 was one of sustained remorseless active services I know no pest, and can pay without any healtalion or doubt, that I was under arms for the entire period. In asking for a review of my case, I need only state that I am seeking only what is due to me, and that I have just plated is straight and honourable. - You might alter your views about dates or something like that?
- As far as the dates are concerned I have to depend on form I A. sent up I filled them up at company meetings.
- Your form was verified?
- Yes by captain.

- A. No it was the London North Western.
- There was a big party on your side?
- Yes there was it was a battalion job.

Who was in charge? Comdt. Tom Ennis. Have you any references with you? I believe Paddy McMahon was to sent on a reference, I will see Comdt. Kilcoyne in connection with them. A. (Applicant hands in reference from Pat Sweeney). Will you ask Paddy McMahon and Kilcoyne to send us on statements of your activities? Yes, you should have a statement from Paddy McMahon to day, A. Kilcoyne promised to send in a blank statement for 14 men instead of submitting 14 different statements whether that would carry any weight or not. It depends on the way he covers each case.

If it would help I will submit a list as far as I can recall. Q. He can cover your activities up to the Truce? He can. Get him to do that he should particularise the operations you were in that is all we want to verify what you will tell us? He is the only man who can really do it.

There was a series of small raids for supplies in that period, raid on Dublin Dockyard.

You had several raids for supplies? Q. A

Yes.

Petrols and tools? 60

Yes. A

What was the raid in Dublin Dockyard? 0.

- For general equipment not really for our own company but for some particular job that was coming off. Cars were seized in that period petrol and timber supplies for to build dumps. In that period the dumps were moved.
- Q. You mean you were on all those yourself? I was I called that ordinary incidental work it took up a lot of time.
- You were engaged in construction of dumps? Yes dumps had to be moved quite often on account of military raids. A.
- That is all you want to mention up to March 1921? 0. A. Yes.

- (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
- (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or

- (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
- (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
- (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
- (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
- (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

 - (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or

(j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or

(k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or

(l) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or

(m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

- (5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely:—
 - (a) was at any date an officer, and
 - (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

- (6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- (7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglaigh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say:—
 - (a) any person who at any date:-
 - (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
 - (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
 - (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- 2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say:—
 - (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
 - (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.
- 3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say:—
 - (a) the appointment held by such person,
 - (b) the services performed by such person,
 - (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.
- 4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

- (a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and
- (b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.
- 2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—
 - (a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916,
 - (b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and

the expression "the second critical date" shall be construed as meaning the earliest date in the period between the first critical date in respect of such person, and the 12th day of July, 1921, on which such person held his highest rank in such last-mentioned period in the Forces.
