

### Military Service Pensions Act, 1934.

#### APPLICATION TO THE MINISTER FOR DEFENCE FOR A SERVICE CERTIFICATE.

This form must be filled in by every person who seeks a Service Certificate, and must be signed by him, and signature witnessed, on or before the 31st day of December, 1935. In the event of an applicant being unable to write he should affix his mark, such act being witnessed.

Note.—Before answering the questions below, the applicant is requested to note that:

- (a) This form is divided into three parts. Part I. is to be completed where the applicant had, in addition to the required pre-Truce Service, Service in the Forces in the period commencing the 1st July, 1922. Part II. is to be completed where the applicant's qualifying service in the Forces was pre-Truce only. Only one of those two parts is to be completed by any one applicant. Part III. is of general application and should be completed by all applicants.
- (b) Before completing particulars as to rank the applicant should read carefully the First Schedule to the Act and also the definitions of the expressions "first critical date" and "second critical date" which are appended to this form for the information of applicants. He should then complete his replies to the questions in the terms of Rules 1 and 2 of the First Schedule which are applicable to his case, e.g.:—

was "a Divisional Adjutant" or

- was "a Battalion Quartermaster whose Battalion was (at the critical date) not less than one hundred in strength," or
- was "an officer of Fianna Eireann commanding one hundred members or more."

If applicant's case falls within either Rule 3 or Rule 4 of the First Schedule full particulars of the claim as required by those Rules should be given, if necessary, in a separate statement.

- (c) All statements made in this application will be carefully investigated, and satisfactory evidence must be forthcoming on request to substantiate each and every statement made.
- (d) "If any person with a view to obtaining either for himself or any other person a grant or payment of a pension under this Act, makes, signs, or uses any declaration, application or other written statement knowing the same to be false, such person shall be guilty of an offence under this section and shall be liable on summary conviction thereof to a fine not exceeding £25 (twenty-five pounds) or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or at the discretion of the Court to both such fine and imprisonment." (Sec. 19 (1) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

(e) "If any person so convicted as aforesaid is in receipt of a pension obtained by reason of such false declaration, application, or other written statement he shall forfeit such pension as from the date of such conviction." (Sec. 19 (2) of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934).

If the applicant is unable to read, the above note should be read to him by the witness.

- (b) Absence from duty following arrest, imprisonment, or penal servitude in respect of sedition, treason or treason felony prior to 11th July, 1921;
- (c) Absence from duty by reason of duties necessitating such absence undertaken at the instance of or on behalf of the Cabinet of the First Dail Eireann or of the Second Dail Eireann;
- (d) Absence from duty while under arrest, as a result of activities as a member of the Forces.

If you claim to have been absent from duty under these conditions, give particulars of the circumstances with respect to each such period of absence, and state its duration.

RULES FOR DETERMINING NOTIONAL GRADES OF RANK IN THE FORCES HELD BY PERSONS SERVING IN THE FORCES.

1.—(1) Any person who at any date was either Chief of Staff, Deputy Chief of Staff, Adjutant General, a Divisional Officer Commanding, or Quartermaster General shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank A.

- (2) Any person who at any date was either-
  - (a) a General Headquarters Officer acting as Director of any one of the following services, namely Organisation, Intelligence, Engineering and Munitions, or
  - (b) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank B.

- (3) Any person who at any date was either-
  - (a) a Brigade Officer Commanding whose brigade at that date was less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (b) a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, or
  - (c) a Divisional Adjutant, or
  - (d) a Divisional Quartermaster, or
  - (e) a Battalion Commandant whose battalion was at that date not less than three hundred in strength, or
  - (f) a Brigade Vice Officer Commanding whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (g) a Brigade Adjutant whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (h) a Brigade Quartermaster whose brigade was at that date not less than one thousand in strength, or
  - (i) a Column Commander whose column was at that date not less than thirty in strength, or
  - (j) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services, or
  - (k) a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of any Service, other than that of Medical Services, or one of the Services mentioned in sub-paragraph (a) of the immediately preceding paragraph,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank C.

#### '(4) A person who at any date—

- (a) was a Battalion Commandant whose battalion at that date was less than three hundred in strength, or
- (b) was a Company Captain whose company at that date was not less than sixty in strength, or
- (c) was, at that date, a Captain on the General Headquarters Staff or on a Divisional Staff, or
- (d) was, in the case of a company which at that date was not less than one hundred and twenty in strength, where the company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or, where the company had at that date two Lieutenants only, one or other of such Lieutenants, or, where the company had at that date three or more Lieutenants, one or other of the two Lieutenants who were at that date respectively second and third in command, or
- (e) was, in the case of a company which at that date was less than one hundred and twenty in strength but not less than one hundred in strength, where such company had at that date one Lieutenant only, such Lieutenant or where such company had at that date two or more Lieutenants, the Lieutenant who was at that date second in command, or
- (f) was a Brigade Officer, other than a Brigade Officer who is deemed by virtue of paragraph (2) or (3) of this Rule to have held at that date either Rank B or Rank C, or
- (g) was a Battalion Vice Officer Commanding whose battalion at that date was not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (h) was a Battalion Adjutant whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or
- (i) was a Battalion Quartermaster whose battalion was at that date not less than one hundred in strength, or

- (j) was a General Headquarters Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who was at that date acting as a Director of any Service, or
- (k) was a Divisional Officer other than a Divisional Officer Commanding, a Divisional Vice Officer Commanding, a Divisional Adjutant or a Divisional Quartermaster, or
- (1) was a Column Commander whose column at that date was less than thirty in strength, or
- (m) was a Medical Officer other than a General Headquarters Officer who at that date was acting as Director of Medical Services,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D.

- (5) Any person who complies with the following conditions, namely:-
  - (a) was at any date an officer, and
  - (b) is not deemed by virtue of any of the preceding paragraphs of this Rule to have held at that date any grade of rank,

shall be deemed for the purposes of this Act to have held at that date Rank E.

- (6) Any person who at any date held the rank of non-commissioned officer or private shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- (7) None of the foregoing provisions of this Rule shall apply to any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or of Cumann na mBan and was not at any date a member of Oglaigh na hEireann (Irish Republican Army) or of the Irish Volunteers, and in lieu thereof the following provisions shall have effect in relation to any such person, that is to say:—
  - (a) any person who at any date:-
    - (i) was a member of the headquarters staff or executive of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan, or
    - (ii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies, or
    - (iii) was an officer of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan senior to an officer of either of those bodies commanding one hundred members or more of either of those bodies,

shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank D, and

- (b) any person who at any date was a member of Fianna Eireann or Cumann na mBan and who is not deemed by virtue of the foregoing sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph to have held Rank D, shall be deemed to have held at that date Rank E.
- 2. Where an officer whose grade of rank at any date is, under Rule I of this Schedule, to be determined both by his actual rank in the Forces and the strength of the unit to which he belonged at that date, and such officer is, at that date, absent from duty by reason of imprisonment on account of his activities as a member of the Forces, the following provisions shall, for the purposes of the said Rule I, have effect in relation to such officer, that is to say:—
  - (a) such officer shall be deemed to have held at that date the actual rank in the Forces which he held at the date of his arrest, and
  - (b) such unit shall be deemed to be at that date at the same strength as it was at the time of his arrest.
- 3. Where the case of any person does not fall within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, the Referee may determine the particular grade of rank which such person is to be deemed to have held on any date, and in so determining the Referee shall have regard to the following matters, that is to say:—
  - (a) the appointment held by such person,
  - (b) the services performed by such person,
  - (c) the principles of grading set forth in the said Rule I.
- 4. Where any person, whose case at a particular date falls within the provisions of Rule I of this Schedule, was, at that date, engaged in service of a special character, the Referee may, in making his report under this Act in relation to the grade of rank held by such person on such date, report that the grade of rank held by him on such date is a grade of rank higher than the grade which, but for this Rule, would be the grade of rank held by him on that date.

DEFINITION OF THE FIRST AND SECOND CRITICAL DATES.

1. In the case of a person who served in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923,

The expression "the first critical date" means the 11th day of July, 1921; and the expression "the second critical date" means:—

(a) in the case of a person who served in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, the 1st day of July, 1922 and

(b) in the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces on the 1st day of July, 1922, but who served in the Forces at any time during the period commencing on the 2nd day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, the date during that period on which such person first served in the Forces.


2. In the case of a person who did not serve in the Forces during the period commencing on the 1st day of July, 1922, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1923, but who has either:—

(a) served in the Forces at any time during the week commencing on the 23rd day of April, 1916, or

(b) served in the Forces continuously during the period commencing on the 1st day of April, 1921, and ending on the 11th day of July, 1921,

the expression "the first critical date" shall be construed as meaning the date during the said week, or if he did not serve during the said week, during the said period, on which he first served in the Forces in such week or such period (as the case may be), and



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### SWORN STATEMENT MADE BEFORE ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY THOMAS JOS. HEVEY ON THE

#### 1. 12. 1936 - NO. 18717.

Q. Have you any references? A. Only some proof of my rank.

Q. Appointed Assistant Bde. Adjt., rank of Capt. on the 1st date?

A. I was Adjutant on the 2nd critical date.

Q. In your form you have for the 1st critical date:
Assist. Bde. Adjt., rank Capt. Why did you put in rank Capt .?

A. I think it ranked as Capt.

Q. On the 2nd critical date, Bde. Adjt. Rank, Commdt. You were appointed Assist. Adjt. Nov. 120?

A. Nov. '20, yes.

Q. Who appointedyou? A. The Bde. Council.

Q.In Oct. '21, during the Truce period, you were appointed Bde. Adjt.?

A. Yes.

Q. By the Bde. Council again?

A. That was an appointment ratified by G.H.Q. The Div. was formed at the time.

Q. How many men would you say were in the Bde. on the day of the Truce?

A. About 4 Battns., and we had an average of about 400.

Q. Would there be over a thousand men? A. There would be easily a thousand.

Q. When the civil war started on the 1st July, 1922, how many men were there?

A. There was well over a thousand at that period.

- Q. When did you join the I.R.A.? A. I was in the Fianna in '17, sometime about the middle of 1917, about June 1917.
- Q. Were you in school at that time? A.Yes.

Q. Where was this?

A. In Westport.

Q. When did you transfer to the Vols .?

A. Later that year.

Q. The end of 117?

A. Yes.

Q. Oct. 117 you went to the Vols.?

A. That would be about right.

3rd Period

Q. You were arrested and detained in March 1918. What was that in connection with?

A. In connection with some explosive stuff thrown at the soldiers who were carrying out martial law.

d. Had you anything to dowith it?

A. I was not actually in the throwing.

Q. How long were you detained?

A. A few days. I was arrested on a Sunday night and I was out on Tuesday morning.

4th Period

Q. Were you in the raid for petrol?

A. I was.

Q. When did that take place?

A. Some time in the spring of 1919.

Q. In the station of - A. Westport.

Q. Did you get any petrol?

A. We did.

Q. How much?

A. I heard we took away about 30 tins and there was some other stuff there too.

Q. Did the police come after you then?

A. They did.

Q. Your home was raided?
A. Yes, continually raided.

Q. Had you to go on the run? A. Yes, about that time.

Q. When you were on the run you were within Westport area? A. I was within my area.

Q. You were not working at this time? A. No I was not.

Q. Engaged in full-time organising work. You assisted in burning of Carrowkennedy police hut. Could you tell us when that was?

A. That was sometime in that period, after the petrol affair

? March 1919

Q. Was it evacuated?

A. It was evacuated.

5th Period

- Q. You were engaged in full time organising work? A. Yes. I was on the run at this time. I got several duties to do: to go round to the different companies. From that till the Truce I was not at home.
- Q. You had no rank at that time? A. I had no rank.

- Q. Who were you working with?

  A. I was working directly under Bde. Hqrs. and I took my instructions from them and then Moane, the Bde. det came along with me and the two of us divided the area into parts.
- Q. Will he be able to give you a certificate for that? A. I can get it from him.
  - Q. He was then the Bde. Adjt.? A. He was the Adjt. of the Bde.
  - Q. Single handed you captured the equipment of a British soldier, a sentry near Westport in Oct. 119? A. Yes.

Q. How did you manage that?

A. I just stuck him up from behind and that was all.

Q. What did you get off him?

A. I took off his belt and his rifle and 50 rds. of ammunition and a tin hat and his web equipment.

Q. You did it yourself? A. Yes.

Q. Had you a revolver?

A. I had a revolver.

Q. Outside the bks. or where?

A. Outside the bks.

6th Period

- Q. You were still organising; choosing members for A.S.U. When was that A.S.U. formed?
- A. It actually came into being in Nov. '20.

Q. Between April and Nov. what were you doing?

A. I was still doing the area with Moane. We were trying to form squads in the Bn. areas at the time and it was not very successful.

Q. You were on full time work?

A. Full time in that peri od.

Q. You helped to organise this A.S.U.?

A. Yes. That was the Bde. A.S.U. as distinct from the Bns. which were fairly hopeless.

Q. Did you join it yourself?

A. Yes, I became a member. At this time I was acting Q.M. for part of the period. Tom Ketterick was wounded at the time.

Q. Was it Bde. Q.M.?

A. Assisting Bde. Q.M. also at that period - sometime during that period.

Q. Tom Ketterick was wounded and you were acting? A. Yes.

Q. Who was O.C. of the column?
A. First of all Joe Ring was O.C. and it was not long until Kilroy took charge; he took charge almost immediately.

Q. Attacks on a few R.I.C. posts - Drummin, Newport and Castlebar. When were they? After the formation of the column?

A. Yes.

Q. Would it be long after the formation of the col.?

A. Sometime after Christmas. That would be in the beginning of '21.

Q. The first one you have here is Drummin. When would that be A. Early in '21.

Q. And Newport? A. Yes.

Q. And Castlebar. Were these small attacks that were not serious. Sniping? A. Yes.

Q. Were you in these attacks?

Q. Had you a rifle? A. I had a rifle.

Q. There was no damage done?

A. Not particularly.

Q. You had an abortive attack on Murisk, 17th Mch. 21?

A. St. Patrick's Day, 1921.

Q. What happened?

A. They appeared to get wind of it and turned back.

Q. Were you all in position? A. We were all in position.

Q. You had your rifle?

A. Yes.

Q. Carnaclay, Westport. Attack on R.I.C. lorries? A. They ran into us on the road.

Q. How many lorries?

A. A lorry and a Ford touring car. There was nobody killed on either side. There were some wounded on the other side as far as I remember.

Q. Who was in charge?

A. Ring.

Q. Is that xxx far outside Westport?

A. About 2 and a half miles.

Q. How long did that last? A. About 20 minutes. It w It was an impromptu affair.

Q. Were you near them?

A. We could almost touch each other.

Q. They just rushed through? A. No, they pulled up and they had a fight and bombed us.

Q. What was the end of it?

A. Eventually the drivers brought the lorries to a safe position and they got out and advanced towards us and we were left in possession and the lerries went on.

Q. How many men had you there that day?

A. About 15.

Q. Had you a rifle?

A. I had a rifle.

7th Period

Q. You were in the attack on Kilmeena. Was that the first in the 7th period. On the 19th May, 1921? A. Yes.

Q. How close were you there. Were you with the main body? A. I was on a flanking body.

Q. How far were you from the fight?

A. I was within rifle shot, a couple of hundred yds.

Q. Did you actually take part in the fight?

A. Actually, yes.

- Q. Qid the fighting last long?
- A. About 2 and a half hours or so from the time it started.
- Q. Was there any of the men in your particular party killed? A. One chap, Collins.
- Q. Kilroy was in charge?
- A. Yes.
- Q. You were at Skirdagh fight, Newport? A. Yes, that was a defensive engagement.
- Q. Was the Newport one long after that?
- A. It was very short
- Q. One was the 19th May and the other was the 23rd. You were in Carrowkennedy in June?
- A. Yes, That was the last one.
- Q. Had you to do much fighting at Skirdagh?
- A. I was fortunate. I was one of those that happened to get cutside the cordon early in the morning. Eight or nine were trapped on the hill and we attacked the military and police from the rear till military reinforcements came along.
- Q. Carrowkennedy. Was that a more successful fight? A. It was completely successful.
- Q. Were you close up?
- A. My position was something like 150 yds. or probably less from the road.
- Q. After that the column went in and took over Westport? A. That is right.
- Q. You had no more fighting?
- A. No more fighting.

#### 8th Period

- Q.When the Truce came along did you go into any camp? A. Yes. I was in camp cutside Ballycroy.
- Q. How long did you spend there?
- A. Three weeks.
- Q. Any other camp?
- A. I came back to Bks. We had the workhouse as a Bde. Hqrs. at this time.
- Q. That was before you took over the bks .?
- A. Yes.
- Q. You went in there full time?
- A. Yes.
- Q. You were appointed Bde. Adjt.
- A. In Oct. when the Division was formed and in the re-shuffle I was appointed Bde. Adjt.
- Q. Whonwas the O.C.?
  - . Kilroy was O.C. Bde. and he was appointed O.C. Division and Moane was appointed O.C. Bde.
- Q. Did you stay in Westport Workhouse all the time up to the
- A. I took over Castlebar Bks.

Q. When was that? A. Sometime after the Treaty was signed, early in 122.

Q. Did you move your Hqrs.? A. We moved our Hqrs. to Castlebar. Div. Hqrs. moved shortly afterwards.

Q. You were full time during the Truce? A. Full time.

Q. You did not go home at all?

A. Scarcely.

Q. You did not stay at home?

A. No, although I was within half a mile from home. I was not very friendly with them.

9th Period

- Q. When the fighting broke out you were in Castlebar? A. Yes.
- Q. Did you burn it? A. Yes. I came into town the night it was burned. I had been out supervising the deskruskinfanfantakinax destruction of bridges and when I came back I found the town evacuated. I had an encounter with the Free State troops that night on my own and got away and linked up with Kilroy.
- Q, What kind was the encounter? A. I had a motorbicycle and when I went into the town I was told the Free State troops were in the far end of the town I dumped the bicycle and was trying to get away when three or four shots were fired and they shouted at me to halt but I got into a laneway and got across the river. There were shots exchanged. That would not be the night the bks. were burned. It was the following night.
- Q. You joined Kilroy? A. I tried to get in touch with my own unit and could not. I got in touch with Kilroy's column.
- Q. What fights were you in then? A. Before Castlebar was occupied by Free State troops I was in Sligo part of the time.
- Q. During the Truce?
- Q. Immediately after the Truce? A. There was a period of about a month or six weeks between the attack on the Four Courts and the arrival of the Free State troops and during that period I was in Collooney. I was in charge of theparty.
- Q. Had you any fighting up there? A. We had several skirmishes.
- Q. Where? A. Collooney, Tubbercurry and Adare.
- Q. How many men did you bring up with you? A. Three lorry loads, about 45 or 50 men.
- Q. You were in charge? A. Yes.

Q. You returned after that to Castlebar?

A. After that I returned and took up a post on the borders of our Division. I formed a post there at a place called Loughtalt. It is up in the mountains but I don't know the name of the village.

Q. Did you relieve the men at Collooney?

A. No. They had surrendered.

Q. Did you come back?

A. I was called back. I was there for ten daysor so.

Q. Had you any fight at Brize?

A. I was in Brize, yes.

Q. Was there a fight there?
A. There was. I had escaped from Athlone at this time.

Q. Castlebar was burned and you came back and you had this encounter with the Free State?

A. The Loughtalt thing is before that.

Q. You were in Castlebar bks.; in Collooney, Sligo, in charge of relief party, several skirmishes and then formed a post at Loughtalt; there ten days, and then recalled to Castlebar?

A. That is right and there for a short period.

Q. And you had the encounter with the Free State on your own A. Yes.

Q. Were you captured?

A. A few days after that.

Q. When? Early in Aug.?

A. Early in Aug., probably.

Q. You have it here end of July?

A. It was a few days one way or the other.

Q. How were you captured?

A. The column was just going into Glenhest and to get into it we had to pass a public house and Kilroy told not to say anything or make any noise on my way down. I walked into a party of soldiers lying in the ditches.

Q. Hughes was not with you?

A. He was. I was in charge of them. There were four of us.

Q. What is it kix called?

A. Glenhest; it is near Newport.

Q. You escaped?

A. I escaped the day Collins was killed.

Q. About the 18th or 22nd August. Where did you escape from A. From Athlone. Nine of usgot away together.

Q. You were re-captured immediately afterwards?

A. A short time; a matter of a few days. Malone was wounded

Q. It was at Brize you were captured?

A. Yes.

Q. Where is that?

A. Between Baal and Claremorris. Balla

Q. That was the end of you?

A. No. I escaped from Tintown afterwards.

Q. Where were you detained after your capture at Brize? A. Claremorris, Athlone, Mountjoy and Tintown.

Q. You escaped from Tintown?
A. Shortly after the "cease fire".

Q. Was it after the "cease fire"? A. I am positive it was after.

Q. The "cease fire" was the 23rd April?

A. I am wrong. I was out a few max weeks before that.
I headed for the Wicklow mountains and got in touch with Plunkett's column.

Q. You joined up with them?

Q. You had some sniping at Blessington, Tallaght, Nass and Glendalough?

A. Yes. When we sniped Glendalough the post had been withdrawn but we did not know it.

Q. You were re-captured? . I was captured on my way to Dublin. I was trying to get in touch with Ruttledge.

Q. Under arms? A. Under arms.

Q. You were in Mountjoy and Kilmainham? A. I was released from Kilmainham.

Q. When were you released? A. Round about Christmas of that year. (1923)

Q. Anything else of importance?
A. Not that I know of, except this certificate from Moane. I will get that.

I am directed by the Referee to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated 2nd instant regarding the amount of pension payable under the above Act where the applicant is awarded a different notional grade of rank on each of the two critical dates, and to refer you to section 3, paragraph (g) Second Schedule of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, which states that -

"the amount of a pension payable to a person in respect of whom a service certificate has been issued shall be in case such person served in the Forces on both the first critical date and the second critical date and held different grades of rank on the said dates, an amount calculated at the rate per annum. which is the rate per annum appropriate to the higher of such grades of rank, in respect of each year or part of a year of his pensionable service."

The appropriate rate of pension per annum where different grades of rank were held on the two critical dates is, therefore, calculated at the rate appropriate to the higher grade in respect of every year or part of a year of pensionable service allowed.


