With reference to your minute (34/SP/2469) of the 11th instant, relating to Mr. Gerald Hughes, an applicant for a service certificate under the terms of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, I am directed by the Minister for Justice to inform you that this man was dismissed from the Criminal Investigation Department on the 4th August, 1922. As far as can be ascertained his dismissal was due to the fact that he was suspected of having given his military pass to his brother, a prisoner, who escaped from the Wellington Barracks at the time by means of a military pass.

I am directed by the Minister for Defence to refer to your communication of the 19th instant in connection with the application of Mr. Gerald N. Hughes, 28, Cabra Park, Dublin, under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1934, and to forward herewith for your information copies of previous correspondence (file No.A/13907) on the question of the eligibility of ex-members of the former C.I.D. who subsequently served in the Detective Branch of the Garda Síochána to apply under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924.

It is also stated in papers under reference A/¹³⁹⁰⁷~~12198~~ that the C.I.D. was one of the "auxiliary" services which would appear to come within the expression "National Forces" as defined by Section 1 of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924. The C.I.D. was under the control of the Minister for Defence until the 22nd August, 1922, on which date it was taken over by the Department of Justice, which Department now holds all the records in respect of that Force. In connection with the application of Gerald W. J. Hughes, 28, Cabra Park, Dublin, under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, the Secretary, Office of the Referee, asks whether there is any record of the applicant having served as Military Intelligence Officer under the Criminal Investigation Department, Ariel House, Dublin, subsequent to 1st July, 1922, and, if so, whether such service under the 1924 Act.

It is stated in papers A/12198 that the B. G. D. was one of the "auxiliary" services which would appear to come within the expression "National Forces" as defined by Section I of the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924. The B. G. D. was under the control of the Minister for Defence until the 22nd August, 1922, on which date it was taken over by the Department of Justice, which Department now holds all the records in respect of that Force. The Department of Justice has been supplying the Board of Assessors with confirmatory evidence of dates of service in respect of B. G. D. men seeking Certificates of Military Service.

Certain ex-members of the former B. G. D., now serving in the Detective Division of the Garda Síochána were applicants under the Military Service Pensions Act, 1924, and the Minister for Justice was informed that provided the persons in question

- (1) rendered active service in Ogbalgh na h-Eireann, or the Irish Volunteers, or the Irish Citizen Army, or Fianna Éireann, or the Hibernian Rifles, during the week commencing the 23rd April, 1916; or throughout the period from the 1st April, 1920, to 31st March, 1921; or throughout the period from the 1st April 1921, to the 11th July, 1921, and, in addition,

- (2) served in any armed force maintained by the Provisional Government or the Government of Éireann at any time subsequent to the 1st day of July, 1922, and prior to the 1st day of October, 1923,

these cases, *prima facie*, fall within the scope of the Act.

It is assumed that the Criminal Investigation Department was throughout its existence an armed force. Service therein after the 1st. July, 1922, and up to the 30th. September, 1923, which is the latest date of any pensionable service under the Act, would, if the assumption is correct, automatically count towards pension in cases which are valid in respect of service mentioned at (1) above. The reckoning of service prior to the former date will depend on its nature. Accordingly applications for certificates of military service properly made by members of the S. P. S. have been referred to the Board of Assessors established under the Act to examine all applications referred to them by the Minister.

It is proposed to ask the Officers in charge of Records to furnish information as regards the period from the 1st. July, 1922 to the 21st. August, 1922, and to ask the Secretary, Department of Justice to furnish particulars from 22nd August, 1922 onwards.



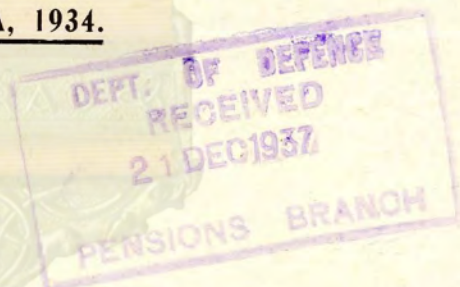
