I beg leave to appeal against the  
Referees decision, in classing me as being  
ineligible for a Service Certificate, you have  
my form already filled in, but in case of  
any mislaying of same, I am appending the  
following facts for your attention and I hope  
approval. I joined the I.R.A in Feb 1918, and  
served in same until Dec 1922, when owing  
to family circumstances I had to resign, during  
that time I was on guard during parade  
nights, and also on guard at the Wolfe Tone  
Commemoration Concert in the Mansion  
House, when Sean McGarry appeared on  
the Platform after escaping from Lincoln  
Gaol. I also had an escape from being



arrested the same night on the way home attempting to rescue Piaras Beasley. My Coy  
Vis. G. Coy 12<sup>th</sup> Bn Dublin Brigade had the duty  
of guarding the Mansion House that night.

I was also on guard duty armed while  
at rifle practice at the quarry in Finglas.  
In November 1920 I was arrested, as also was  
my Father who bears the same Christian name.  
I was interned in Ballykilbar in Dec 1920.  
till Dec 1921, my Father was released before  
Xmas 1920, but was re-arrested when they came  
looking for me in Feb 1921 despite the fact that  
they already had me, while in Ballykilbar  
I had the job of Parcel Office overseer and  
while there I received orders from the  
Camp Commandant viz Joseph McGrath ex T.D.  
to smuggle parcels from under the Customs hose  
which was done. Those parcels contained wire  
clippers etc. and I continued while engaged  
on this work I was on active service.

I wrote the said G. McGrath to verify this in my last claim, but his secretary wrote back a reply which I duly sent on to you, as he was of the opinion that I was one of many who had already written him. I might add that I do not believe that Mr McGrath seen my letter personally. On our way home in Dec 1921 from Ballykilas our train was attacked, and my Father received a serious wound in the leg which necessitated 10 operations. As he was not a member of the I.R.A. he received no pension or any monetary reward, and the job of keeping my mother & him also 3 sisters and young brother fell on my shoulders. I continued to be a member of G. Coy during the civil war and fought in Tylers and Hickley's 11th Earl St from which Place I escaped through Thomas Lane into Marlborough St. Owing to the circumstances stated above I had to resign in Dec 1922. I have received the Service Medal, but am of the opinion that

I am entitled to a service certificate  
I was rejected for the 26<sup>th</sup> Batt. through a  
leg injury, but joined the L.O.F. in 1940  
in which I hold the rank of Coy and Platoon  
"D" Coy H<sup>1</sup><sup>st</sup> Batt. and am still serving in  
same. Trusting you will look up my old  
correspondence in this matter, and also the fact  
that although my father is a cripple for life  
due to my activities, he has not received any  
monetary reward, due to the fact that he  
was not a member of the I.R.A. but owing to  
being of the same Christian name as myself  
the authorities wanted to make sure they had  
the right person. Thanking you  
is mine & me.

In reply to yours of the 23<sup>rd</sup> Jan informing me, that the referee has decided that I am not a fit person to whom the Act applies. I wish to inform you that I do not know on what grounds he so thinks, as I have never been called upon to appear before the Board to state my case. I have tried to state it in writing, and have forwarded my witnesses for proof. I have also the right to demand same, as my Father who was wounded on the way home from Ballinacorney, and is since a cripple, was denied a pension, because he was not a member of the I.R.A. I would point out the fact but for my membership of the I.R.A. he would not have been arrested as we were both of the same Christian name. for reference I would refer you to An Garda Síochána the late speaker of the Dail Professor Hayes. I am prepared if need be to furnish you with further references. But the fact that I have not been



called before the Board. to state my case. seems  
to me. to be just a case of cross of some of  
those names to same time, as I am led to believe  
that the referees were told to finish all claims  
quickly as I pointed out before. from a legal  
point of view I am entitled to a certificate  
and fully intend to pursue with my claim  
until I am informed on what grounds the  
Referee refuses my claim. If he needs proof  
of my being engaged in any action. I have same  
as pointed and written in my first claim viz.  
action in the Hammam Hotel and Lyber Corner in  
1922. In the meantime I am writing to An Lavoie  
and other deputies for their views on my case.

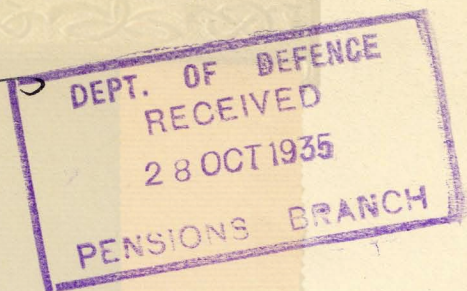
