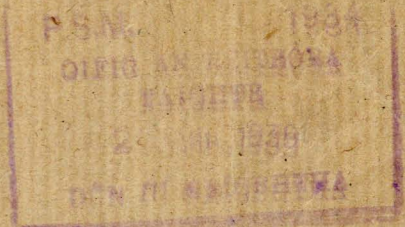
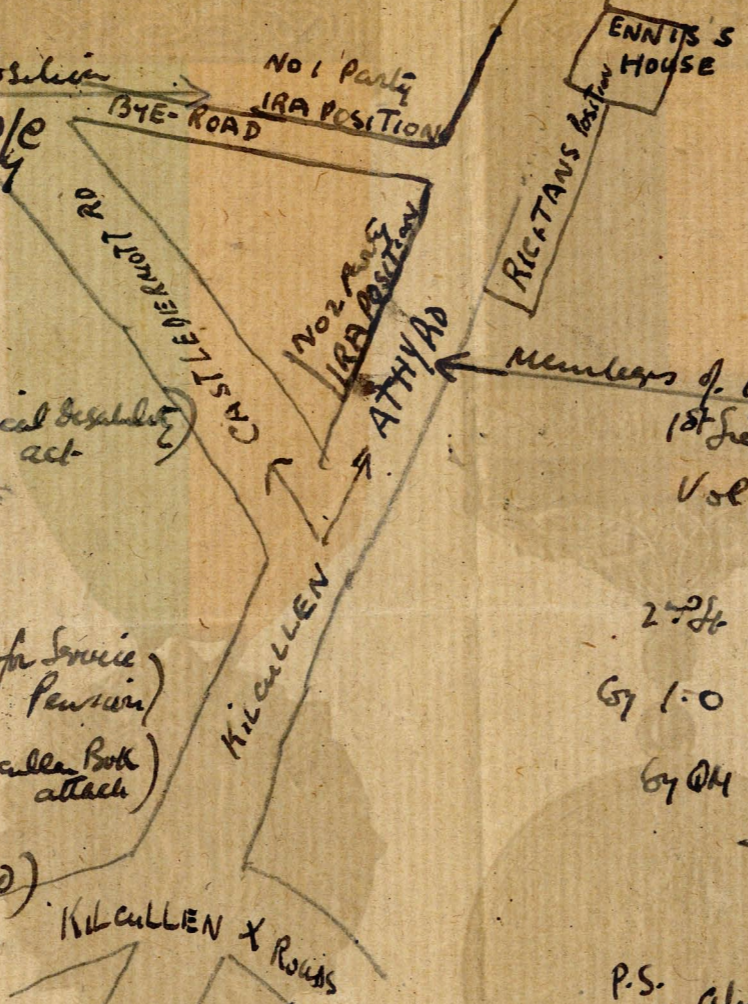

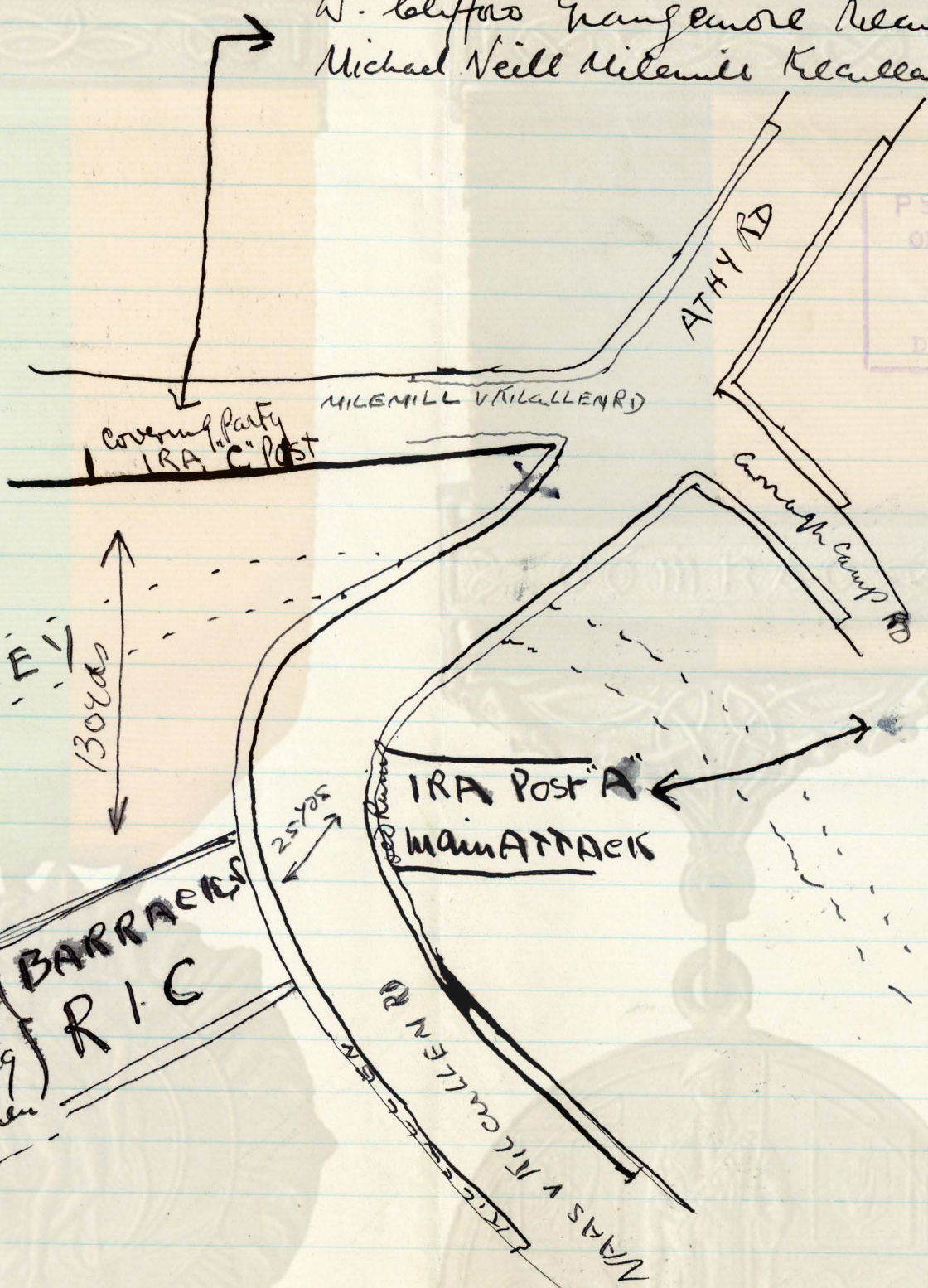

Post B opened the firing and immediately Post A & C ATTACKED and the firing was continued for 15 minutes (approx) the enemy replied to the firing and owing to the close proximity to the Curragh Camp it was considered unwise to Delay the ATTACK, British Reinforcements were soon on the scene after our withdrawal, and large number of Raids took place on every part of the Coy area.

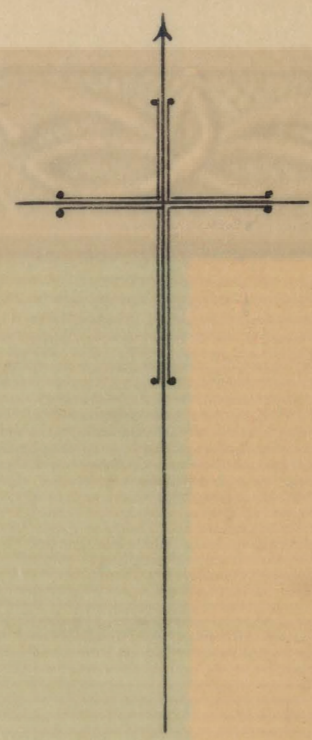
