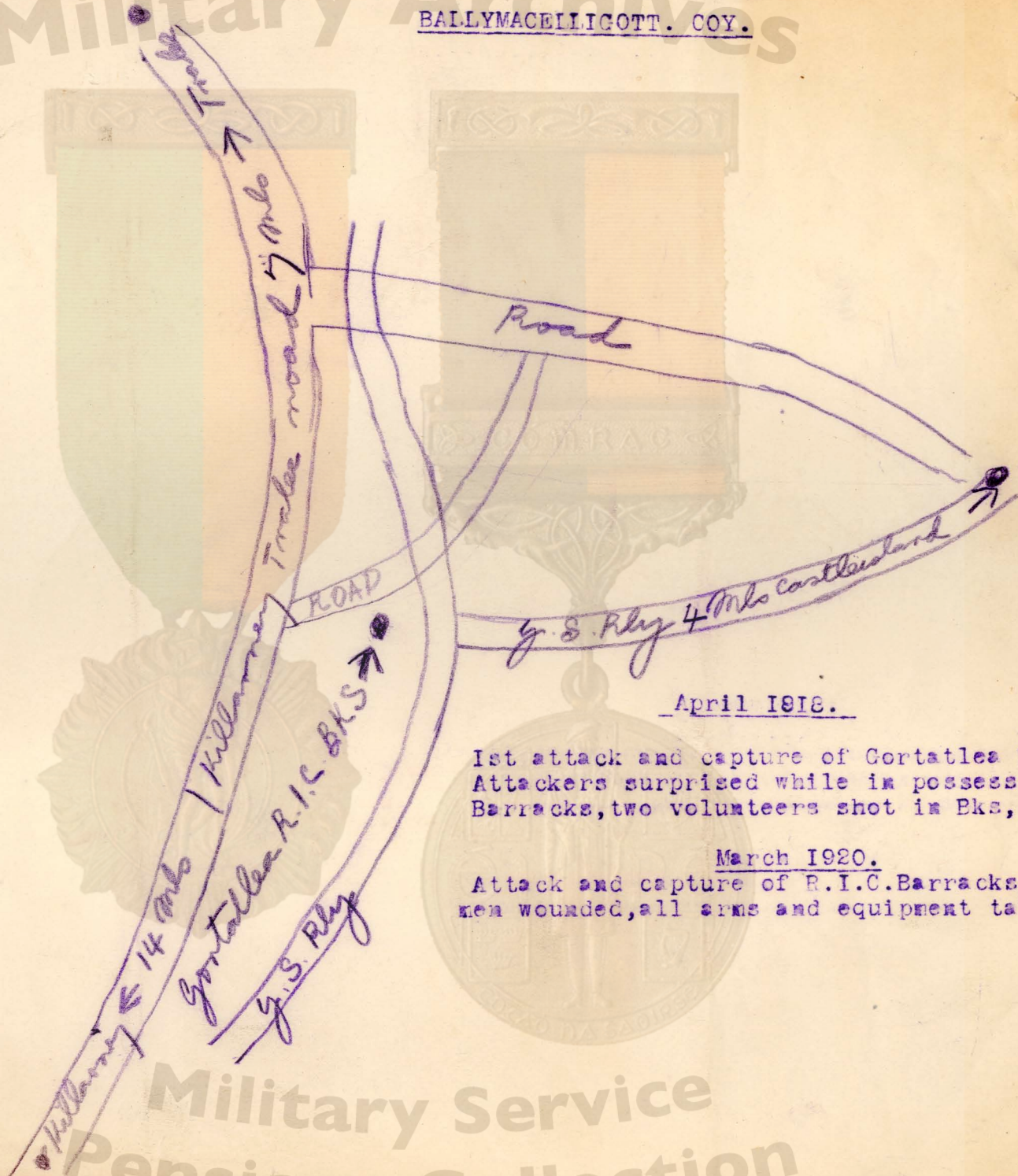


Gortatlea Barracks - 13/4/1918 and 5/3/1920.

March 1920.

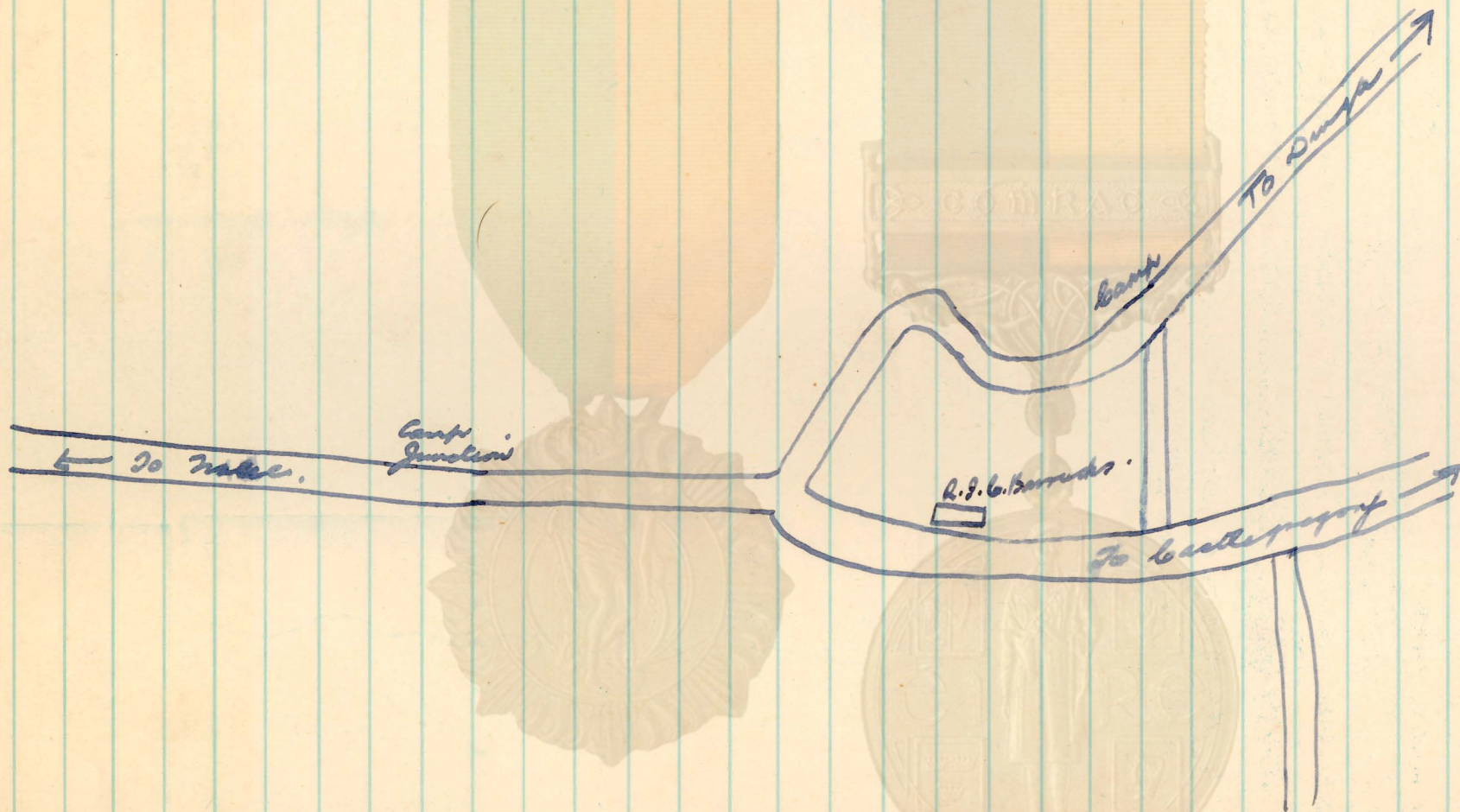
Attack and capture of R.I.C. Barracks, five R.I.C. men wounded, all arms and equipment taken.

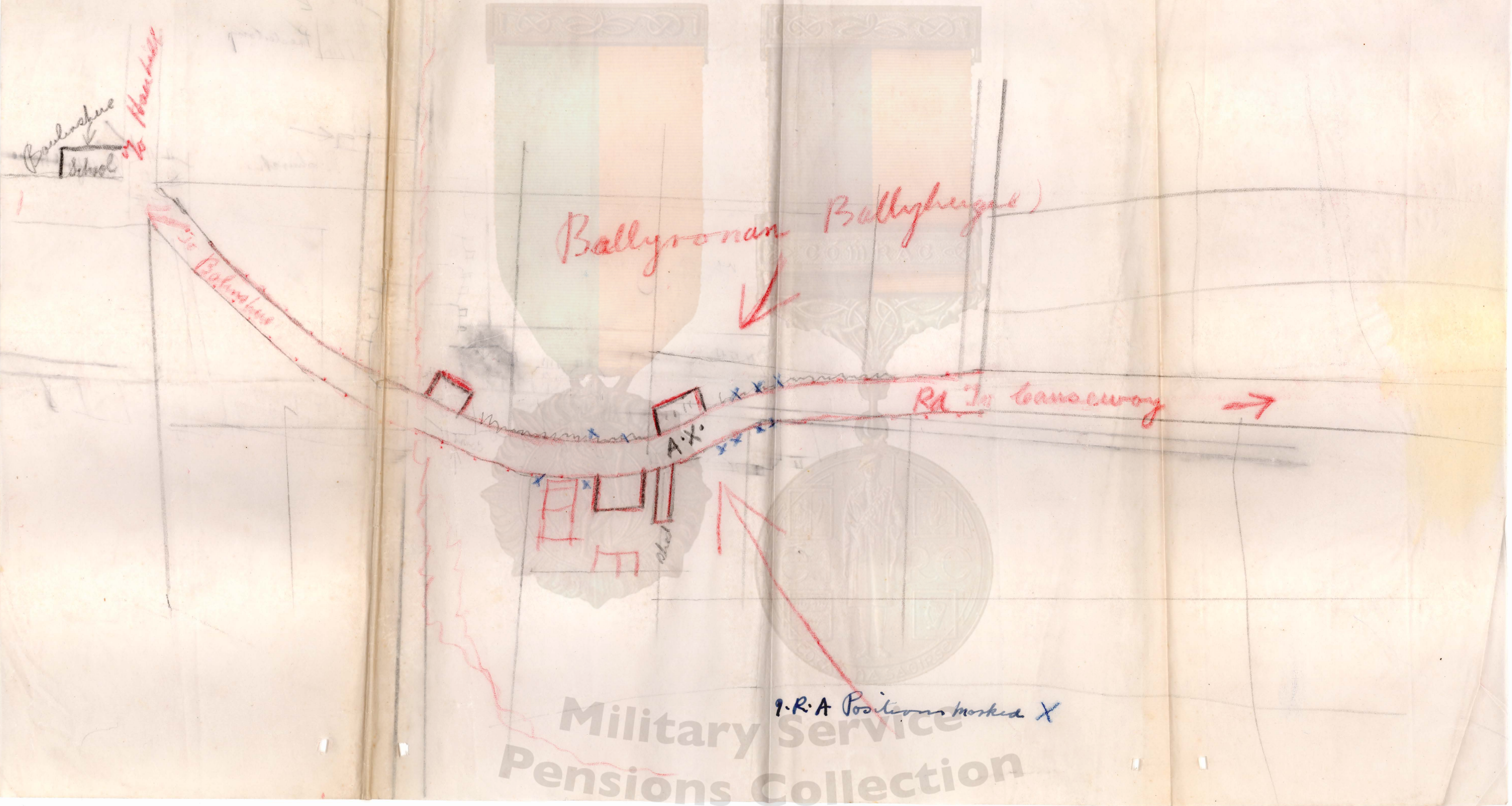

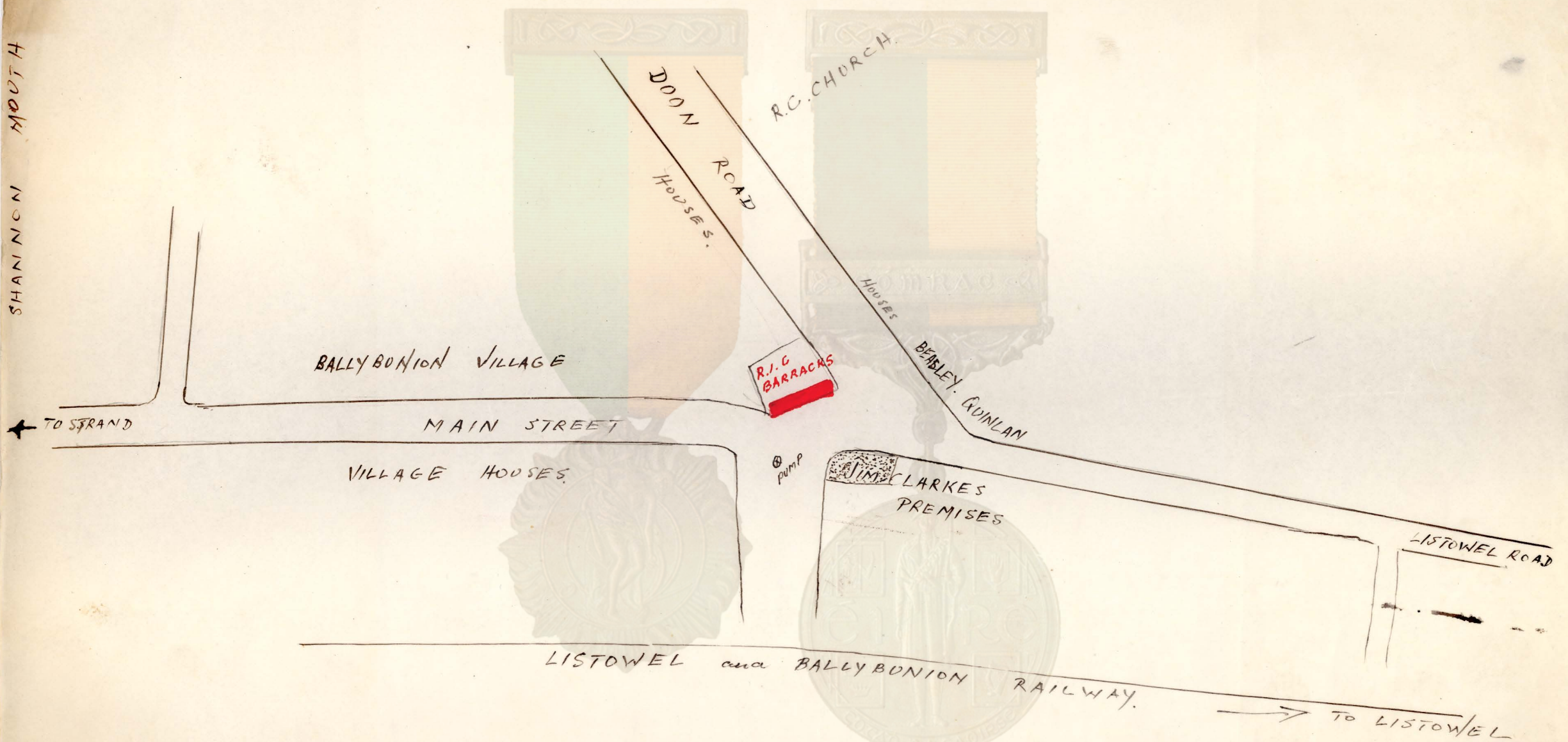

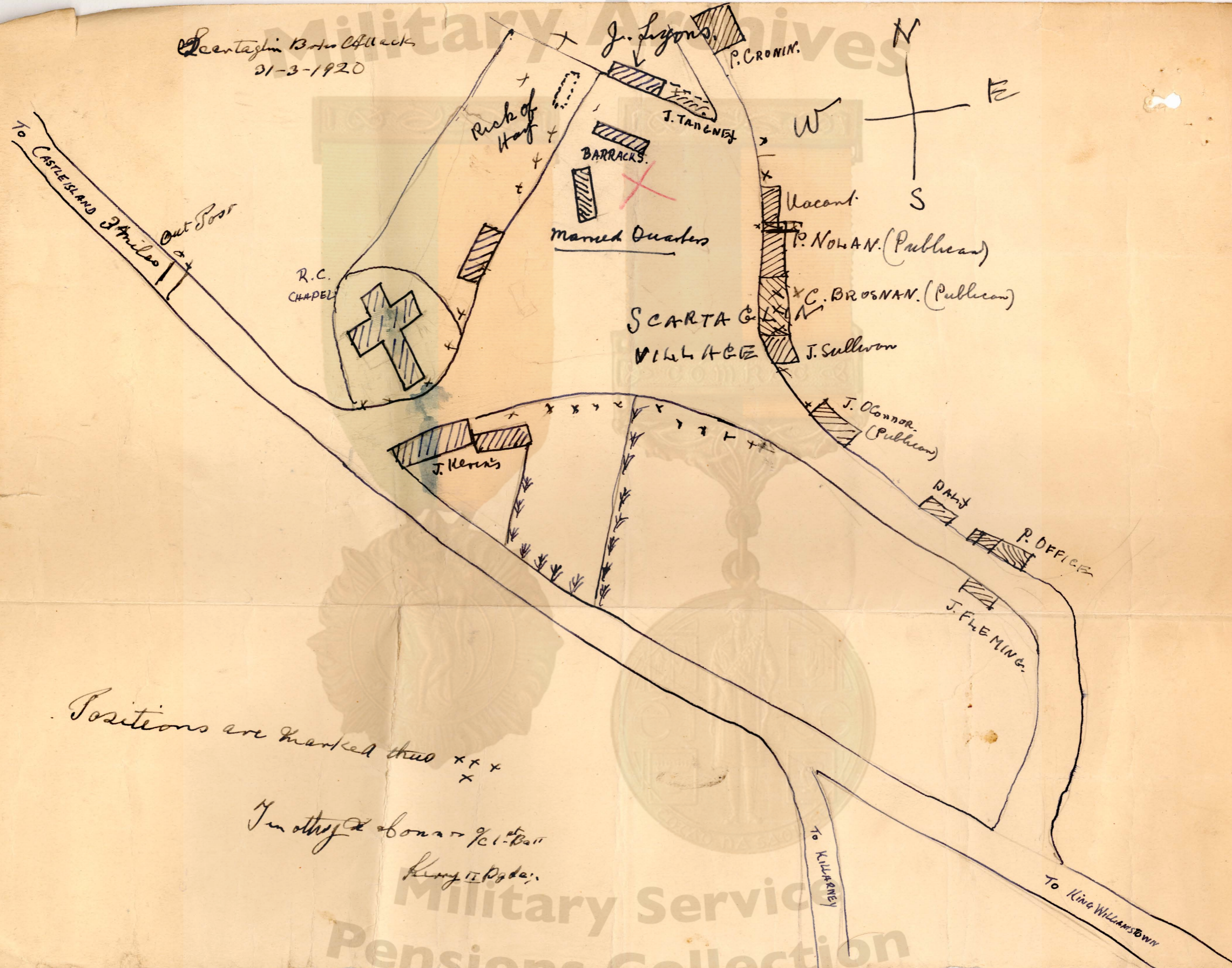
BALLYBUNION BARRACK ATTACK MARCH 1920.

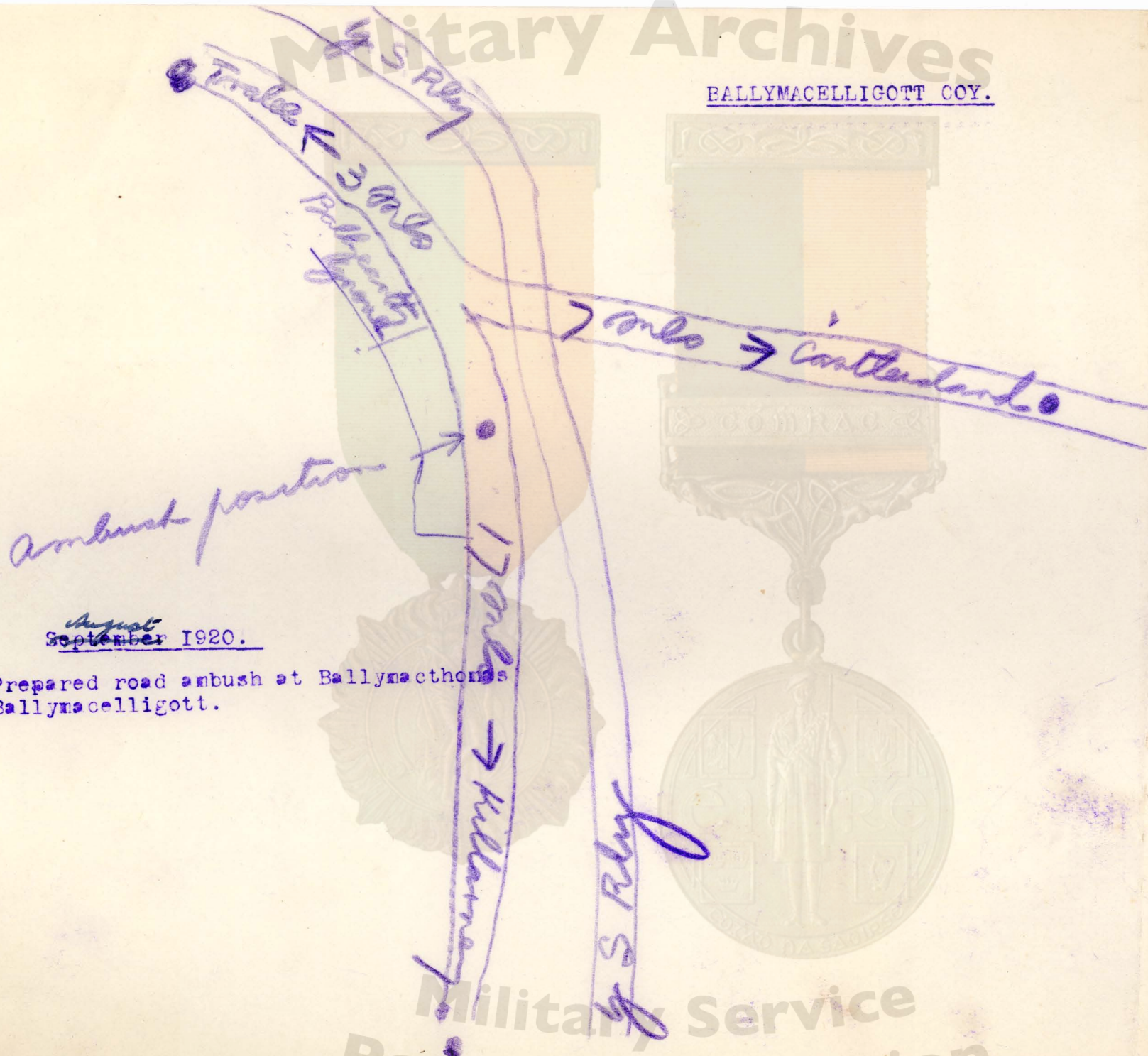

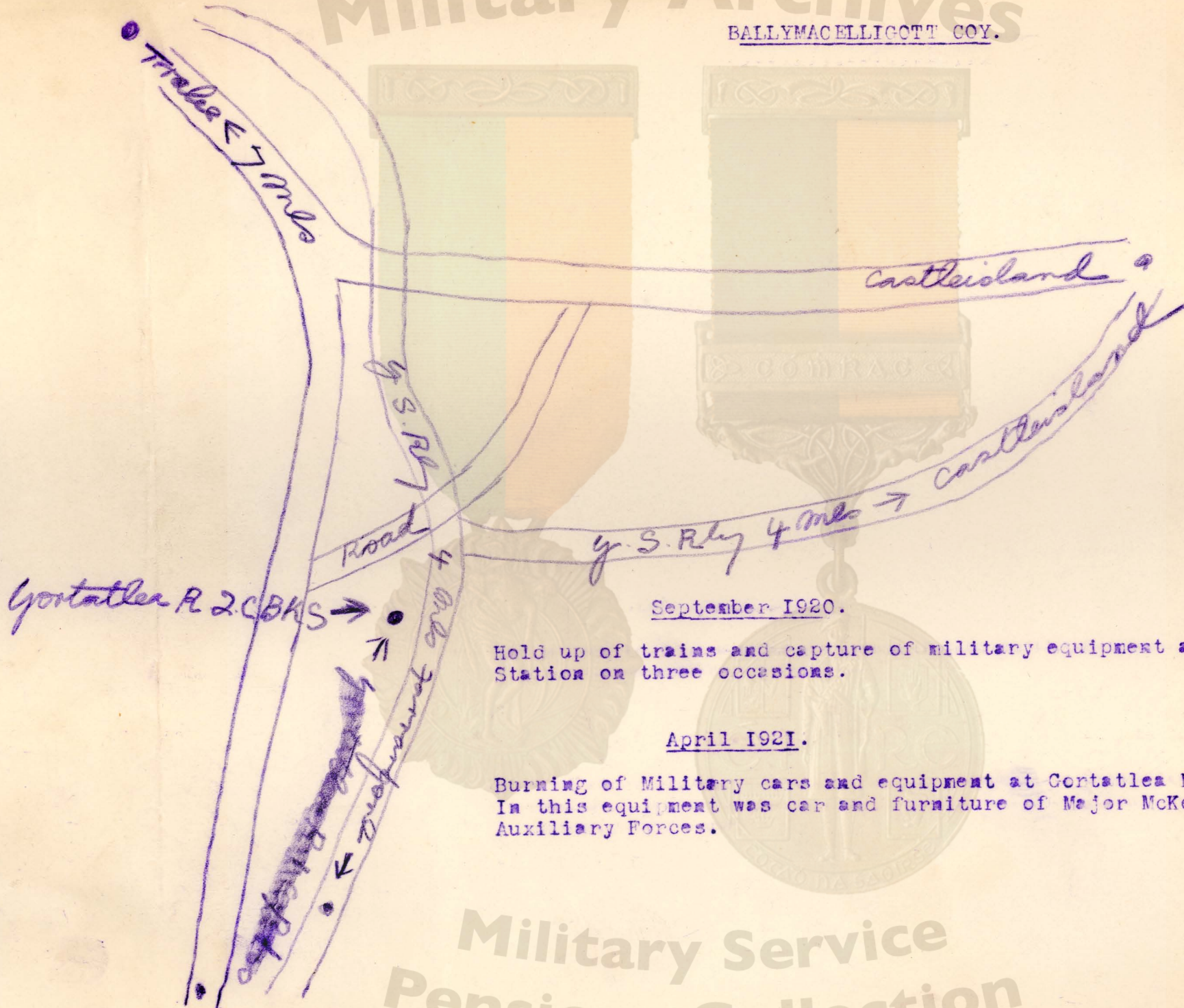
Prepared Road ambush at Ballycarthy three miles from Tralee, awaiting lorries of Black and Tans which did not show up.

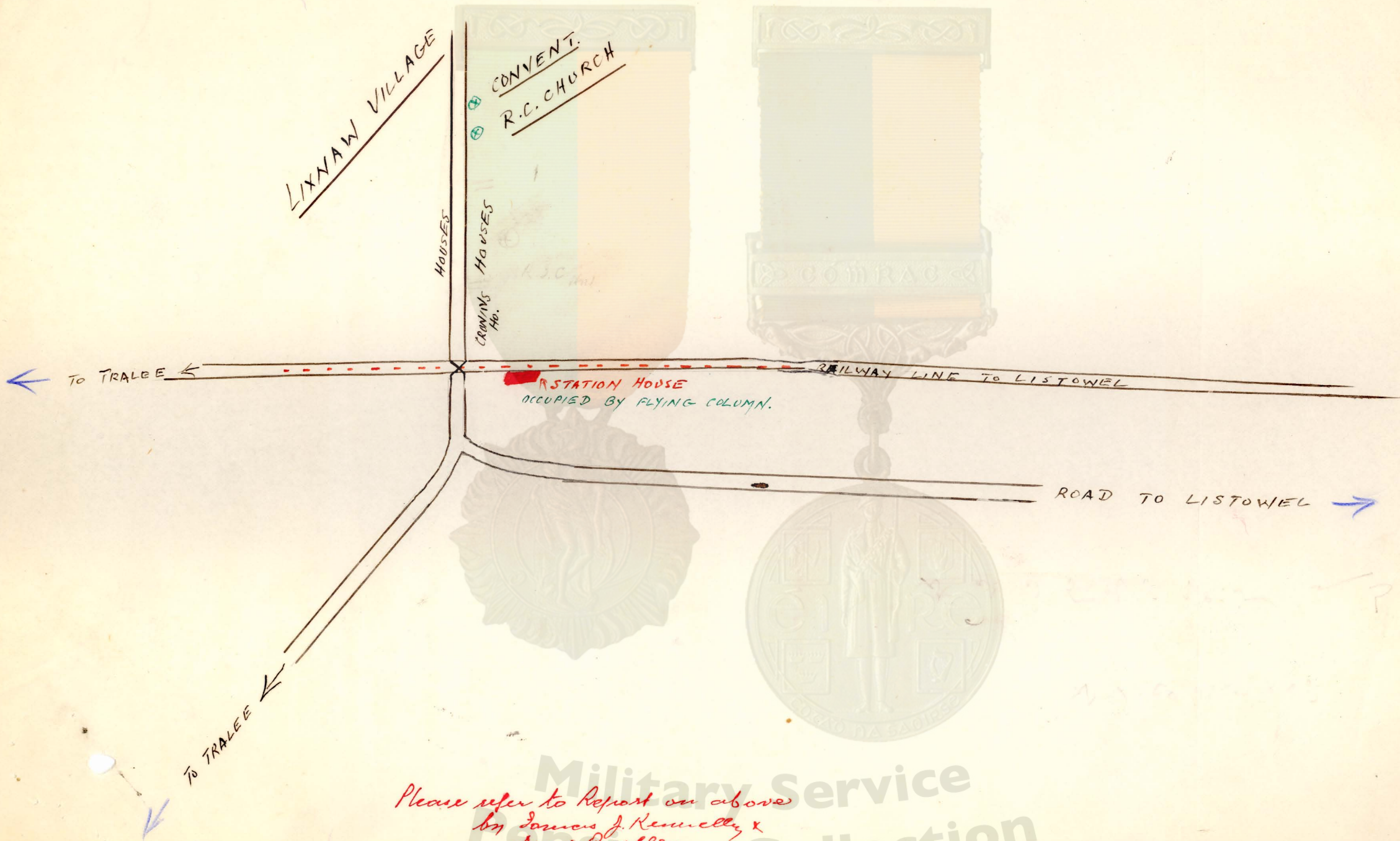
Hold up of trains and capture of military equipment at Gortatlea Station on three occasions.

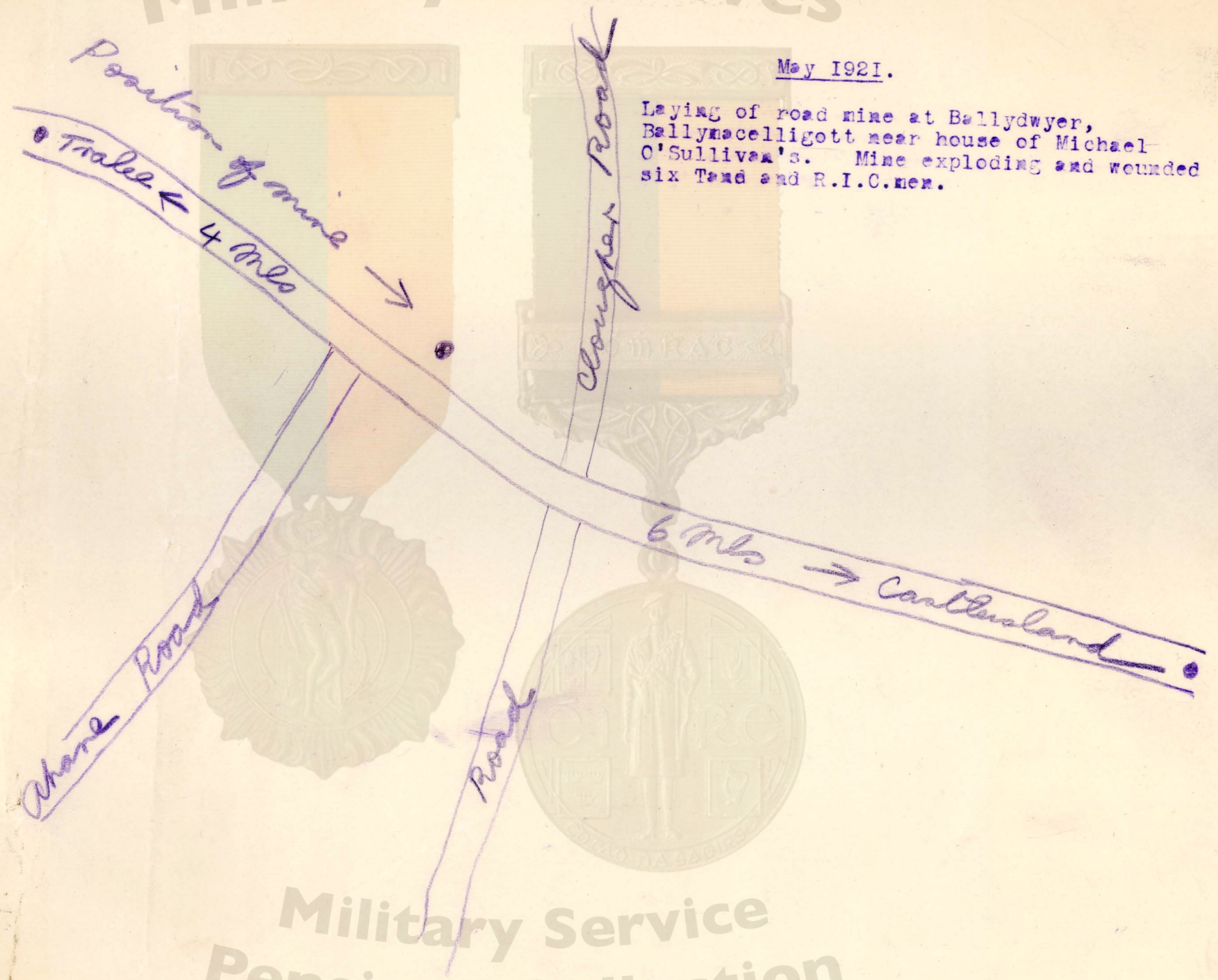

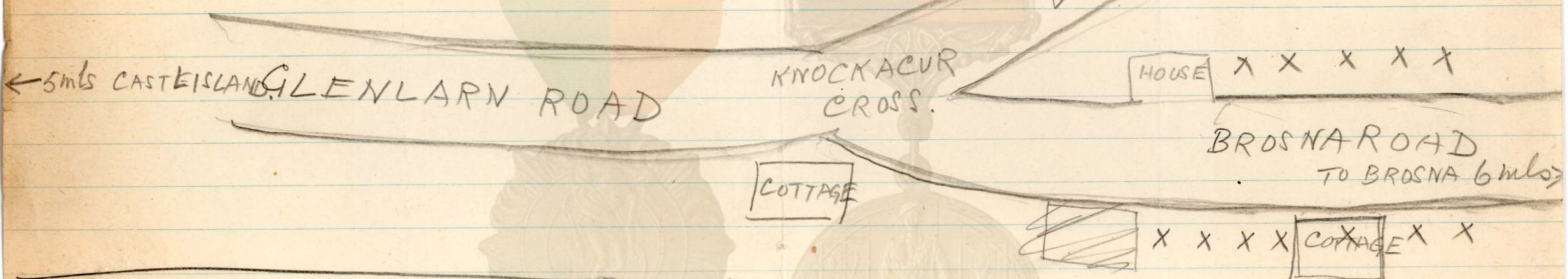
